NOTE A - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Texas Scenic Co., Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The basis of investments held by the Plan is adjusted daily to closing market value and unrealized gains and losses are recorded as part of this adjustment. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by investment advisers and the custodian.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Participants' Notes Receivable: Participants' notes receivable are stated at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued interest. Interest is recognized as accrued. An allowance was not required at either year end. Note terms generally range from one to five years. If a participant ceases to make a loan payment and the Plan Administrator deems the participant note to be in default, the loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment to the participant is recorded.

Benefit Payments: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Concentration of Credit Risk: Concentration of credit risk with respect to mutual funds is reduced as a result of the diversity of the underlying investments.

Subsequent Events: Subsequent events have been evaluated by management through the date of the independent auditor's report which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Material subsequent events, if any, are disclosed in a separate footnote to these financial statements.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U. S. generally accepted accounting principles requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

NOTE B - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Texas Scenic Co., Inc. (the Plan Sponsor) who have one year of service. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions: Each year participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of pretax and after-tax annual compensation, subject to IRS limitations, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have reached age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions to various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 2% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Participant deferral rates increase 1% annually until their deferral rate reaches 10%, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the automatic deferral increase. The Plan Sponsor matches 25% of compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan, with the matching contribution limited to 3% of participant's compensation, as defined. Additional profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Sponsor's Board of Directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Plan Sponsor's contributions and (b) Plan earnings and (c) charged with an allocation of investment-related expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant contributions or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus earnings thereon. Upon completion of two full years of service, vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their account balance is at 20%, increasing by 20% each year until after six years of service when the participants' account balance becomes fully vested. If a participant terminates due to death, disability, or normal retirement, the participant becomes 100% vested in the account balance.

Benefits: Benefits are paid in a lump sum. The participant or beneficiary is entitled to a benefit equal to the vested balance and non-forfeitable interest in their account as of the distribution date.

Forfeitures: The forfeiture balance was \$9,648 at December 31, 2024 and \$0 at December 31, 2023. The Plan allows for the forfeiture balance to reduce future employer contributions and pay the expenses of the Plan.

Termination of Plan: Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested.

Participant Loans: Participant loans are available to all eligible actively employed participants. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are collateralized by the vested balance in the participant's account, and bear interest between 3.25% and 8.50%. Principal and interest are repaid through salary reductions each pay period according to an amortization schedule based on the life of the note.

NOTE C – INVESTMENTS CERTIFIED BY THIRD PARTY (unaudited)

As permitted by Department of Labor CFR 2520.103-8, investments and participants' notes receivable at December 31, 2024 and the related investment earnings and interest on participants' notes for the year then ended, were certified and held by Empower Retirement, LLC, the Trustee, and were not audited by the independent auditor. Investments and participants' notes receivable at December 31, 2023 and the related investment earnings and interest on participants' notes for the year then ended were certified and held by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee, and were not audited by the independent auditor.

NOTE D – TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Plan Sponsor as allowed by the Plan document. Expenses paid directly by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE E – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has ruled that the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is not subject to tax. The Plan has been amended since its determination; however, the Plan's administrator believes it is operating in accordance with applicable IRC regulations.

Management is not aware of any tax positions that would have a significant impact on its financial position. Its federal tax returns for the last four years remain subject to examination.

NOTE F – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

In accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, the Plan utilizes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs for the valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
 - quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
 - inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
 - inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means
 - if the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability
- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probably that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan were to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the collective trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE H – ASSET CONVERSION IN TRANSIT

At December 31, 2023, the Plan Sponsor discontinued its investment holdings at Fidelity, the Custodian of the Plan throughout 2023, and transferred those investments to Empower Retirement, LLC. Due to timing differences, the funds were in transit at December 31, 2023 and are reported as an asset conversion in transit to Empower Retirement in the statement of net assets available for benefits. The conversion to Empower Retirement was completed on January 2, 2024.

The asset conversion in transit balance is not considered to be an investment measured at fair value, and accordingly, is not included in the Fair Value Measurements footnote at Note F.

NOTE I – NONEXEMPT TRANSACTIONS

The Plan Sponsor did not timely remit several contributions totaling \$19,483 in 2024 and \$34,376 during 2023, as outlined in the supplemental Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions. The Plan Sponsor took corrective action and remitted lost earnings on the 2024 late remittances in September 2025 and on the 2023 late remittances in February 2024.

NOTE J – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
