- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Saint Paul's Outreach Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.



Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institutions that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Note 1: Description of the Plan

This description of the Saint Paul's Outreach Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. The Plan documents should be referred to for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. A complete description of the Plan is available at St. Paul's Outreach, Inc. (the Company).

General

The Plan was established January 1, 2017, by the Company, and is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees ages 21 and older. The following classes of employees are excluded from participating in the Plan: union employees, leased employees and non-resident aliens. Employees are eligible if they are at least 21 years of age and have completed at least 1 year of service with a minimum of 1,000 hours worked. The Plan allows eligible employees to become participants on the first day of the month following the date the eligibility requirements are met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). In November 2023, the Company appointed Mid Atlantic Trust Company as Trustee of the Plan and Paychex as recordkeeper. At that time, the name of the Plan was also changed to Saint Paul's Outreach Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust. Principal Trust Company also served as a trustee over certain Plan assets until they were transferred to Mid Atlantic Trust Company on January 30, 2024. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Executive Team.

Prior to the transfer of the assets from Principal Trust Company to Mid Atlantic Trust on January 30, 2024, the Plan was funded primarily through a group annuity contract, which offered a variety of investments to Plan participants including mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and a general account. Subsequent to January 30, 2024, the Plan offers a variety of mutual funds.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute up to 92 percent of their eligible compensation, as defined by the Plan and subject to various regulatory limitations, through a salary reduction agreement. Contributions may be made on either a pre-tax basis or after-tax basis (through Roth contributions). Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are also eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans, otherwise known as rollover contributions. Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Each pay period, the Company offers a safe harbor match on participant deferral contributions dollar-for-dollar, up to a maximum of 4 percent of eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan document. During 2024, the Company contributed \$236,050 of safe harbor matching contributions.

There were no discretionary profit sharing contributions made by the Company for the year ended December 31, 2024.

All contributions are subject to certain statutory limits.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, and an allocation of (a) employer safe harbor matching contributions, (b) investment earnings, (c) changes in market values, and (d) certain Plan expenses. Investment earnings and changes in market values are allocated daily based on the number of units in the participant's account. Plan expenses are allocated either directly to a participant's account for certain transactions affecting only the participant, or proportionally to all participants for certain administrative expenses charged to the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting and Forfeitures

Participants are immediately 100 percent vested in their salary deferrals, safe harbor matching contributions and rollover contributions. Discretionary profit sharing contributions, if any, are subject to a vesting schedule, with contributions being 100% vested after 6 years of service. Participants also become fully vested in profit sharing contributions upon death, disability, or upon reaching normal retirement age as defined by the Plan. There were no forfeitures at December 31, 2024 or 2023, and no forfeitures used during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000. Loans are treated as a directed investment and are available upon request. Loan terms may not exceed five years, except for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the repayment period may not extend beyond 10 years from the date of the loan. The loans are secured by the participant's account and currently bear an interest rate of 9.50 percent, which was determined by the Plan Administrator after reviewing interest rates charged for similar types of loans by other lenders. The outstanding loan matures in July 2027. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions to terminated, disabled, or retired participants (or in the case of death, the participant's beneficiary) are made in the form the participant chooses in the amount equal to the value of his or her vested account. Normal retirement age is 65. Participants are also allowed to take in-service distributions beginning at age 59 ½. When a participant separates from service, a forced payout will be made for account balances less than \$7,000.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Investment contracts with insurance companies held by the Plan are reported at contract value (see Note 4).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Note Receivable from Participant

Note receivable from participant is measured at its unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided in the Plan document. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain fees incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan are included as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 25, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. See Note 10, SECURE 2.0.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used to measure assets at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end, which is a publicly quoted price.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at net asset value (NAV) which is based on the market value of its underlying investments (i.e. common stock, mutual funds, short term securities). While the majority of the underlying asset values are quoted prices, the NAV of the pooled separate accounts is not publicly quoted and is determined by the insurance company. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the separate accounts, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date.

Note 4: Investment Contract with Insurance Company (Continued)

The Plan held a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Trust Company totaling \$1,350 as of December 31, 2023. Principal Trust Company maintained the contributions in a general account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specific interest rate that was guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate was based on a formula established by the contract issuer and was 1.55% at December 31, 2023. The crediting rate was reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract did permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract met the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore was reported at contract value. Contract value was the relevant measure for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this was the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represented contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants could ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. There were no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise, and there were no limitations of guarantees on the contract.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due was dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may have been affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events included (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events occurred that limited the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers or that limited the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allowed the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer. The Contract was terminated when the assets were transferred to Mid Atlantic Trust Company on January 30, 2024.

Note 5: Income Tax Status

The Plan sponsor adopted a prototype plan from Paychex in November 2023. The Internal Revenue Service determined, by a letter dated August 31, 2020, on the Paychex Inc. pre-approved money purchase/profit sharing plan, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, therefore, are not subject to tax under present income tax law. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. Plan management is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that might adversely affect the Plan's qualified status. The Plan and prototype plan have been amended since receiving the letter. The Principal pre-approved profit sharing plan with CODA that was in place prior to November 2023 received a similar opinion letter dated June 30, 2020.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the appropriate regulatory authorities. The Plan Administrator has analyzed tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Generally, the statute of limitations for the IRS to assess taxes on a plan expires three years from the date of the return or the date on which it was filed, whichever is later.

Note 6: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits, and accordingly, account balances of participants in the Plan.

Note 7: Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA required supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and appreciation in fair value of investments and dividends and interest, for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company as of December 31, 2023 and for the period January 1, 2024 through February 3, 2024 and Mid Atlantic Trust Company as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 (the trustees of the Plan).

Note 8: Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

A related party is any party who can control or significantly influence Plan management or operating policies. Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any employees of the Plan, fiduciaries of the Plan, service providers to the Plan, the employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, and certain significant owners of the employer and their relatives. Service providers may include, but are not limited to, the custodian, trustee, third-party administrator (TPA), investment managers, investment advisors, legal counsel, and Plan auditor.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan made direct payments of \$27,581 to certain parties-in-interest for administration and investment advisory fees, as allowed by ERISA. The Plan sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the operation of the Plan.

Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments, as they are paid using investment earnings rather than a direct payment.

Note 9: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, all participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

Note 10: SECURE 2.0

In December 2022, Securing a Strong Retirement Act (SECURE 2.0) was passed into law. The provisions of SECURE 2.0 continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 CARES Act. The effective date of the provisions of SECURE 2.0 vary from becoming effective immediately through 2028. Those provisions include both required and optional elements.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the plan implemented the following optional and required provisions set forth by the SECURE 2.0 Act on an operational basis:

- Increase in Cash-Out Limit – Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan increased the threshold for involuntary cashouts from \$5,000 to \$7,000 in accordance with Section 304.
- Emergency Expense Withdrawals – Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan allowed one penalty-free withdrawal of up to \$1,000 per year for emergency personal expenses in accordance with Section 115.

Subsequent to the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan has implemented the following provision set forth by the SECURE 2.0 Act on an operational basis:

- Age 60 – 63 Catch-up Contribution Increase – Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan implemented higher catch-up limits for participants aged 60 to 63 as permitted under Section 109.

Formal amendments reflecting these provisions have not been executed as of the date the financial statements were available to be issued. However, the Plan sponsor intends to make all necessary amendments by the applicable deadline in accordance with IRS Notice 2024-2.
