Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Creekside Companies, Inc. 401(k) Plan (formerly Prairie River Home Care, Inc. 401(k) Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a tax deferred savings plan adopted under section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code and a profit sharing plan for employees of Creekside Companies, Inc. who are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement with the Company, who have completed six-months of service and are age twenty-one or older. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Participants may make salary deferral contributions of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Company may contribute a matching or profit-sharing contribution at its sole discretion. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Participants may direct the investment of the contributions into various investment options under the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's matching and non-elective contributions and (b) Plan earnings. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and discretionary contributions portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant's account vests at the rate of 20% per year after two years of credited service and is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to retirement or termination, a participant will receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct contributions to a variety of pooled mutual fund accounts maintained by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.). The registered investment accounts range from low-risk income funds to high-risk international growth funds.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0 and \$0, respectively. These forfeitures can be used to reduce future employer contributions to the plan or future plan expenses. In 2024, no forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions or plan expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow up to 50% the vested portion of their account not to exceed \$50,000, if approved by the Plan administrator. Loans bear an interest rate of prime plus 2% and must be repaid within 5 years unless used to acquire a personal residence. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Administration

Certain members of the Company serve as Plan Trustees. Certain Plan expenses are absorbed by the Company at the Company's discretion.

Note 2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenue and expense during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net gain from investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in various combinations of investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risk factors including, but not limited to, interest rates, market conditions and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Assets Available for Benefits in future periods.

Note 3. Information Certified by the Custodian

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by CMFG Life Insurance Company (CUNA), the custodian of the Plan.

Note 4. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax period in progress.

Note 5. Termination of Plan

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

Note 6. Investment in Insurance Contracts

The contract is a fixed deferred group annuity available to qualified retirement plans. It provides a guaranteed protection of principal with a set rate of return. The guarantee in this contract is backed by CMFG Life Insurance Company and supported by its general account. Participants in the contract do not participate in the performance of the general account, but the investment performance of that portfolio supports the contract's minimum guaranteed interest rate, any additional amounts, and payout obligations. The contract is suitable for investors seeking preservation of their account value and a fixed, guaranteed rate of return.

Note 7. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Mutual Funds: The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded. The fair values of common stocks are based on the closing price reported on the active market where the individual securities are traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
