Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of the Massachusetts Audubon Society 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified by qualified institutions agree to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan’s transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan’s provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors’ report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on these financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Massachusetts Audubon Society 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a cash deferred 403(b) defined contribution plan sponsored by the Massachusetts Audubon Society, Inc. ("Mass Audubon") (the "Employer"). Employees are immediately eligible to make elective contributions in the Plan upon commencement of employment with Mass Audubon except for employees who work less than twenty hours per week and those who work less than 1,000 hours in an eligibility computation period ("Participants"). Mass Audubon is both the Plan Sponsor and plan administrator. The Plan's insurance companies are Metropolitan Life Insurance Company ("MetLife") and TIAA and CREF. Empower Retirement, LLC ("Empower") serves as the recordkeeper for MetLife. MetLife is the Plan's active custodian, with respect to the receipt of contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan offers investment choices to allow participants to create a diversified portfolio of assets based on a participant's risk tolerance. Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. All investments, except for notes receivable from participants, are participant directed.

Participants' Contributions

Participants may elect to defer a portion of their eligible compensation as contributions to the Plan subject to dollar limits set by Federal law. The Plan has an auto enroll feature whereby the Employer will withhold 4% of a participant's compensation unless an alternative election is made. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also make contributions representing distributions from other qualified plans ("rollovers").

Employer Contributions

Participants who have completed one year of service, defined as 1,000 hours of service during a twelve-month period, and have attained age 21, are eligible to participate in the Employer's safe harbor, non-elective, and matching contributions.

Employer Contributions (Continued)

Mass Audubon contributes a non-elective contribution and a safe harbor non-elective contribution for all eligible participants. The non-elective and safe harbor non-elective contributions are equal to 1% and 3%, respectively, of the eligible compensation of eligible participants. For the year ended December 31, 2024, in addition to the non-elective and safe harbor contributions, Mass Audubon elected to contribute a discretionary matching contribution based on elective deferrals up to 4% of compensation as follows:

<i>Years of Service</i>	<i>Rate</i>
1 but less than 4 years	25%
4 but less than 6 years	50%
6 or more years	100%

Participants' Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Employer contributions and Plan investment earnings and reduced by Plan investment losses, distributions, and applicable administrative expenses and investment management fees. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in all contributions and related earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits

Participants are entitled to their total vested account balance upon death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment. A participant may elect to receive a lump-sum or installment payment, a life or joint and survivor annuity, or any other withdrawal or annuity option that is available under the applicable funding vehicle. In-service withdrawals from a participant's vested balances are permitted upon reaching age 59½ or due to disability. Separated participant account balances less than \$5,000 can be automatically distributed by the plan administrator without the participant's consent, if the participant does not elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant in a direct rollover or to receive the distribution directly. Hardship withdrawals are permitted from a participant's elective deferral contributions account in accordance with the provisions specified in the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable are administered by MetLife from the participant's account. Participants are allowed to have one loan outstanding at a time and may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years, but up to fifteen years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid directly to MetLife by the participants.

Forfeitures

Any excess Employer contributions are forfeited and may be used to reduce the Employer's contributions or pay for Plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, such forfeitures totaled \$9 and \$12, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$1,138 of forfeitures were used to reduce Employer contributions.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investments, Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (See Note 4). Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan (See Note 5).

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

The Plan has fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and non benefit-responsive investment contracts, providing fixed rate annuities to participants, only with TIAA and CREF. TIAA and CREF maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. TIAA and CREF is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Unit Values

Individual participant accounts for the pooled separate investment account and variable annuities with TIAA and CREF are maintained on a unit value basis. Participants do not have beneficial ownership in the underlying securities or other assets in the investments, but do have an interest therein represented by units for which TIAA computes a daily net asset value (NAV). The investments earn dividends and interest which are automatically reinvested in additional units. Generally, contributions to and withdrawals from each investment are converted to units by dividing the amounts of such transactions by the unit values as last determined, and the participants' accounts are charged or credited with the number of units properly attributable to each participant.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative and Investment Expenses

Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan, such as legal and audit fees, are paid directly by Mass Audubon and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. These funds are available to pay qualified administrative expenses or Employer contributions.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 26, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No significant matters were identified for disclosure in that evaluation.

Note 3 - Information Prepared and Certified by the Plan's Insurance Companies

Plan investments are held by the Plan's insurance companies, MetLife/Empower and TIAA and CREF. The fair and contract value of investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and all investment transactions for the year ended December 31, 2024 are reported to the Plan and certified as complete and accurate by the insurance companies. Investment transactions include interest and dividends and net appreciation in fair value of investments. Information included in the supplemental schedule and notes receivable from participants have also been derived from information certified by the custodians.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2* Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

In accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) Subtopic 820-10, “Fair Value Measurements”, however, certain investments that are measured at fair value using the NAV per share (or its equivalent unit value) practical expedient are not classified within the fair value hierarchy. In subsequent tables, they are presented separately to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy amounts to amounts presented in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

The categorization of an investment within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the pricing transparency of the investment and does not necessarily correspond to Plan management’s perceived risk of that investment.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Non Benefit-Responsive Fixed Rate Annuities

TIAA offers a variety of fixed guaranteed annuity contract types as an investment option to Plan participants. Each contract is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by TIAA. The type of contract determines the applicability of certain account features, such as the guaranteed minimum interest rate, additional interest declarations, the degree of liquidity of the participant’s account, and the options for receiving income upon retirement.

Those classified as non benefit-responsive are reported at fair value, which approximates contract value. As these investments are contract-based, observable prices for identical or similar investments do not exist, and accordingly, these investments are valued using unobservable inputs (Level 3). The contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the contract, less any withdrawals. Liquidity restrictions apply to certain types of contracts that could impact the value realized upon exiting the contract.

During the accumulation phase of the contract, participant contributions purchase a specific amount of lifetime income based on the contractual rate schedule in effect at the time the premium is paid. The participant’s principal, plus a specified minimum rate of interest, are guaranteed by TIAA’s claim-paying ability. Such contracts also provide the potential for additional interest if declared by TIAA’s Board of Trustees. Additional interest, when declared, remains in effect for the declaration year, which begins each March 1 for accumulating annuities, and January 1 for lifetime payout annuities. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future years.

Such contracts do not allow lump-sum cash withdrawals, and transfers must be spread over 10 annual installments. When a participant's accumulation is converted to a lifetime payout annuity, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the accumulated balance, and the entire amount is recorded as a distribution in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Fully benefit-responsive fixed rate annuities are discussed in Note 5.

Pooled Separate Account

The account is managed by TIAA and generally invests in real estate properties and real estate-related investments. The account's value is principally derived from the market value of the underlying real estate holdings or other real estate-related investments. Real estate holdings are valued principally utilizing external appraisals, which are estimates of property values based on a professional's opinion. The account sometimes holds securities as well, and these real estate-related securities are generally priced using values obtained from independent pricing sources.

The fair value of the Plan's interest in this pooled separate account is based on a daily NAV or unit value calculated by TIAA and available on its website which is considered by Plan management to be the best approximation of fair value.

There are no unfunded commitments from participants in the Plan who invest in this account. These investments may be redeemed quarterly with one day's notice.

Variable Rate Annuities

TIAA and CREF manage a variety of such options for Plan participants. Some funds invest principally in equity securities, fixed income instruments and short-term investments in accordance with the specific portfolio's investment objectives and are primarily valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources who may employ various pricing methods to value the investments, including matrix pricing.

Others are funded through a separate TIAA investment account which invests in proprietary and non-proprietary mutual funds through various sub-accounts.

The fair values of accumulation units held by the Plan in these annuities are based on TIAA's daily NAV calculation. These NAVs are available on the TIAA website and are considered by Plan management to be the best approximation of each investment unit's fair value. The NAV is based on the fair values of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Data for NAVs are available daily to Plan administrators and client investors on TIAA and CREF's website and provides sufficient corroborative evidence to ascertain the relationship between each fund's NAV and the values of individual underlying holdings.

Note 5 - Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The following is a description of the investments and valuation methodologies for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Fixed Rate Annuities

The Plan has fully benefit-responsive investment contracts with TIAA and CREF to provide fixed rate annuities to Plan participants. TIAA and CREF maintain the participant contributions in a general account which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

These traditional annuity contracts with no liquidity restrictions are, therefore, fully benefit-responsive contracts reported at contract value. When a participant's accumulation in the TIAA Traditional Annuity is converted to a lifetime payout annuity, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the accumulated balance, and the entire amount is recorded as a distribution in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan document (including complete or partial termination or merger with another plan), (2) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (3) the failure of the Plan to qualify for exemption from Federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants, are probable of occurring.

Note 6 - Tax Status

The Plan has adopted the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company Volume Submitter Plan, as its plan document. This plan obtained its latest opinion letter dated March 31, 2017, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would continue to be fully vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan would be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Employer may determine.

Note 8 - Related Party Transactions and Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments held by MetLife and TIAA and CREF, the custodians of the Plan, are considered exempt party-in-interest transactions. During 2024, fees paid by the Plan to MetLife and other related parties amounted to \$55,871. Notes receivable from participants are also considered exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 9 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events such as an international conflict that could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
