Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Operating Engineers Annuity Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions,

including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The Operating Engineers Annuity Plan (the "Plan") was established July 1, 1985, pursuant to the authority of the Board of Trustees of the Pension Trust Fund for Operating Engineers, as provided by the collective bargaining agreements between International Union of Operating Engineers, Local Union No. 3 ("Local No. 3") and employer associations and individual employers signatory to the agreements.

The Plan is a defined contribution multiemployer pension plan. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

THE PLAN DOCUMENT INCLUDES DETAILED RULES FOR EACH SITUATION. PARTICIPANTS SHOULD REFER TO THE PLAN AGREEMENT AND ANY AMENDMENTS REGARDING SPECIFIC PROVISIONS OF THE PLAN.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

C. Employer Contributions

Contributions as reported are contributions made for hours worked during the year. Contributions receivable is estimated based on contributions received subsequent to the end of the year. No allowance is provided for uncollectible accounts.

D. Employer Compliance Program

Employer remittance reports were accepted as submitted without examination or verification of employers' payroll records. The Plan's system of internal control provides for examination of employers' records under a separate employer compliance program.

E. Tax-Exempt Status

The Plan received a favorable determination of tax-exempt status on March 8, 2016. The plan administrator and the Plan's legal counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for federal or state income tax is made.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken a tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

F. Participant Accounts

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their entire account balance.

Each participant's account is credited with employer contributions, participant rollovers, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses and expenses. Participants direct the investment of their accounts among a diversified menu of mutual funds and a common/collective trust offered under the Plan.

The contributions of participants who decline to make an investment election are invested in a Target Retirement Fund.

G. Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan allows participants who have had an individual account for five years or more to apply to the Board of Trustees for a loan from their individual account for not less than \$1,000 and not to exceed the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. A loan is secured by a participant's vested account balance, bears interest at the rate charged on an unsecured loan from the Operating Engineers Union Local #3 Federal Credit Union and must be repaid to the Plan within five years from the date of taking the loan, or ten years if for the purchase of a principal residence. Notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 carry interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50% with maturities through 2034.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based on terms of the Plan document. A note will be in default if any required payment is more than one hundred and twenty days delinquent.

H. Risks and Uncertainties

Plan investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risk. Some estimated values may differ from values that would have been used had a ready market existed for the investments. Due to the level of risk associated with investments and level of uncertainty with respect to the changes in the value of investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in risk in the near term would materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

I. Payment of Benefits

Participants are entitled to a distribution of their individual account upon retirement (as defined), disability or death. In the event that a participant dies before retirement, their individual account balance shall be paid to their surviving spouse or beneficiary.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820 provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Level 1 investments consist of mutual funds valued at fair value based on quoted market prices.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The investment strategy for the investment valued at net asset value is as follows:

The Putnam Stable Value Fund invests primarily in guaranteed investment contracts ("GICs") or funding agreements, security-backed investment contracts ("SBICs"), separate accounts issued or wrapped by insurance companies, banks or other financial institutions, externally managed stable value commingled investment funds or high-quality money market instruments or other similar short-term investments (collectively, all such investments are referred to herein as "Investment Contracts"). Investment Contracts are valued at contract value which approximates fair value, which represents invested principal plus accrued interest earned thereon. The investment contracts are not tradeable on any secondary market, but provide for benefit-responsive withdrawals by plan participants at contract value.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date and interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized and unrealized gains and losses are computed using investments' carry values for financial statement purposes.

The Plan did not have any transfers into or out of Levels 1, 2 or 3 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 - FUNDING POLICY

The Board of Trustees has established a funding policy and method in order to promote the purpose of the Plan and to ensure compliance with ERISA. Each employer contributes to the Plan such amounts and at such times as are required by the applicable provisions of the collective bargaining agreement, or such other agreements as approved by the Board of Trustees. Employer contributions are based on hourly contribution rates and are made on a monthly basis. The annual contributions for the year satisfied the minimum funding requirements of ERISA.

NOTE 5 - PLAN TERMINATION

Upon termination of the Plan, per the Agreement and Declaration of the Trust, any and all monies remaining in the Trust after payment of all expenses and obligations of the Plan shall be distributed among the participants.

NOTE 6 - RECORDKEEPING

The Plan has an agreement with Transamerica Retirement Solutions ("Transamerica") to act as custodian and record keeper and maintain an account for each participant. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan paid Transamerica \$840,724 and \$817,360, respectively.

In addition, each month \$5.00 is deducted from every participant account and transferred to the Plan for payment of operating expenses. The total amount withdrawn from participants accounts and transferred to the Plan to pay operating expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$1,688,601 and \$1,631,722, respectively.

NOTE 7 - MULTI-PLAN SERVICES AGENCY, INC.

Multi-Plan Services Agency, Inc. ("MPSA, Inc.") was organized to provide a cost sharing arrangement for services provided to the participating entities. MPSA, Inc. and the Plan share board members. Per the cost sharing arrangement between the participating entities and MPSA, Inc., MPSA, Inc. provides employer contributions collection and accounting, payroll compliance, and other various services listed in the cost sharing agreement. MPSA, Inc. received monthly amounts from the Plan as outlined in the Plan's cost sharing agreement.

The Plan paid MPSA, Inc. a monthly amount of \$12,985 during the years 2024 and 2023, based on budgeted estimates and as defined in its cost sharing agreement. Each month and at year end a true-up based on actual expenses is performed amongst the participating entities and MPSA, Inc. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan owed MPSA, Inc. \$11,489 and \$21,579, respectively, for reimbursements of its cost sharing amount.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, MPSA, Inc. owed the Plan \$536,292 and \$2,530,231, respectively, for employer contributions.

NOTE 8 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Local No. 3, a party to the collective bargaining agreement is a contributing employer to the Plan.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 15, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosures in these financial statements.

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
