- The information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by the qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by the institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Wurth 401(k) ("Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

A. General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of participating subsidiaries of the Wurth Group of North America (collectively the "Company"). Employees are eligible to contribute to the Plan upon hire, although Company contributions begin after six months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan was amended and restated effective January 1, 2018 in its entirety.

B. Contributions

Each year, participants who are not highly compensated may elect to make pretax and/or Roth after tax contributions in the aggregate of up to 50 percent of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. For highly compensated participants, the aggregate contribution maximum is 30 percent of annual compensation, as defined. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and common collective trusts as investment options for participants. The Company contributes up to 6 percent of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Additional amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company's board of directors. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

C. Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

D. Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20 percent vested after two years of credited service, and this vested portion increases each year thereafter, until 100 percent vested after six years.

E. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 4.25 percent to 10.50 percent at December 31, 2024, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined annually by the plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Terms range from one to five years or greater for the purchase of a primary residence.

F. Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant will generally receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may also receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Participants, including terminated participants, may request a withdrawal of their accounts, excluding their matching contributions, in cases of financial hardship.

G. Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of non-vested Company contributions are used to reduce future employer contributions. During 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$1,009,174 and fees were reduced by \$76,081 from forfeited non-vested accounts. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$714,571 and \$844,963 respectively, of forfeitures remained unapplied to employer contributions.

H. Auto-Enrollment and Auto-Escalation

The Plan provides for auto-enrollment for all eligible participants. Each subsidiary sets its own auto-enrollment deferral percentage within a 1% - 6% range. Most subsidiaries also include auto-escalation, with over half capping it at 10%.

2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Benefits Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and the trustee. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

D. Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

E. Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

F. Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

G. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 6, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under authoritative guidance are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust funds: Valued based on NAV of units held in the collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and is therefore excluded from the fair value table. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the funds will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trusts, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The Plan had no level 2 or 3 assets for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

4. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan.

5. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the trustee and recordkeeper for the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Effective April 1, 2018, the Trust Agreement between Fidelity Management Trust Company and the Plan Sponsor was amended to include a Revenue Credit Account. Fidelity Management Trust funds the account on a quarterly basis in accordance with the calculation as set forth in the agreement.

The Administrator may direct Fidelity Management Trust Company to use the amounts held in the Revenue Credit Account to reimburse the Sponsor for fees and expenses associated with services provided to the Plan, or to pay vendors, including Trustee or third party directly. The Plan applied fee credits of \$182,323 and \$141,719 for the year-ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively to reduce administrative expenses of the Plan.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

7. TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated August 28, 2014 which expired on January 31, 2019, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has not obtained a new determination letter pursuant to Revenue Procedure 2016-37 which eliminated the requirement to obtain a periodic determination letter. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter as necessary to maintain compliance with regulations. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

9. ADMINISTRATION OF PLAN ASSETS

The Plans' assets are administered under a contract with Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan. The trustee invests funds received from contributions, investment sales, interest, and dividend income and makes distribution payments to participants.

10. DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

During 2024 and 2023, it was determined that certain subsidiary level contributions remitted during this period were not remitted on a timely basis as defined by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Delinquent Participant Contributions Disclosure under ERISA. Untimely remittances identified on the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions, which totaled \$59,695 and \$156,890, respectively, were self-corrected by management. Additionally, the Company compensated participants for lost earnings resulting from the delay in contributions.
