A. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the MortgageRight 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”), as amended and restated effective July, 6, 2021, provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

1. General – The Plan Sponsor, TJC Mortgage, Inc. (the “Company” or “Plan Administrator”), established the Plan effective as of January 1, 2018. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees who have attained one year of service and are 21 years of age or older. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Trustee is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Trustee also determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance.
2. Contributions – Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax and after-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers a stable value common trust fund investment option and various mutual funds held in registered investment companies. The Company utilizes the “safe harbor” matching contribution method in order to satisfy certain non-discrimination tests required by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”). The “safe harbor” matching contribution amount is an amount equal to 100 percent of each eligible participant’s elective deferral which does not exceed 3 percent of compensation, plus 50 percent of each eligible participant’s elective deferral which exceeds 3 percent of compensation but does not exceed 5 percent of compensation. During Plan year 2024, the Company made “safe harbor” matching contributions and other corrective contributions totaling \$325,768. Contributions are subject to certain statutory limitations.
3. Participants’ Accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and allocations of (a) the Company’s matching contribution and (b) Plan earnings or losses and charged with an allocation of any administration expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.
4. Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, any “safe harbor” matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in employer profit sharing contributions is based on years of vesting service, as defined by the Plan.

5. Notes receivable from participants – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account. Interest rates are 1% over the prime interest rate as determined by the Plan Administrator. This interest rate shall remain fixed throughout the duration of the loans. Principal and interest must be paid within five years through payroll deductions, unless the loan is for the purchase of a personal residence.
6. Investment Options – Participants direct contributions, including employer cash matching and non-matching contributions, into any of the investment options offered by T. Rowe Price, the Plan’s custodian. Participants may change their investment options at any time.
7. Payment of Benefits – The following are the Plan provisions with respect to the payment of benefits:
  - Upon termination of service before death, disability or retirement, the participant may elect to have his/her balance distributed as soon as administratively feasible following termination. However, if the value of the participant’s vested account balance does not exceed \$5,000, then a distribution will be made regardless of consent and will be paid in a lump-sum payment. If the value of the participant’s vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant must consent to a distribution before it is made. The participant may elect to receive his/her distribution in a single lump-sum payment or installments, but only with respect to minimum required distributions over a period of not more than the participant’s life expectancy.
  - Upon termination of employment at normal retirement age, the participant will become 100% vested in all of his/her accounts under the Plan and the distribution will be made, at the participant’s election, as soon as administratively feasible. If the participant remains employed past the normal retirement age, he/she may defer the receipt of benefits until he/she terminates employment but not later than 73 years of age. However, if the value of the participant’s vested account balance does not exceed \$5,000, then a distribution will be made regardless of consent and will be paid in a lump-sum payment. If the value of the participant’s vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant must consent to a distribution before it is made. The participant may elect to receive his/her distribution in a single lump-sum payment or installments, but only with respect to minimum required distributions over a period of not more than the participant’s life expectancy.
  - Upon termination due to disability, the participant will become 100% vested in all of his/her accounts. Payments will be paid as if the participant had retired. If the value of the participant’s vested account balance does not exceed \$5,000, then a distribution will be made regardless of consent and will be paid in a lump-sum payment. If the value of the participant’s vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant must consent to a distribution before it is made. The participant may elect to receive his/her distribution in a single lump-sum payment or installments, but only with respect to minimum required distributions over a period of not more than the participant’s life expectancy.

7. Payment of Benefits (continued) –

- Upon death of a participant prior to the participant's retirement or other termination of employment, the participant's account shall become 100% vested in all of his/her accounts. Distributions after the death of a participant will be paid to the participant's spouse or beneficiary. If the value of the participant's vested account balance does not exceed \$5,000, then a distribution will be made regardless of consent and will be paid in a lump-sum payment. If the vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant's beneficiary may elect to receive his/her distribution in a single lump-sum payment or installments, but only with respect to minimum required distributions over a period of not more than the participant's life expectancy.

8. Forfeited accounts – At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited accounts totaled \$3 and \$3 respectively. These accounts may be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative fees. No forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions in 2024.

9. Plan Amendments and Other Material Changes –

- Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to change the eligibility requirements from hours of service method to elapsed time method.

B. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Management estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Loan initiation fees are deducted from the participant's account at the time of distribution. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant's loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Investment valuation and income recognition:

All Plan investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were held by T. Rowe Price, the Plan custodian. Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Trustee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodian. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

The Plan offers a choice of various mutual funds including (i) money market and bond funds which invest primarily in securities issued or guaranteed by the United States Treasury and certain United States Government agencies and municipalities that provide income that is generally not subject to state income tax, (ii) fixed-income funds which invest in a diversified group of high-quality, fixed income investments, and (iii) equity funds which invest in common stocks and consist of several individual investment options for various levels of risk tolerance. Investments in stable value accounts are recorded at the fair value of the underlying investments. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of payment of benefits are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

D. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of fair value hierarchy under Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include (i) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (ii) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (iii) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; (iv) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable input and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There are no Plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or Level 3 inputs for the periods presented and there have been no changes in the methodologies used to measure fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended funds that are registered with the Securities Exchange Commission. The funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at the price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded (Level 1).

The stable value common trust fund, a common collective trust which holds indirect investments in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, is measured at net asset value (“NAV”) per unit, as determined by the Trustee at year-end. The NAV is used as the practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The Plan’s investment in the stable value fund is not required to be classified within the fair value hierarchy since it is measured at NAV.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date

The common collective trust is a stable value investment trust fund managed by T. Rowe Price (the “Stable Value Fund”) which primarily invests in synthetic investment contracts issued by insurance companies, banks, and other financial institutions and other short-term investments. The objectives of the Stable Value Fund are to maximize current income consistent with the maintenance of principal and to provide benefit-responsive participant withdrawals at contract value. Participants may redeem trust units on a daily basis for withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value without restriction.

Events outside the normal operation of the Stable Value Fund that cause a withdrawal from an investment contract may result in a negative market value adjustment, which can limit the ability to transact at contract value with the issuers of its investment contracts. Examples of such events include, but are not limited to, partial or complete legal termination of the Stable Value Fund or a unit holder, tax disqualification of the Stable Value Fund or a unit holder, and certain Stable Value Fund amendments if issuers’ consents are not obtained. According to the Stable Value Fund’s annual report, as of December 31, 2024, the occurrence of such an event is not considered to be probable.

E. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Company officers are eligible participants who have made elective deferrals to the Plan, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by T. Rowe Price and Reliance Trust Company. T. Rowe Price is the custodian and Reliance Trust Company is the trustee, as defined by the Plan, and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan made direct payments to the third party administrator and solicitor of \$33,914. The Plan sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan’s operations. These transactions are exempt from the prohibited rules under ERISA.

F. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the 401(k) Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts and Plan assets would be distributed to participants and their beneficiaries in accordance with the provisions of the Plan and subject to ERISA guidelines.

G. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing 401(k) plan. The non-standard pre-approved profit sharing plan received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS on June 30, 2020 which stated that the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has been amended since the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan received the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax position taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the IRS may nonetheless audit the Plan to ensure it has been operated in accordance with the Plan document and applicable laws. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

H. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near future and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

I. CONCENTRATION OF INDIVIDUAL INVESTMENTS

The fair values of the Plan's investments in T. Rowe Price Retirement Blend 2045, T. Rowe Price Retirement Blend 2040, and Vanguard 500 Index Admiral totaled \$5,179,398 as of December 31, 2024. These investments approximated 48% of the total Plan's investments as of December 31, 2024.

The fair values of the Plan's investments in T. Rowe Price Retirement 2045 Fund, T. Rowe Price Retirement 2040 Fund, and Vanguard 500 Index Admiral totaled \$4,213,391 as of December 31, 2023. These investments approximated 48% of the total Plan's investments as of December 31, 2023.

J. RECLASSIFICATIONS

Certain reclassifications have been made to conform prior year information to the current year presentation.

K. DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

For the year ending December 31, 2024, late remittances of participant contributions totaling \$171,815 are pending correction outside the Voluntary Fiduciary Corrections Program. In 2024, the Company remitted to the Plan \$171,815 of delinquent participant contributions. In 2025, the Company intends to reimburse the Plan for lost earnings and related excise taxes will be paid by the Company.

During 2024, late remittances totaling \$78,706 for the year ended December 31, 2023 were fully corrected outside the Voluntary Fiduciary Corrections Program.
