NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Sampco, Inc. (the Company) 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of the Company who have completed six months of service and are age eighteen or older. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA).

The Plan is for the benefit of the employees of Sampco of Texas, Inc., Sampco of Indiana, Inc., Sampco, Inc., Sampco of Georgia, Inc., Sampco of Pennsylvania, Inc. dba Vision Products, and Brilliant Graphics Group, LLC.

Lincoln Financial Group is the custodian of the Plan assets and C360, LLC is the designated plan administrator for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Plan Contributions

Each year participants may contribute a portion of pretax annual compensation, up to \$23,000 and \$22,500 for the calendar years 2024 and 2023, respectively, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make "catch-up" contributions of \$7,500 for each of the calendar years 2024 and 2023. At the discretion of the Plan Administrator, participants may also make rollover contributions which represent distributions from other qualified plans and certain individual retirement accounts (IRAs).

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers several pooled separate accounts as investment options for participants. Profit sharing by the Company consists of discretionary matching contributions of twenty-five cents on the dollar, on up to 6% (six percent) of the participant's compensation for each of the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and a discretionary profit sharing contribution. The discretionary employer contributions, which are contributed at the option of the Company's management, are invested in a portfolio of investments as directed by the Participants. There were no discretionary profit sharing contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution, (b) Plan earnings, and (c) forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts, and reduced by (d) certain plan expenses. Allocations of Plan Earnings are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

NOTE 1 - (Continued)

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance at any time in the previous one-year period, or 50 percent of the present value their vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years, but may be longer if obtained for the purchases of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prevailing market rates. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly and biweekly payroll deductions. The amount of the loan unpaid at the date of termination of employment is reclassified as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, or any other reasons, a participant may receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

Forfeited Accounts

Non-vested forfeited amounts are used to offset future employer contributions. During 2024 and 2023, forfeitures were not used to reduce employer contributions to the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023 forfeited non-vested account balances were \$6,337 and \$4,636, respectively.

Participant Rollovers

Participants are allowed to transfer or rollover funds into the Plan from another qualified employer plan.

Plan Expenses

Expenses of the Plan are shared by Sampco, Inc. and the plan participants.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America.

Use of Accounting Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, when the Plan includes such assets. In accordance with the policy for stating investments at fair value, quoted prices in actual market are used to value investments on a recurring basis. Shares of mutual funds are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold, as well as held, at year end.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 2 - (Continued)

Tax Status

On June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the prototype adopted by the plan, as then designed, qualifies under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401(a). The plan has not received a determination letter specific to the plan itself; however, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the plan's financial statements.

Uncertain Tax Positions

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 25, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that there are no additional adjustments or disclosures required.

NOTE 3 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan may invest in various types of investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 4 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participants' accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

NOTE 5 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS

As noted in the independent auditors' report, the Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employment Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Accordingly, no auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by Lincoln Financial Group, the Plan custodian, were performed by the independent auditors except for comparing the information to the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Lincoln National Life Insurance Company has certified as to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, the related investment activity reflected in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and the information contained in the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 6 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST

Certain Plan investments are shares of a group annuity contract managed by The Lincoln National Life Insurance Company (LNLIC). LNLIC is the record keeper as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to LNLIC for the investment management services approximated \$54,716 and \$49,169 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 7 - CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANIES

The Plan is party to a group annuity contract with, and administered by, LNLIC. Participant directed contributions are made to the Guaranteed Stable Value Account, and are invested in LNLIC's General Account. The principal and credited interest - less withdrawals, charges, and adjustments - is guaranteed as long as the contract is in force. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1 percent. Contract value is the relevant measure for this unallocated insurance contract because this is the method of valuation employed by LNLIC.

Contract value is defined as the total of all amounts allocated under this contract for participants to the Guaranteed Stable Value Account, plus all interest accrued thereon, minus the sum of any withdrawals, transfers, and participant administrative charges deducted from the Guaranteed Stable Value Account under this contract for such participant, at the valuation day.

NOTE 8 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value measurements

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefit.

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority and Level 3 inputs consist of unobservable inputs and have the lowest priority. The Plan had no assets measured using inputs within the prescribed levels.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Level 1 inputs are quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, and include quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 3 Fair Value Measurements

Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for an asset or liability and would be used to measure the fair value to the extent that relevant observable inputs are not available.

There were no assets with Level 1, 2, or 3 fair value measurements at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

NOTE 8 - (Continued)

Investments Measured Using the Net Asset Value per Share Practical Expedient

LNLIC issued to the plan sponsor an annuity contract or funding agreement that includes variable investment offerings, through pooled separate accounts. The value is equal to the number of participation units owned under the contract in each pooled separate account multiplied by the unit value of the participant units. The unit value of the participation units is estimated by LNLIC based upon the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus the fund's liabilities, divided by the number of participation units outstanding.

Investments in the Plan are measured and reported on a recurring basis. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, investments consisted of pooled separate accounts totaling \$8,175,788 and \$7,777,096, respectively, measured at net asset value*.

**In accordance with Subtopic 820-10, certain investments that were measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.*

Investments Measured Using the Net Asset Value per Share Practical Expedient

Investments in the pooled separate accounts can be transferred and redeemed immediately at the participant level. The ability to make transfers may be limited to the extent that an investment manager or underlying fund limits trading activity.

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan's investments (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) appreciated (depreciated) in value as follows:

NOTE 9 - EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

The Plan failed the discrimination test for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Excess participant and company contributions amounting to \$10,901 and \$18,102, respectively, are recorded as a liability in the accompanying Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits and as corrective distributions in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for each year. The plan reimbursed the excess contributions at December 31, 2023 and 2024 during 2024 and 2025, respectively.

NOTE 10 - RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO SCHEDULE H OF FORM 5500
