## Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2024 and 2023

### NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

#### [1] General:

The following description of the Andersen Tax LLC Tax Reduction Investment Plan (the "Plan"), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all U.S. employees of Andersen Tax LLC, (the "Company") except for employees subject to a collective bargaining agreement, nonresident aliens, and leased or reclassified employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The trustee and recordkeeper of the Plan is Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company.

#### [2] Participants' accounts:

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant of the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and related employer-matching contributions and an allocation of the Plan's investment income (loss) on an individual fund basis. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. Participant's may also be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### [3] Eligibility:

Employees may participate in the Plan at any age beginning with the first pay period that starts after 30 days of employment.

#### [4] Contributions:

Participants may contribute up to 40% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. In no event may participants' pre-tax and after-tax contributions exceed any statutory limitations. Participants may also roll over amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers a variety of mutual funds and a common collective trust as investment options for participants. The Company matches 25% of the participant pre-tax contributions, up to 6% of base compensation, as defined in the Plan with a maximum match of 1.5% of participants' eligible salary. The Plan also allows for after-tax contributions and Company matching, as defined in the Plan and subject to statutory limits.

The Plan provides that participants direct the investment of their contributions in their account. Company matching contributions follow the participants' investment instructions.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 1% of eligible compensation.

#### [5] Vesting:

Participants have a non-forfeitable right to 100% of the value of their salary reduction contributions and rollover contribution accounts. Participants shall have a 100% vested interest in their employer contribution account from the day they receive them, which is after one year of service, as defined by the Plan.

##### [6] Payment of benefits:

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or an installment distribution over a specified period not to exceed the life or life expectancy of the participant. Prior to termination of service, the participant may elect to receive a hardship distribution from the balance of deferral contributions, subject to certain conditions. Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### [7] Investment options:

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct contributions into several investment options with the Trustee. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

##### [8] Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$250 for non-residential loans and \$1,000 for residential loans up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 3.75% to 9% at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. A participant may not have more than two non-residential loans and one residential loan outstanding at any given time. All loans shall be repaid by payroll deduction under a fixed schedule of principal and interest, payable at least quarterly. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

##### [9] Plan expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation in value of investments.

##### [10] Forfeitures:

Forfeited nonvested accounts may be used to reduce future Company contributions and pay Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2023, forfeitures of approximately \$20,700 was used to reduce employer contributions and \$16,800 was used to pay Plan expenses. Forfeited nonvested accounts available at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were approximately \$55,700 and \$29,550, respectively.

#### NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### [1] Basis of accounting:

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

#### **NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

##### **[2] Valuation of investments and income recognition:**

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

##### **[3] Subsequent events:**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 2, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

##### **[4] Use of estimates:**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and when applicable, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

##### **[5] Excess contributions payable:**

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction in contributions.

##### **[6] Payment of benefits:**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### **NOTE C - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE**

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the U.S. Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, has certified the completeness and accuracy of all investments and related investment activity and notes receivable from participants and related activity in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the accompanying supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

#### **NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, "Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures," provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include (1) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (2) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (3) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or (4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investment assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds* - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common collective trusts* - Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. As of December 31, 2023, the Plan maintains investments in Vanguard Retirement Trusts and Vanguard Retirement Savings Trust, common collective trusts sponsored by Vanguard. During 2024, the Plan exchanged its investments in the Vanguard Retirement Funds for the Vanguard Retirement Trusts.

*Self-directed brokerage accounts* – Accounts consist primarily of mutual funds, U.S. stocks, U.S. Treasury securities, corporate bonds and certificates of deposit that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with those of other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

#### Changes in Fair Value Levels

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another.

### NOTE E - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Users of these financial statements should be aware that volatility in the financial markets may significantly impact future valuation of the Plan's investments. Accordingly, the valuation of investments at December 31, 2024 may not necessarily be indicative of amounts that could be realized in a current market exchange.

### NOTE F - RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and common collective trusts managed by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company. The Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company is the trustee of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Fees paid by the Plan to Vanguard were \$250,914 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

### NOTE G - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in the Plan in accordance with regulations. In such event, the Plan assets will be distributed to the participants or their beneficiaries in cash, in kind or in such manner as the trustee shall determine.

### NOTE H - TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a Prototype Non-standardized profit sharing Plan with a Cash or Deferred Arrangement "CODA" sponsored by The Vanguard Group. On June 30, 2020, the IRS stated in an opinion letter that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a government authority. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

### NOTE I - PLAN OPERATIONS

During the year ended December 31, 2023, it was identified that certain contributions were not being withheld from participants. As of December 31, 2023, the Plan estimated the missed employee deferrals to be \$19,081. During 2024, the Plan determined the actual amount of missed employee deferrals was \$7,271.
