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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Administrator of

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules of Schedule H, Line 4a – Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 and Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the NCLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement, which is available to all participants upon request, for a more comprehensive description of the Plan’s provisions.

NCL (Bahamas) Ltd. (“Norwegian” or the “Company”) is the Plan’s sponsor and as such is responsible for administering the Plan.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all US Shoreside employees of NCL (Bahamas) Ltd., NCL Corporation Ltd., Sixthman Ltd., and Prestige Cruise Services, LLC, and shipboard non-union Pride of America Ship Holding, LLC, Norwegian USCRA Ltd., and eligible employees of Seven Seas Cruises Ltd. and Oceania Cruises, Ltd. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (“IRC”).

The Trustee for the Plan is Fidelity Management Trust Company, FMTC. The Plan Administrator has arranged with Fidelity Investments to perform the primary administrative, recordkeeping and asset management functions on behalf of the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2023, the Plan was amended to adopt an automatic escalation feature. In accordance with the Plan’s election, participants’ deferral amounts will be automatically increased by 1% annually, with a maximum contribution percentage of 10%. Participants have the ability to modify increased contributions from the automatic escalation feature. Shipboard employees are excluded from the Plan’s automatic escalation provisions.

In September 2023, a settlement was reached in the class action lawsuit against NCL Corporation Ltd. and the Plan Sponsor (the “Settlement Agreement”). The class action lawsuit involved whether NCL Corporation Ltd. and the Plan Sponsor (collectively “NCL”) complied with its fiduciary duties under ERISA in managing the Plan. NCL denied any wrongdoing, but agreed to settle this case to avoid the expense, inconvenience, and disruption of class-action litigation. The settlement class includes all persons who participated in the Plan at any time from September 16, 2016, through March 31, 2023 (the “Settlement Class Period”), including any beneficiary of a deceased person who participated in the Plan at any time during the Settlement Class Period, and any alternate payee of a person subject to a qualified domestic relations order who participated in the Plan at any time during the Settlement Class Period (the “Settlement Class”). Certain individuals are excluded from the Settlement Class pursuant to the Settlement Agreement. NCL agreed to pay \$615,000 into a settlement fund. Members of the Settlement Class are eligible to receive a pro rata share of the settlement amount remaining after payment of notice and administrative expenses, taxes, attorneys’ fees and expenses that are awarded to class counsel. The amount of each Settlement Class member’s payment is based on his or her average account balance in the Plan during the Settlement Class Period, as defined in the Settlement Agreement. All accounts were funded in September 2024, and the balance of the fund is now zero.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon completing three months of service and attainment of age 18.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute, subject to certain limitations, up to 100% of their compensation for each pay period. For any calendar year, a participant’s elective contributions may not exceed a specific dollar amount, established at \$23,000 for 2024 as determined by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”). Individuals who attain age 50 by the end of the Plan year may make additional pre-tax “catch-up” contributions of up to \$7,500 for the 2024 Plan year.

The Company, at its discretion, makes matching contributions to the Plan and has the ability to decide each year how much to make as a matching contribution. The matching contribution is determined as a percentage of salary deferrals the participating employees make during the Plan Year. The Company contributes an amount equal to 100% of the participants' eligible contributions of the first 3% and 50% of the participants' eligible contributions greater than 3% up to 10%. For the Plan year 2024, the employer match was limited to \$5,000. In addition, the Company may make discretionary supplemental contributions to the Plan, which shall be allocated to each eligible participant on a pro-rata basis based on the compensation of the participant to the total compensation of all participants.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service or disability, retirement or death, the Plan participant or the participant's beneficiary can elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the portion of the funds applicable to such participant or an annuity contract of equivalent value. A terminated participant with an account balance of \$1,000 or less will automatically receive a lump-sum distribution. A participant may also receive a distribution if they experience undue financial hardship as defined by the IRC. Benefits provided by the Plan are paid from net assets available for benefits in the participants' individual investment portfolios.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contribution and the Plan's earnings or losses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are vested in the Company's matching and discretionary supplemental contribution portions of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon based on years of continuous service as follows:

Years of Vesting Service	Vested Portion of Account
Less than 2	0%
2 but less than 3	25%
3 but less than 4	50%
4 but less than 5	75%
5 or more	100%

Notes Receivable from Participants

Except for the CARES Act provisions, participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years or up to ten years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the date the loan was first established, at the prime lending rate plus one percent. The interest rate on notes receivable from participants outstanding at December 31, 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest payments are due ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Forfeited Accounts and Unallocated Assets

The non-vested portion of fund assets allocated to a participant's account is forfeited upon termination of employment. Forfeitures of the non-vested account balances of participants are retained by the Plan and used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts held in the Plan totaled \$135,414 and \$590,867, respectively. During 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$1,131,869 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

The Plan participates in a Revenue Credit Program which provides income in situations where recordkeeping revenue earned in connection with Plan services exceeds agreed-upon compensation. Fidelity will deposit any excess revenue, regardless of source, in a plan-level suspense account (Revenue Credit Account) in the Plan. The Plan Administrator can then direct Fidelity to pay the qualified plan-level expenses or allocate unused credit to eligible participants via funds from the Revenue Credit Account. At

December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance in the Revenue Credit Account was \$374,288 and \$243,538, respectively.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting and reflect management's estimates and assumptions, such as those regarding fair values that affect the recorded amounts.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions in net assets available for benefits. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for its fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is stated at contract value. Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are measured at contract value because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the contract. The financial statements include the fully benefit-responsive investment contract and its related activity at contract value. There were no fully benefit-responsive contracts as of December 31, 2024.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are stated at the outstanding principal balance of the loan plus any accrued interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Administrative Expenses

Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and payment of benefits are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Audit, recordkeeping, and investment advisory fees were paid by the Plan and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of the available mutual funds, investment contracts, common stocks, and money market funds. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Financial instruments which potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit risk consist of shares of mutual funds in which the Plan directly invests. Such credit risk is considered by management to be limited due to the large number of companies in which the mutual funds hold stocks or other financial instruments, their financial stability, and their dispersion both in geography and industry.

Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is defined as the price at which an orderly transaction to sell the asset or to transfer the liability would take place between market participants at the measurement date under current market conditions (that is, an exit price at the measurement date from the perspective of a market participant that holds the asset or owes the liability).

The following hierarchy for inputs used in measuring fair value should maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs by requiring that the most observable inputs be used when available:

An asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Registered investment companies: Valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of the shares held by the Plan as of year-end.

Pooled separate accounts: The fair value of the Plan's investment in pooled separate accounts is based on unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the fund for identical assets or liabilities, which primarily include certain cash equivalents and equity securities that trade on an active exchange market. The Plan's investment in these accounts is represented by units and a per unit value.

Self-directed brokerage account: Accounts primarily consist of common stocks, mutual funds, and money market funds. The common stocks and mutual funds are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices. The money market funds are stated at cost, which approximates fair value.

Common collective trusts: Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") provided by the administrator of the fund. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, divided by the number of units outstanding.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Common collective trusts consist of the SIA Target Date Funds, which invest in T. Rowe Price Retirement Trust Funds. The investment strategy of the SIA Target Date Funds is to invest in a separately managed target date strategy, designed for investors retiring on or around the year of the target date fund.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Prudential Guaranteed Income Fund (“GIF”) is a group annuity insurance contract issued by Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (“PRIAC”) and is backed by the full faith and creditworthiness of the issuer.

Under the group annuity insurance contract that supports this product, participants may ordinarily direct permitted withdrawals or transfers of all or a portion of their account balance at contract value within reasonable timeframes. Contract value represents deposits made to the contract, plus earnings at guaranteed crediting rates, less withdrawals and fees. The GIF is a traditional guaranteed investment contract (“GIC”) and deemed to be fully benefit-responsive. Since the GIF is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement. Contract value, as reported by PRIAC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative fees.

Generally, there are not any events that could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value paid with 90 days notice or contract value paid over time. There are not any events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract and which require the Plan to settle at an amount different than contract value paid either with 90 days notice or over time.

Interest is credited on contract balances using a single “portfolio rate” approach. Under this methodology, a single interest crediting rate is applied to all contributions made to the product regardless of the timing of those contributions. Credited interest rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The minimum credited interest rate under the contract is 1.50%.

There were no fully benefit-responsive investment contracts as of December 31, 2024.

6. Tax Status of the Plan

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and trust established under the Plan is tax-exempt under the appropriate sections of the IRC. Subsequent to this determination by the IRS, the Plan was amended. Plan management believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC to maintain its tax-exempt qualification.

Plan management evaluates uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no income tax examinations for any tax periods in progress. Plan management believes it is no longer subject to income tax examination for years prior to 2021.

7. Plan Termination

While the Company has not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan, it reserves the right at any time to amend, modify or terminate the Plan without the consent of any participant or beneficiary. In the event of such termination, the Plan provides that the participants shall become 100% vested in their accounts, including all matching employer contributions and actual earnings thereon.

8. Certified Financial Data

Information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and dividends, net appreciation in fair value of investments, and interest income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company (FMTC), the Plan's trustee, and Fidelity Workplace Services LLC, the Plan's recordkeeper and a party-in-interest to the Plan's trustee.

The trustee and recordkeeper certified all investments at fair value.

9. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Fidelity 500 Index Institutional Premium, the Fidelity Blue Chip Growth Fund, the Fidelity Emerging Markets Fund, and the Fidelity Government Money Market Fund Class K6, are Registered Investment Companies managed by Fidelity Investments, a party-in-interest to the Plan's trustee, Fidelity Management Trust Company, FMTC. The value of each of these accounts are net of Fidelity Investments' annual management fee, asset charge, any taxes or charges resulting from the purchase or sale of an account's investments or otherwise attributable to an account's operation or assets, and any expenses that are reasonably necessary or required to preserve or enhance the value of an account's assets. In addition, there are notes receivable from the participants which qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

10. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 29, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective January 1, 2025, the employer matching contributions will be limited to \$7,000.

Effective July 24, 2025, the investment options Hartford Schrodgers International Stock Fund Class SDR, and Janus Henderson Enterprise Fund Class I were added to the investment lineup.

Effective July 24, 2025, the investment options Artisan Mid Cap Fund Investor Class and Oakmark International Fund Investor Class were removed from the investment lineup.
