Independent Auditors' Report

To the Participants and Trustees of
Pet Food Experts, Inc. 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Pet Food Experts, Inc. 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Pet Food Experts, Inc. 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Pet Food Experts, Inc. 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Pet Food Experts, Inc. 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Pet Food Experts, Inc. 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of Pet Food Experts, Inc., PFXCA LLC and RPC, Inc. (collectively, the Company). The Plan was amended on January 1, 2023, to merge and transfer plan assets of PFXCA LLC Retirement Plan into the Pet Food Experts, LLC 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan. Also, on May 15, 2023, employees of RPC, Inc. were spun off into their own plan.

For non-union employees, eligibility requirements for participant elective deferrals require the employee to be at least 18 years old and have completed 90 days of service. Further eligibility requirements for non-union employer contributions require that an employee complete one year of service. For union employees, eligibility requirements for participant elective deferrals and union employer contributions require that an employee complete one calendar quarter of service. Any employee working at least 500 hours of service during each of the three consecutive 12-month periods (Long-Term Part-Time "LTPT Employee") becomes a participant eligible to make elective deferrals if he or she is an eligible employee and has attained the applicable age requirement on such date. Each 12-month period for which an LTPT Employee has at least 500 hours of service is treated as a year of service for vesting purposes. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Plan Administration

The Company is the Plan Administrator. As Plan Administrator, the Company has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in conjunction with the operations and administration of the Plan. An employee of the Company serves as the trustee to the Plan. Hand Benefits & Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan with administration and recordkeeping performed by BPAS Plan Administration and Recordkeeping Services.

Employer Contributions

The Company will make safe-harbor matching contributions to the eligible non-union participants in the Plan in an amount equal to 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan, and 50% of each participant's eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan in excess of 3% but not in excess of 5% of the participant's compensation. Employer safe-harbor matching contributions are made weekly.

The Company will also make a nonelective employer contributions (union contribution) to eligible union employees equal to a uniform rate per hour worked, which increases periodically as outlined in the collective bargaining agreement. The collective bargaining agreement expires on November 30, 2026. Union contributions are made weekly.

The Company may also elect to contribute an additional discretionary match to eligible non-union participants in the Plan. There were no discretionary matching contributions made during 2024 or 2023.

The Company also may elect to contribute a discretionary non-elective contribution to eligible non-union participants as determined by the Company's Board of Directors. Employer discretionary contributions are allocated to the accounts of the individual who are participants in the Plan on the last day of the Plan year for which such contributions are made and who meet the eligibility requirements as defined. No such contributions were made during 2024 or 2023.

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Employee Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, not to exceed \$23,000 and \$22,500 in 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The maximum catch-up contribution is \$7,500 and \$7,500 in 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other eligible retirement plans. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 2% of eligible compensation. The Plan also includes an automatic escalation feature whereby eligible participants will have their default 2% deferral of base pay increase 1% each year until the participant is contributing 5%, unless the participant elects otherwise.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions, and (b) Plan earnings less expenses. Employer discretionary contributions are allocated based on the annual wages and years of service of all eligible participating employees. The allocation of earnings and losses is performed based on individual participant account balances. The benefit to which the participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, employer safe harbor contribution and union contribution plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become fully vested in the employer discretionary contributions and the annual allocation of Plan earnings on those contributions as follows: 20% after 2 years, 40% after 3 years, 60% after 4 years, 80% after 5 years and 100% after 6 years.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be used to pay Plan expenses or to reduce any employer contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company used \$-0- of forfeitures to reduce employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were forfeited balances totaling \$60 and \$17, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Note terms range from one to five years, or up to 25 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes are secured by the participant's vested interest in his account and bear interest at 1% above the prime interest rate. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any time.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to retirement, death, disability or termination of service, a participant may receive the value of his or her vested account in a lump-sum amount or substantially equal installments. Alternatively, the participant may elect to defer the distribution. If a participant's vested balance exceeds \$200 and equal to or less than \$5,000, the amount will be rolled over to an individual retirement account designated by the Company, unless otherwise directed by the participant.

Hardship withdrawals from the Plan are permitted, subject to limitation imposed by the IRC.

The Plan also permits qualified birth or adoption distributions, whereby a participant may receive a distribution up to \$5,000 during the 1-year period beginning on the date on which the participant's child is born or on which the legal adoption by the participant of an eligible adoptee is finalized.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Interest income is recorded when it is earned. A receivable is considered past due if payment has not been received within stated terms. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distribution based on terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment management and recordkeeping expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Hand Benefits & Trust Company (the custodian of the Plan). This information has not been audited by the Plan's independent auditors. The certified information at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the years then ended includes:

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities the Plan can access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Trust Fund

Valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by Hand Benefits & Trust Company, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of its underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the trust reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawals in order to ensure that liquidations of securities will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Unit values are determined by dividing the fund's net assets at fair value by its units outstanding at the valuation dates.

6. Related-Party Transactions and Party in Interest Transactions

Plan investments are held and managed by Hand Benefits & Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. The Plan made direct payments to the custodian for administrative services totaling \$78,396 and \$67,771 for the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan also made direct payments to its investment advisor totaling \$84,772 and \$62,501 for the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participant notes receivable also qualify as party in interest transactions.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed the intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their account.

8. Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

The Plan's investments are held by a single custodian. The Plan's exposure to credit risk is associated with the custodian's non-performance of their fiduciary responsibilities relating to these amounts as specified in the agreements. Benefits provided by the Plan are not insured or guaranteed by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

10. Transfers

Effective January 1, 2023, assets totaling \$6,878,461 of the PFXCA LLC Retirement Plan were transferred into the Plan.

Effective May 15, 2023, assets totaling \$269,751 from employees of RPC, Inc. were transferred out of the Plan.
