Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of 403(b) Thrift Plan for United Disability Services, Inc. ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.



NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the 403(b) Thrift Plan for United Disability Service, Inc. (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan and covers substantially all employees of the United Disability Services, Inc. (the "Company" or the "Plan Sponsor"). There are no minimum age or service requirements to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA").

Contributions

Participants may, subject to certain limitations, elect to contribute one to one hundred percent of their pre-tax or after-tax compensation to the Plan. The Company will make matching contributions equal to 50% of participants' contributions up to 6% of the individual participant's compensation. The Plan also provides for rollover contributions from other Plans qualified under the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Participant Accounts

Separate accounts are maintained by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (the "Custodian") in the name of each participant. Participants direct their contributions and matching Plan Sponsor contributions to be invested in one or a combination of the investments available to the Plan.

Vesting

Employee contributions and rollover contributions are fully vested at all times. Plan participants acquire a 100% vested nonforfeitable interest in the Plan Sponsor's contributions upon completion of 3 years of service.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures attributable to matching contributions are first used to pay any charge under the Plan made in connection with the termination of employment of the participant whose termination resulted in the forfeiture. Any remaining forfeitures after such payment shall be applied to reduce the Plan Sponsor's contribution. Employer contributions were reduced by \$8 and \$1,793 during 2024 and 2023, respectively. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no accumulated forfeitures.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accounting records of the Plan are maintained on an accrual basis.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value except for a group annuity contract with the Custodian, which is stated at contract value, as further discussed in Note 5. The change in the difference between fair value and the cost of investments, along with the difference between the proceeds received and the cost of the investments sold, is reflected in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits as net appreciation.

Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis.

Fair Value Measurements

Fair value estimates are made at a specific point in time based on relevant market information about the financial instrument. These estimates are subjective in nature and involve uncertainties and matters of significant judgement and, therefore, cannot be determined with precision. Changes in assumptions could significantly affect the estimates.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United State of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and the accompanying notes. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Administrative Fees

A portion of the administrative fees are paid by the Plan. Other administrative fees, including legal and professional fees, are paid by the Plan Sponsor.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 26, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are held by the Custodian. Financial information relating to the Plan's assets is included in the accompanying financial statements based on information provided by the Custodian. Fair value is a market-based measurement that is determined based on assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability. As a basis for considering such assumptions, the Plan uses a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value as follows:

- Level 1 - Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets:
- Level 2 - Inputs, other than the quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3 - Unobservable inputs in which there is little or no market data, which require the reporting entity to develop its own assumptions

The classification of fair value measurements within the hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the measurement. The valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value is as follows:

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the net asset value of the underlying investments held by each separate account, which are actively traded.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of the net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the valuation methods.

NOTE 5 - GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan invests in a fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract with the Custodian totaling \$803,352 and \$583,157 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Custodian maintains the contributions in a general account and is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another), bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of not occurring. The group annuity contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

It is the Plan's intention to be organized and operated as tax-exempt under the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The IRS recently implemented a determination letter program for 403(b) plans, and the Plan Administrator intends to evaluate whether it will be necessary to apply for a determination. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan administrator is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that might adversely affect the Plan's qualified status and believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not indicated any intention to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth by ERISA.

NOTE 8 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions include the purchases and sales of investments through the Plan's Custodian and the payment of services and expenses. There are also indirect fees deducted directly from investment earnings of the Plan.

("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.



NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the 403(b) Thrift Plan for United Disability Service, Inc. (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan and covers substantially all employees of the United Disability Services, Inc. (the "Company" or the "Plan Sponsor"). There are no minimum age or service requirements to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA").

Contributions

Participants may, subject to certain limitations, elect to contribute one to one hundred percent of their pre-tax or after-tax compensation to the Plan. The Company will make matching contributions equal to 50% of participants' contributions up to 6% of the individual participant's compensation. The Plan also provides for rollover contributions from other Plans qualified under the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Participant Accounts

Separate accounts are maintained by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (the "Custodian") in the name of each participant. Participants direct their contributions and matching Plan Sponsor contributions to be invested in one or a combination of the investments available to the Plan.

Vesting

Employee contributions and rollover contributions are fully vested at all times. Plan participants acquire a 100% vested nonforfeitable interest in the Plan Sponsor's contributions upon completion of 3 years of service.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures attributable to matching contributions are first used to pay any charge under the Plan made in connection with the termination of employment of the participant whose termination resulted in the forfeiture. Any remaining forfeitures after such payment shall be applied to reduce the Plan Sponsor's contribution. Employer contributions were reduced by \$8 and \$1,793 during 2024 and 2023, respectively. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no accumulated forfeitures.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accounting records of the Plan are maintained on an accrual basis.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value except for a group annuity contract with the Custodian, which is stated at contract value, as further discussed in Note 5. The change in the difference between fair value and the cost of investments, along with the difference between the proceeds received and the cost of the investments sold, is reflected in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits as net appreciation.

Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis.

Fair Value Measurements

Fair value estimates are made at a specific point in time based on relevant market information about the financial instrument. These estimates are subjective in nature and involve uncertainties and matters of significant judgement and, therefore, cannot be determined with precision. Changes in assumptions could significantly affect the estimates.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United State of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and the accompanying notes. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Administrative Fees

A portion of the administrative fees are paid by the Plan. Other administrative fees, including legal and professional fees, are paid by the Plan Sponsor.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 26, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are held by the Custodian. Financial information relating to the Plan's assets is included in the accompanying financial statements based on information provided by the Custodian. Fair value is a market-based measurement that is determined based on assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability. As a basis for considering such assumptions, the Plan uses a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value as follows:

- Level 1 - Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets:
- Level 2 - Inputs, other than the quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3 - Unobservable inputs in which there is little or no market data, which require the reporting entity to develop its own assumptions

The classification of fair value measurements within the hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the measurement. The valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value is as follows:

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the net asset value of the underlying investments held by each separate account, which are actively traded.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of the net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the valuation methods.

NOTE 5 - GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan invests in a fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract with the Custodian totaling \$803,352 and \$583,157 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Custodian maintains the contributions in a general account and is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another), bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of not occurring. The group annuity contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

It is the Plan's intention to be organized and operated as tax-exempt under the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The IRS recently implemented a determination letter program for 403(b) plans, and the Plan Administrator intends to evaluate whether it will be necessary to apply for a determination. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan administrator is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that might adversely affect the Plan's qualified status and believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not indicated any intention to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth by ERISA.

NOTE 8 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions include the purchases and sales of investments through the Plan's Custodian and the payment of services and expenses. There are also indirect fees deducted directly from investment earnings of the Plan.
