## Independent Auditor's Report

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Home Federal Savings Bank 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits in liquidation as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits in liquidation for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Emphasis of Matter – Plan Termination and Liquidation Basis of Accounting**

As further discussed in Note 2 and Note 8 to the financial statements, the Board of Directors of Home Federal Savings Bank 401(k) Retirement Plan approved a plan of liquidation in October 2024 and management determined liquidation is imminent. As a result, Home Federal Savings Bank 401(k) Retirement Plan changed its basis of accounting from the going-concern basis of accounting used in presenting the 2023 financial statements to the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the 2024 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. ## **Note 1 - Description of Plan**

The following brief description of the Home Federal Savings Bank 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

### **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering employees of Home Federal Savings Bank (the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan.

The Investment Advisory Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

### **Eligibility**

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan if they have completed 30 days of employment and are 18 years of age. Leased employees, employees who become employees as the result of a Code 410(b)(6)(c) transaction, temporary employees and seasonal employees are not eligible to participate in the Plan.

### **Entry Dates**

Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date they satisfy the Plan's eligibility requirements.

### **Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum amount as defined by the law of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to designate contributions as Roth contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The Company contributes a matching contribution of 25% of salary deferrals up to 8% of a participant's compensation.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation. Their contributions are invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. This amount shall be increased as of the first day of each Plan year by 1% of compensation per year up to a maximum of 12%.

### **Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant's compensation, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### **Investment Options**

Upon enrollment to the Plan, a participant may direct deferrals and employer contributions in any of the funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

### **Vesting**

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Prior to Termination Date, vesting in the Company's matching contribution and related earnings thereon was based on years of continuous service. A participant was 100% vested after 3 years of credited service. Participants are 100% vested in their account balances upon reaching normal retirement age, death or disability. Effective as of the Termination Date, all participants are 100% vested.

### **Forfeitures**

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$5,492, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer match obligations or offset plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$5,570 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The note interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at the Wall Street Journal prime rate at the time funds are borrowed. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years, unless the proceeds of the note were used to acquire the participant's residence, in which case the note will be 15 years. A participant may have no more than two outstanding notes at any one time.

### **Payment of Benefits**

Participants may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their vested interest or annual installments as defined in the Plan document upon retirement, termination of service, death, or disability. A terminated participant with a balance of less than \$1,000 may be automatically paid out by the Plan upon termination. Any terminated participants with a balance between \$1,000 and \$5,000 can still be automatically paid out if their balance is rolled into a qualified Individual Retirement Account. Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan adopted provisions related to Secure Act 2.0 and increased the threshold to \$7,000 for automatic payouts upon termination. Distributions may be made at the participant's election prior to termination upon attainment of age 59½ or hardship as defined in the Plan document.

## **Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies**

### **Basis of Accounting**

As noted above, effective as of October 2024, the Plan sponsor elected to terminate the Plan. The Plan was terminated as a standard termination and the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the ongoing plan basis, used in presenting the December 31, 2023 financial statements, to the liquidation basis used in presenting the December 31, 2024 financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). The liquidation basis of accounting is a basis of accounting under GAAP for terminating plans. Under the liquidation basis of accounting, the Plan is required to measure assets to reflect the estimated amount of cash or other consideration expected to be collected in settling or disposing of those assets in carrying out the liquidation plan, accrue income that it expects to earn through the end of its liquidation when there is a reasonable basis for estimation and accrue costs it expects to incur when selling assets.

### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Investment Advisory Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians, and other third parties. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

The classification of investment earnings reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefit may differ from the classification of earnings on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

### **Contributions**

Participant contributions and the related Company matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

### Payments of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution. Amounts allocated to accounts of persons who have elected to withdraw from the Plan, but have not yet been paid, were \$291,566 and \$0 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

### Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

### Reclassifications

Certain amounts from the prior year financial statements have been reclassified for comparative purposes to conform to the presentation in the current year financial statements.

### Subsequent Events

The Plan sponsor has evaluated subsequent events through October 1st, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

### Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds (including money market mutual funds) - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Fund - Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units held of the collective fund. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying investments within the fund less liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

**Note 4 - Certified Information**

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Matrix Trust Company (the trustee of the Plan).

**Note 5 - Tax Status**

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by OneAmerica Financial Partners Inc., which received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated August 19, 2020, stating that the pre-approved document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 6 - Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

**Note 7 - Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or global conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**Note 8 - Plan Termination**

As detailed in Note 2, the Plan sponsor adopted a provision to terminate the Plan in October 2024. Plan assets are to be distributed as soon as administratively feasible and Plan participants had to elect either to have their single sum distribution paid to them or to an eligible retirement plan in a direct rollover. Participants became 100% vested in the Company's matching contributions and earnings thereon.
