## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

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### NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the *Kent Quality Foods, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan* ("Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### *General*

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of *Kent Quality Foods, Inc.* and *CLC Transportation, LLC* ("Company") who are age 18 or older and who have completed 6 months or more of service.

#### *Contributions*

Participants may contribute elective salary reductions up to 90 percent of their compensation as long as the total contribution does not exceed the legal dollar or percentage limits for the Plan year. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contribution into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company has the right to make discretionary matching contributions to eligible employees each plan year. The Company contributed discretionary matching contributions of 50 percent of the first 6 percent of base compensation that participants contributed to the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

#### *Participant Accounts*

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's elective salary reduction contribution, the Company's matching contribution, and Plan earnings (losses) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that could be provided from the participant's account.

#### *Vesting*

Participants are immediately vested in their elective salary reduction contributions plus actual earnings (losses) allocated thereon. The Company portion of contributions plus actual earnings are vested to participants ratably over a six-year period.

YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

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NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN - CONTINUED

*Participant Loans*

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts as determined by the Plan administrator. Participants may borrow a minimum of \$500 or any amount that does not exceed 50 percent of the participant's vested account balance as of the end of the accounting period preceding the date on which the loan is approved or \$50,000, whichever amount is smaller. The loans are secured by assignment of 50 percent of the borrower's interest in their account and each loan will bear interest at a fixed rate for the life of the loan at a rate of two percent over the bank's prime rate. Loans for general purposes have terms ranging from 12 months to 60 months while loans related to principal residences have terms ranging from 61 months to 360 months.

*Payment of Benefits*

Upon termination of service, distributions from all accounts with balances exceeding \$5,000 will be made in the form of a single lump-sum payment of the entire value of the vested interest in the account or payments in annual installments subject to certain rules as set by the Plan Sponsor. In-service withdrawals are permitted upon attaining age 59½ or in cases of financial hardship.

*Plan Forfeitures*

The Plan had outstanding forfeited amounts received of \$23,305 and \$2 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan uses forfeited amounts to reduce future employer contributions. In 2024 and 2023, employer contributions were reduced by \$36,692 and \$33,356, respectively, from forfeited amounts received. The Plan forfeiture balance has been included within the stable value fund balance and collective trust fund balance, respectively, as reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

*Basis of Accounting*

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

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NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - CONTINUED

*Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

*Notes Receivable from Participants*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

*Payment of Benefits*

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

*Plan Expenses*

Certain Plan expenses, including fees for investment management, recordkeeping services, and administrative expenses are paid by the Plan and are either allocated to participant accounts or are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments presented in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. All other administrative expenses, including compensation for officers and employees performing administrative functions, are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

*Subsequent Events*

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 25, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.

The Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

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NOTE 4 - INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan previously had a group annuity contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The group annuity contract, Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund, was a fixed account that was part of the general account of Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate was based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium long-term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate (which will never be less than zero percent as stated in the contract), and prevailing market conditions. Interest crediting rate is reset quarterly. The group annuity contract was presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value and reported with the investments at fair value under the principles of ASU 2015-12. As of December 31, 2024, the balance of this group annuity contract was \$- 0 -.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include premature termination of the contracts by the Plan, plant closings, layoffs, plan termination, bankruptcy, mergers, and early retirement incentives. The Plan does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

The average yield earned by the Plan is derived by averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. The average yield for the year ended December 31, 2023, was 1.23 percent.

NOTE 5 - INVESTMENT IN COLLECTIVE INVESTMENT TRUST

The Plan invests in the flexPATH Stable Value Fund (the "Fund"). The Fund is a collective investment trust managed by flexPATH Strategies, designed to preserve principal and provide high current income. The Fund seeks to achieve this objective by investing in other collective investment funds and separate accounts with the primary fund being the Putnam Stable Value fund.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets of a fund attributable to fully benefit-responsive Wrap Contracts. The contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of their employer sponsored defined-contribution plans which invest in the Fund. The fair value of Wrap Contracts generally is reflected by market value at the close of business on the valuation date. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value and reported with the investments at fair value under the principles of ASU 2015-12. Participating plans may terminate their interest in the Fund at any time. Withdrawals shall be paid at the lesser of book or market value, as defined in the Fund's Declaration of Trust.

The contract value of the investment contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$233,565 and \$- 0 -, respectively. The crediting interest rate of a particular Wrap Contract is generally adjusted quarterly and is tied to the changing yields on its respective portfolio as well as the performance of its underlying investments. In addition, the interest rate at which return is credited to the Fund can change as the difference between market value and book value of the covered assets changes. As a result, the crediting rate will generally reflect, over time, movements in prevailing interest rates and the performance of the underlying investments. Under each of the Wrap Contracts, the crediting rate of that particular contract will not be less than zero percent.

The existence of certain conditions can limit the Fund's ability to transact at contract value with the issuers of its Wrap Contracts. Specifically, any event outside of the normal operation of the Fund which causes a withdrawal from the Wrap Contracts may result in a negative market value adjustment with respect to such withdrawal. Example of such events include, but are not limited to, layoffs, bankruptcy, plan termination, mergers, early retirement incentives, and competing fund transfers or violations of equity wash or equivalent rules and changes of employer or plan qualification status. If the likelihood of such a non-book value withdrawal is imminent, it may be necessary to consider a revaluation of those particular fund contracts. The occurrence of an event outside the normal operating of the Fund which would cause withdrawals from Wrap Contracts is not considered to be probable.

In addition to the limitations noted above, issuers of Wrap Contracts have certain rights to terminate a contract and settle at an amount which differs from contract value. For example, certain breaches by the Fund of its obligations, representations, or warranties under the terms of Wrap Contracts can result in its termination at market value, which may differ from contract value. Wrap Contracts may also provide for termination with no payment obligation from the issuer if the performance of the contract constitutes a prohibited transaction under ERISA or other applicable law. Wrap Contracts may also provide issuer with the right to reduce contract value in the event an underlying security suffers a credit event or the right to terminate the contract in the event certain investment guidelines are materially breached and not cured.

The annualized yield earned by the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024, was 3.88 percent.

NOTE 6 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods were appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. No Level 3 inputs were available to the Plan.

*Level 1 Fair Value Measurements*

The fair value of interests in registered investment companies is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end.

*Level 2 Fair Value Measurements*

The fair value of the Plan's investment in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund of Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (see Note 4), also known as a fixed annuity, was based on inputs, other than the quoted prices included within Level 1, that are observable for valuing the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. Observable inputs include quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active or non-active markets.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan's investment in the Fund (see Note 5) was valued using the NAV as a practical expedient which represents the price at which the Plan is able to initiate a transaction. This investment is excluded from the fair value hierarchy. The inputs on methodology used for valuing securities are not necessarily an indication of the risk associated with investing in those securities. The Plan's investments calculated at the NAV per share may be redeemed on a daily basis at the NAV as of the measurement date. There are no unfunded commitments.

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NOTE 7 - EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

Contributions received from participants and the Company for 2024 are net of payments of \$10,407 made in February 2025 to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. That amount, plus gains thereon of \$1,193, is included in the Plan's statement of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions payable at December 31, 2024.

Contributions received from participants and the Company for 2023 are net of payments of \$43,655 made in March 2024 to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. That amount, plus gains thereon of \$5,977, is included in the Plan's statement of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions payable at December 31, 2023.

NOTE 8 - TAX STATUS

The Plan was restated effective January 1, 2021, under a new Watkins, Ross & Co. non-standardized pre-approved plan which has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the Plan was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, therefore, the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC.

GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of registered investment companies, collective investment trusts, and fixed annuities managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, custodians of the Plan. The Plan investments are held by Empower Trust Company, LLC. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

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NOTE 10 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 11 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 12 - RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO SCHEDULE H OF FORM 5500
