Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation



and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Hamcor, Inc. 401(k) Plan (“the Plan”) only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan is defined contribution plan established on January 1, 1999 by Hamcor, Inc. dba Dublin Toyota (“the Company” or “Plan Administrator”) covering all eligible employees of the Company and participating employers, as defined in the Plan agreement. Certain classes of employees as defined in the Plan agreement are excluded from plan participation. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

A Plan Committee (“the Committee”) manages the operation and administration of the Plan, including the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and investment performance. The Company has contracted with Empower Trust Company, LLC to act as trustee and custodian, and with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (collectively referred to as “Empower”) to hold the assets of the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund (“KGPF”). Empower Retirement, LLC acts as record-keeper to process and maintain the records of participant data. A third-party administrator (“TPA”) provides certain plan services.

The provisions of SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 SECURE Act. Certain provisions of both Acts have been implemented by the Plan and the Plan Administrator will continue to determine provisions which will impact the operation of the Plan. Participants should refer to plan documents for any changes made to the Plan.

Contribution – Each year, participants may contribute an amount of eligible pre-tax annual compensation as defined in the Plan agreement, not to exceed the maximum statutory amount. The Plan allows for ROTH deferral contributions. Participants who are age 50 or older can elect to make catch-up contributions to the Plan, not to exceed the maximum statutory amount. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified eligible plans. The Plan allows for In-Plan ROTH conversions subject to certain limitations and in accordance with Plan provisions.

The Plan allows for an employer discretionary matching contribution subject to certain eligibility requirements. In 2024 and 2023, the Company made discretionary matching contributions equal to 10% of a participant’s salary deferrals excluding catch-up contributions up to an annual maximum amount of \$2,050. The

discretionary matching contribution for 2024 was \$94,716 of which \$228 was a receivable as of December 31, 2024 and was paid in 2025. The discretionary matching contribution for 2023 was \$85,451 of which \$71 was a receivable as of December 31, 2023 and was paid in 2024. The Plan also allows for an employer discretionary nonelective contribution subject to certain eligibility requirements; none was made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's discretionary matching contribution, discretionary nonelective contribution (if any), plan earnings and losses, and plan expenses as applicable to the Plan. Allocations of the discretionary nonelective contribution are based on participant compensation. of plan earnings and losses are based on individual participant investment choices. All contributions/investments are participant directed. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting – Participants are 100% vested in their contributions and rollover amounts plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the discretionary matching contribution and discretionary nonelective contribution and earnings is based on years of credited service at the rate of 25% per year after the first year and are fully vested after four years. Participants become fully vested in the event of disability, death, retirement age, or plan termination.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. Outstanding notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 carry interest rates which range from 3.25% to 8.50%. Principal and interest is paid per the terms of the note and in accordance with plan provisions. The Plan Administrator establishes the specific terms and conditions of such notes.

Payment of Benefits – Upon the satisfaction of certain distributable events, participants or their beneficiaries may elect to receive their vested account balance and are paid in accordance with plan provisions.

Forfeited Accounts – Forfeited accounts can be used to pay plan expenses or reduce employer contributions or reallocated to eligible participants.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investments which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by Empower. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions – Contributions from plan participants and employer matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Excess Contributions Payable – Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") are recorded as a liability. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, excess contributions payable represents amounts due to certain participants to pass certain non-discrimination tests. These amounts were refunded to impacted participants in 2025 and 2024, respectively.

Plan Expenses – In 2024, some plan fees were paid by the Company and these amounts are excluded from the Plan's financial statements. TPA fees, investment/fund fees, record-keeping fees, and certain participant transaction fees are paid by the Plan and charged to participant accounts as applicable. The Plan maintains a Plan Expense Account which is funded by excess revenue sharing amounts (fees generated by charging applicable participants). These amounts can be used to pay plan expenses or allocated back as earnings to participants. In 2024, investment advisory fees were paid by the Plan through the Plan Expense Account.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 3, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 4 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA required supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, interest, dividends, net appreciation in fair value of investments, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower.

NOTE 5 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 6 – FIXED ANNUITY

The Plan entered into a fixed annuity contract for the KGPF with Empower which maintains the contributions in a general account. Interest is earned and compounded daily to the effective annual interest rate as determined by Empower. Because the KGPF is considered fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the KGPF. Contract value approximates fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

For the KGPF, there are no unfunded commitments and the units can be redeemed daily. Either party to the Group Annuity Contract may terminate the contract with at least 60 days advance written notice to the other party. Certain events as described in the contract limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. At this time, no events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Empower or with participants. There are no reserves against contract value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 7 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST AND RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Plan investments are held by Empower. Any purchases and sales of these investments are performed in the open market at fair value or contract value. Plan related fees are paid by the Plan to Empower, Empower Retirement, LLC, an investment advisory firm, and the TPA. The Plan has other service providers. All these transactions while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTE 8 – PLAN TERMINATION AND/OR MODIFICATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 9 – TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan which received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the IRS. The Plan has been amended since, however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by various taxing authorities and government agencies. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 10 – NONEXEMPT TRANSACTIONS

During 2023, certain participant contributions in the amount of \$715 were not deposited with the custodian on a timely basis in accordance with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations, resulting in lost earnings of \$80 (prohibited transaction amount) which was deposited into the Plan by the Plan Sponsor in 2024.
