As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements section:

- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1. Description of the Plan

General

The following description of the A. J. Letizio Sales & Marketing, Inc. 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by A. J. Letizio Sales & Marketing, Inc. (the Company) for the benefit of its employees who have at least two months of service and are age 18 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as amended. The Plan was originated as of January 1995 and has been most recently amended as of June 2023.

Contributions

Employees may contribute through payroll deductions up to 90% of their annual compensation but not more than the government-imposed limit established each year in pre-tax or Roth contributions. Participants who are age 50 or older before the close of the plan year may also elect to make catch-up contributions, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations, and may contribute through payroll deductions up to 100% of their annual compensation. Participants may also roll over amounts representing distributions from other qualified benefit plans into the Plan. The Company's matching contribution is 25% of the employee salary deferral, up to 90% of eligible compensation. Additional nonelective discretionary contribution amounts may be contributed annually at the option of the Company, subject to certain limitations.

Participant Investment Account Options

Each participant has the option of directing their contributions into any of the various investment options offered by the Plan and may change the allocation daily.

The Plan Document also includes an automatic deferral feature whereby a participant is treated as electing to defer a certain percentage of eligible compensation unless the participant made an affirmative election otherwise.

Payment of Benefits

In the event of retirement (as defined), death, permanent disability, termination of employment, or financial hardship (as defined), the balances in the participants' accounts may be distributed to the participants or the participants' beneficiaries in a lump sum or through payments in such other forms as may be available under the Plan. The amount of the participants' hardship distribution may not be in excess of the amount of the participants' financial hardship, as specified in the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their account is based upon continuous years of service. A participant is fully vested after five years of continuous service according to the following schedule:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Employees may request loans which are repaid through payroll deductions. The maximum loan amount is the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the 12-month period prior to the date of the participant's request or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account, bear reasonable interest, and are to be repaid over a period not to exceed 5 years, except as related to the purchase of a primary personal residence in which case the loan repayment may not exceed 20 years from the date of the loan. Loans are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. As of December 31, 2024, the interest rates on the outstanding notes receivable from participants ranged from 4.25% to 10.25%. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, allocation of associated employer's contributions, plan earnings/losses, and charged with withdrawals and allocations of administrative fees. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Plan investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance companies. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants, advisory fees, and record-keeping fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Note 3. Certification of Plan Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity), a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value, and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024
- Investment income and interest income from notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024
- Investment information and noted receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Note 4. Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets and Liabilities

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities

Level 2 Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities

Level 3 Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024:

- Shares of mutual funds are valued using quoted market prices in an active market.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, A. J. Letizio Sales & Marketing, Inc. has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

Note 6. Income Tax Status

The Plan operates under a nonstandardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype retirement plan and trust document sponsored by Fidelity. This prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency and the sponsor has obtained an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service stating that the prototype constitutes a qualified plan under Section 401 of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

Certain plan investments are shares of mutual funds which are managed or issued by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity). Additionally, administrative expenses are paid by the Plan to Fidelity and Strategic Advisors, Inc. Fidelity is the trustee and Strategic Advisors, Inc. is an investment advisor, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees of \$7,824 paid by the Plan for investment management services and fees of \$31,367 for record-keeping services to Fidelity are included as administrative fees on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan allows participants to receive loans under Section 72(p) of the IRC. Participant loans are considered to be permitted party-in-interest transactions.

The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.
