### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits***

We were engaged to perform audits of the financial statements of Human Rights Watch Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency (qualified institution), provided that the investment information is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### ***Disclaimer of Opinion***

We do not express an opinion on the accompanying financial statements of the Plan. Because of the significance of the matter described in the *Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion* section of our report, we have not been able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on the financial statements.



### ***Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion***

Prior to January 1, 2009, records were maintained at a contract, not a plan level; therefore, management has not maintained, and Principal Trust Company and Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association (TIAA) and College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF) (formerly, Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association - College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA-CREF)) did not provide, sufficient accounting records and supporting documentation relating to certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees, and supporting documentation is not adequate to assure the completeness and accuracy of the amounts included in the financial statements. Accordingly, we were unable to apply auditing procedures sufficient to determine the extent to which the financial statements have been affected by these conditions.

### ***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP), and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments. Management is also responsible for administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### ***Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements***

Our responsibility is to conduct an audit of the Plan's financial statements in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS) and to issue an auditor's report. However, because of the matter described in the *Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion* section of our report, we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on these financial statements.

We are required to be independent of the Plan, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits.



***Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA***

The supplemental schedule H (Form 5500), Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. Because of the significance of the matter described in the *Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion* section of our report, it is inappropriate to and we do not express an opinion on the supplemental schedule referred to above.

## Notes to Financial Statements

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### 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Human Rights Watch Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), which is sponsored by Human Rights Watch (HRW), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### *General*

The Plan is a defined contribution 403(b) pension plan covering all eligible employees of HRW. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

#### *Plan Administration*

Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association (TIAA) is the Plan's third-party administrator. The Plan's investment assets are held by TIAA and the College Retirement Equity Fund (CREF) and TIAA Trust, N.A. (formerly known as TIAA, FSB). HRW, as the Plan administrator, controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan.

#### *Eligibility*

All employees that are not excluded employees, as defined by the Plan document, are eligible to participate in the Plan as of their date of hire with HRW. To be eligible for participation in the employer component of the Plan, an employee must have completed at least two years of service and have provided 1,000 hours of service in each of the two years before becoming eligible to receive employer contribution, as defined, under the Plan. An employee is credited with a year of service upon reaching 1,000 hours of service in a 12-month period beginning with the hire date.

#### *Participant Contributions*

Each year, participants are permitted to contribute to the Plan, beginning on the date of hire, an amount not to exceed the dollar limitations of \$23,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024, as prescribed by the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions not to exceed \$7,500. Income taxes on employee compensation contributed to the Plan are deferred, subject to limitations as prescribed by the Code.

All contributions are invested in various investment options offered by the Plan. Employees may allocate contributions among the TIAA or the CREF accounts in any whole-number proportion, including full allocation to any annuity or account.

#### *Employer Contributions*

HRW may contribute a discretionary amount based on a formula. Under this formula, the amount of HRW contributions will be calculated as a specified percentage of a participant's gross annual earnings. HRW contributions made to a participant's account are allocated between the TIAA or CREF accounts in accordance with the employee's designated investment mix. During the year ended December 31, 2024, HRW's employer contributions made to participants' accounts amounted to \$2,374,479.

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### ***Participants' Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, HRW's contribution, and an allocation of Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### ***Vesting***

Participants are vested immediately in both their contributions and any employer contributions made to the account.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

A participant is eligible to receive a distribution from their deferral and employer contribution balances under the following circumstances: (a) retirement, (b) termination of employment, (c) disability, (d) death, or (e) attaining 59½ years of age. A participant is eligible to receive a hardship withdrawal only from their deferral balance.

### ***Plan Loans***

Participants may borrow, directly from TIAA or the Plan, a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or ½ of their vested account balance. Such loans are subject to certain limitations and are not included in the Plan's financial statements, as the loans are not made from Plan assets and are, therefore, not considered assets of the Plan. Participants receiving loans from TIAA are required to pledge, as collateral, an annuity account value of 110% of the loan amount for the period the loan is outstanding. The loan balance outstanding from TIAA to the Plan's participants was \$16,086 and \$27,780 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. As such, \$17,695 and \$30,558 of annuity account values (110% of outstanding loans from TIAA) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, serve as collateral for the related loans. Participants receiving loans from the Plan must retain at least 50% of their account balance prior to the loan distribution to be used as collateral. As of December 31, 2024, no loans were deemed to be in default. According to the Plan document, if the participants default on the loan, they will be taxed on the amount of the outstanding loan balance and will be subject to a 10% penalty if they are under the age of 59½. In addition, TIAA has the right to foreclose its security interest in the portion of participants' vested accounts under the Plan that they pledged as security for the loan.

### ***Participant Loans***

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested balance. The term of the participant loan is up to five years, or up to ten years if the loan is utilized to acquire a principal residence. Participant loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest equal to the Federal Reserve Board Bank prime loan rate plus 1% at the time of the loan origination. Principal and interest are repaid directly to TIAA, at least quarterly.

### ***Administrative Expenses***

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by HRW. Expenses that are paid by HRW are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the

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administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### *Basis of Accounting*

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

#### *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

#### *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### *Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition*

The Plan's investments (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value) are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

#### *Payment of Benefits*

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### 3. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of funds offered by the Plan. These funds are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

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### 4. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides for a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

*Level 1* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quotes prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quotes prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived primarily from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*CREF Investments (Other Registered Investments)* - These separate accounts are registered investments offered through variable annuity contracts issued by CREF that invest principally in equity securities, fixed-income instruments, and short-term investments in accordance with each portfolio's investment objectives. Units held in the registered investments are valued at net asset value (NAV) and published daily on NASDAQ. The NAV is measured based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The fair value of the underlying investments is determined using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources that may employ various pricing methods to value the investments, including matrix pricing. Money market account holdings are generally valued at amortized cost. On a daily basis, units in the registered investments are revalued to reflect performance of the underlying investments minus any fees and charges.

*TIAA Access (Variable Annuity Contracts)* - The value of the variable annuity contracts is determined at the close of each business day at NAV and based on the fair value of the underlying investments. The underlying investments in the variable annuity contracts are invested in registered investment companies, which are valued at quoted market prices in an exchange and active markets. The NAV,

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as provided by TIAA, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The investment objective is to achieve a favorable long-term return, mainly through capital appreciation, primarily from equity securities, and income. There are no restrictions on the trading or withdrawals of these investments, or unfunded commitments, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Registered Investment Companies* - Investments in registered investment company accounts are valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year-end. The registered investment company shares are traded at quoted prices through the National Securities Clearing Corporation. The registered investment companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Pooled Separate Account* - The value of the pooled separate account is determined at the close of each business day at unit value, which is based on the fair value of the underlying assets, which may consist of real estate properties, mutual funds, and securities. The unit value of the pooled separate account is published on NASDAQ; however, the pooled separate account is not publicly traded. The value of the underlying real estate properties is determined by an external appraisal on a periodic basis, which consists of estimates based on professional opinions. The value of the underlying investments in the registered investment companies and securities is based on the daily value of the underlying registered investment companies and securities on an open market. There are restrictions on the trading and withdrawals of funds from this investment; generally transfers out can be executed on any business day but may be limited to once per calendar quarter. Other limited exceptions may also apply. There are no unfunded commitments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Insurance Company General Contracts* - The non-fully benefit-responsive (NFBR) fixed annuity contracts, composed entirely of the TIAA Traditional Annuity Contracts, are reported at fair value. Fair value is determined using a discounted cash flow model. The TIAA Traditional Annuity Contracts are not available for sale or transfer on any security exchange. The fixed annuity contracts are subject to various restrictions.

The return of annuity contributions plus interest to participants is subject to TIAA's claims-paying ability. Annuity accounts are credited with a guaranteed minimum rate of interest that is determined annually. Participants may also earn interest in addition to the guaranteed rate at the discretion of TIAA. Such discretionary interest, if any, is declared by TIAA on a year-by-year basis and remains in effect for the subsequent 12-month "declaration year."

Contributions to the annuity accounts are grouped by TIAA into "vintages" comprising premiums received over defined time periods of one or more contiguous calendar months. The interest crediting rate for each vintage is determined, in part, by the net investment earnings rate of the TIAA assets supporting that vintage, minus a charge for administrative expenses and an amount set aside for contingency reserves. Crediting rates are also determined by the performance of investments contained in TIAA's general account.

Withdrawals may be withdrawn over 84 months or a lump-sum withdrawal with a 2.5% surrender charge.

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### 5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Guaranteed Interest Contracts

The Plan entered fully benefit-responsive guaranteed interest contracts with TIAA. TIAA maintains the contributions in a general account. The guaranteed interest contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. Because the guaranteed interest contracts are fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed interest contracts. The guaranteed interest contracts are presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by TIAA, represents contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are not probable of occurring.

The guaranteed interest contracts do not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreements prior to the scheduled maturity date.

### 6. Information Certified by TIAA and CREF

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, TIAA and CREF, qualified institutions, have certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefit as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, other income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment information reflected on the supplemental Schedule H (Form 5500), Line 4i-Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

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### 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, HRW has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would remain 100% vested in their accounts.

### 8. Annual Reporting Requirements

Prior to January 1, 2009, Principal Trust Company, TIAA, and CREF maintained records at a contract level, not Plan level, and administratively decided not to provide accounting records and supporting documentation at the participant or Plan level relating to certain annuity and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees. As such, neither the Plan Sponsor nor Principal Trust Company, TIAA, and CREF have been able to produce sufficient records and supporting documents relating to certain annuity and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009. As a result, the completeness and the accuracy of the annuity and custodial accounts, related investment income, and distributions related to these accounts, if any, could not be determined.

### 9. Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by TIAA. TIAA received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated August 7, 2017, which states that the pre-approved plan document, as then designed, satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, Plan management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no IRS examinations for any tax periods in progress.

### 10. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are in funds and accounts that are managed by TIAA and CREF and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Participant loan fees are paid to TIAA and CREF by participants. The Plan also receives plan service credits from TIAA and CREF. The Plan also issues loans to participants that are secured by the vested balance of the participants' accounts. Such transactions are party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules.

### 11. Subsequent Events

The Plan's management has performed subsequent event procedures through October 1, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no subsequent events requiring adjustments to the financial statements or disclosures herein.
