

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

WholeStone Farms Cooperative 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is a qualified retirement plan adopted by WholeStone Farms Cooperative, Inc. (the Cooperative) on December 3, 2018, to provide eligible employees with the opportunity to save for retirement on a tax-advantaged basis. The Plan was amended and restated effective January 1, 2023. The Plan is administered by the Cooperative and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The following provides only general information. Participants should refer to the terms of the legal plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Eligibility: Effective January 1, 2023, an employee of the Cooperative becomes eligible to defer employee elective salary deferrals on their first day of employment. An employee becomes eligible for the Cooperatives safe harbor matching contribution after the completion of 500 hours of service during their first six months of employment. Prior to January 1, 2023, all eligible employees of the Cooperative who had completed at least 500 hours of service during their first six months of employment could participate in the Plan. If a participant did not meet that requirement, a participant would satisfy the minimum service requirement once they had completed one year of service. Participants may enter the Plan after the first month coinciding with or next following the date they satisfy the eligibility requirements. Participants who were employees of Hormel Foods Cooperation (Hormel) and active on December 3, 2018 received credit for any service performed for the predecessor employer.

Contributions: Participants may elect to reduce their compensation by a specific percentage or dollar amount (up to 75% of Plan compensation during a Plan year) and have that amount contributed to the Plan as a salary deferral, not to exceed an annual dollar limit which is set by law. Salary deferrals may be designated as pre-tax and/or Roth deferrals. Participants who are or will attain age 50 before the end of a calendar year may also elect to defer additional catch-up contributions to the Plan. Participants may enter into a salary deferral reduction agreement at any time to defer at a different rate or elect not to defer under the Plan.

The Plan is referred to as a safe harbor 401(k) plan. In order to maintain safe harbor status, the Cooperative shall contribute for each Plan year a required contribution equal to 100% of participants' salary deferrals that do not exceed 6% of the participants' compensation.

The Cooperative may make a discretionary matching contribution on behalf of eligible Plan participants, as a percentage of salary deferrals participants' made during each payroll period or as a uniform dollar amount. During 2024, the Cooperative did not make a discretionary matching contribution.

Rollover contributions from other qualified retirement plans and certain IRAs may be permitted by the Plan.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's contributions and (b) Plan earnings and losses and is charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant contributions, eligible compensation, participant account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Each participant directs the investment of his or her account to any of the investment options available under the Plan.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Investment Options: Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, common collective trusts, a self-directed brokerage account, and a fixed interest fund as investment options for participants. For participants that held Hormel company stock in the Hormel Plan A, those investments are now held in a fund classified as a non-pooled separate account, the Hormel Stock 401k Frozen (Hormel Stock Fund). The Hormel Stock Fund is not an active investment option for participants and is frozen for future contributions. Participants may redirect future contributions or exchange existing balances among available investment securities at any time.

Vesting: Participants are always 100% vested in their salary deferrals, including catch-up contributions, rollover contributions, Cooperative discretionary matching contributions, and Cooperative safe harbor contributions.

Notes Receivable From Participants: Participants may borrow from their vested fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 reduced by the excess of their highest outstanding balance of loans during the prior one-year period or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. Participants may only have one outstanding loan at any time. The loans are adequately secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a reasonable rate of interest. Principal and interest payments are paid ratably through payroll deductions over a term not to exceed five years, unless the loan was obtained to acquire a principal residence.

Payment of Benefits: Upon termination of employment due to death, disability, or normal retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum payment equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account or installments over a period of assumed life expectancy. Upon termination of employment for reasons other than death, disability, or normal retirement, lump-sum distributions may be made at the participant's election. If a participant's total vested benefit exceeds \$5,000, no distribution will be made from the Plan without their consent. If a participant's total vested benefit is \$1,000 or less when they terminate employment, their entire vested benefit will be distributed to them in a lump-sum, even if the participant does not consent to a distribution.

Participants may be entitled to receive an in-service distribution. A participant may request a hardship withdrawal to satisfy certain immediate and heavy financial needs. Participants who have attained age 59½ may receive an in-service distribution from the Plan from fully vested accounts prior to termination of employment.

Retirement, Death, and Disability: A participant is entitled to 100% of his or her account balance upon retirement, death, or disability.

Plan Termination: Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, all participants become 100% vested. The Company will arrange for distributions upon Plan termination as soon as administratively feasible.

Administrative Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation.

Forfeited Accounts: Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce future employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited accounts totaled \$19,145 and \$24,480, respectively. There were no forfeitures used during 2024 to pay administrative expenses or to reduce employer contributions.

Subsequent Events: The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 1, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan will allow distribution of up to \$5,000 per child as a Qualified Birth or Adoption Distribution (QBAD).

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Cooperative to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosures, and actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments other than the fully benefit responsive contract are reported at fair value as described in Notes 4 and 5. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid by the Plan to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. The Cooperative determined the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. Contract value is the relevant measure of the Plan's fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount Plan participants generally receive when executing transactions under the term of the contract and Plan provisions.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participants' account balances. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties: The Plan holds various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity, credit, and risks resulting from global events. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 – CERTIFIED INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value measurements are determined by maximizing the use of observable inputs and minimizing the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy places the highest priority on unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and gives the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of inputs within the fair value hierarchy are defined as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan’s own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: The fair values of mutual fund investments are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges (Level 1).

Self-Directed Brokerage Account: Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchange (Level 1).

Non-Pooled Separate Account: The non-pooled separate account consists of common stock of Hormel, which is valued at the last reported sales price on the last business day of the year, and a portion on uninvested cash, which is reported at carrying values as maturities are less than three months. The fair value of Hormel common stock is determined by obtaining quoted prices from nationally recognized exchanged (Level 1).

Collective Trusts: The fair values of participation units held in collective trusts are based on the net asset values per unit as reported by the fund managers. The collective trusts provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net asset values per share, with no advance notice requirement.

NOTE 5 – GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan holds an investment in a fully benefit-responsive fixed interest fund (the Fund) with Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company (MassMutual) provided through a group annuity contract. Under the terms of the contract, a crediting rate is established for amounts invested in the Fund and participants may direct permitted withdrawal and/or transfer transactions of all or a portion of their account balance at contract value, which represents contributions plus credited interest less participant withdrawals and fees.

Because the Fund is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attributed for that portion of the net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by MassMutual, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value. Such events include, but may not be limited to, a participant termination of employment due to: (1) removal of a group of participants from Plan coverage as a result of temporary absence; (2) change in position or other occurrence qualifying as a temporary break in service under the Plan; (3) transfer or other change in position resulting from employment by an entity controlling, controlled by, or under other common control with the employer; or (4) cessation of an employment relationship resulting from a reorganization, merger, layoff or the sale, or discontinuance of all or any part of the Cooperative's business. Such events also include: (1) removal from the Plan of one or more groups or classifications of participants; (2) partial or complete Plan termination; or (3) Plan disqualification. The Cooperative does not believe that the occurrence of any such event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

NOTE 6 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor (DOL) regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Administrative fees paid to third party providers are considered parties in interest transactions. Certain professional fees for the administration and audit of the Plan paid by the Company. Various administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service issued an opinion letter dated November 14, 2022 indicating that the non-standardized profit-sharing plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended from the original non-standardized profit-sharing plan document, Plan management believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate the tax positions taken by the Plan. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.
