We audited the financial statements of the Muller Martini 401(k) Super Savings Investment Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and we issued our report thereon dated September 11, 2025. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the Custodian, which is a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency and prepared and certified the statements or information regarding assets so held in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP. PLANNED SCOPE AND TIMING OF THE AUDIT

We performed the audit according to the planned scope and timing previously communicated to you.

SIGNIFICANT AUDIT MATTERS

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2024. We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there was a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. There were no significant transactions recognized in the financial statements in a different period than when the transactions occurred.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Form 5500 Procedures

We are required to obtain and read a substantially complete draft of Form 5500 prior to dating our auditors' report. The purpose of this procedure is to identify any material inconsistencies between the draft Form 5500 and the Plan's financial statements. We identified no material inconsistencies in performing and completing our audit.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. There were no such misstatements.

Disagreements With Management

For purposes of this letter, professional standards define a disagreement with management as a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditors' report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Management Representations

We requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated September 11, 2025.

Management Consultations With Other Independent Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a “second opinion” on certain situations. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the Plan’s financial statements or a determination of the type of auditors’ opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

Other Audit Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as the Plan’s auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship, and our responses were not a condition to our retention.

Other Matter

Our responsibility for the ERISA-required supplemental schedule accompanying the financial statements is to perform adequate procedures to evaluate whether the form and content of the ERISA-required supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented in compliance with the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, and whether the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

To the Plan Administrator of the

SCOPE AND NATURE OF THE ERISA SECTION 103(A)(3)(C) AUDIT

We performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Muller Martini 401(k) Super Savings Investment Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the years then ended stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

OPINION ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section:

NOTE 1 **DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Muller Martini 401(k) Super Savings Investment Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a participant-directed, defined contribution plan covering all employees of Muller Martini Corp (Company) who complete a two-month period of service and who are at least 18 years old. The Plan provides for retirement, disability, and death benefits and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Participants in the Plan may elect to contribute no less than 2% of their income on a tax-deferred basis, not to exceed annual limits as specified by the Internal Revenue Code (Code). Participants who turn 50 years old before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants' contributions are matched by the Company at 150% of the first 2% of deferrals and 20% of the next 5% of deferrals. The Company may also make an annual discretionary profit-sharing contribution. Eligible participants who do not elect otherwise are automatically enrolled to make a 6% deferral.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is adjusted to reflect any appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of the participant's share of each fund's investments and related share of investment income or loss. Company contributions are credited to each participant's account in accordance with the Plan's contribution policy, and administrative expenses, if not paid by the Company, are allocated in proportion to each participant's account balance, except for loan maintenance fees. The benefit to which each participant is entitled is the value that can be derived from the participant's vested account.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Participants may borrow against the balance in their accounts, up to the lesser of 50% of their vested balance or \$50,000 with a minimum borrowing amount of \$1,000. Loan terms require amortization of principal and interest over a period not to exceed five years. Loans used to acquire a principal residence may extend beyond a five-year term. Loans bear interest at the

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prime rate plus 1%. Loans are repaid through payroll deductions and may be repaid in full at any time.

VESTING

Participants are fully vested in their voluntary contributions. Vesting in Company contributions is based on years of service with full vesting being attained after three years. Full vesting also occurs upon a participant's death or total disability. In the event the Plan is terminated, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

FORFEITURES

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited accounts totaled \$49,442 and \$46,313, respectively. These amounts are used to reduce future Company contributions and Plan expenses. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, approximately \$38,000 and \$43,000, respectively, of forfeited accounts were used to reduce Company contributions to the Plan.

PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company may terminate the Plan at any time in whole or part. In the event of Plan termination, the accrued benefits of all participants affected shall become fully vested and nonforfeitable, and the Custodian shall distribute to the participants or their beneficiaries or estates all assets remaining in the Plan after payment of any expenses properly chargeable to the Plan. Such distribution shall be equal to the value of the participants' accounts as of the date of the termination of the Plan, adjusted to reflect any increments or decrements occurring between such termination date and the date of distribution.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Upon the normal retirement age of 59½ or termination of employment, a participant will be paid in a lump-sum amount equal to the participant's account balance on any date selected through age 72. Upon termination of service due to death or disability, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in the participant's account in a lump-sum amount, installments, or as a life annuity.

RECLASSIFICATIONS

Certain prior year amounts were reclassified to conform to the current year presentation.

NOTE 2 **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

ACCOUNTING STANDARDS CODIFICATION

All references in the financial statements to the Codification refer to the Accounting Standards Codification and the Hierarchy of Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board. The Codification is the single source of authoritative GAAP in the United States.

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with the accrual basis of accounting.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

VALUATION OF INVESTMENTS

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

PAYMENTS OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

PLAN EXPENSES

The Company pays the majority of expenses associated with administering the Plan. Expenses paid by the Plan include recordkeeping and custodian fees.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Notes receivable from participants are carried at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan agreement.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, credit risk, and overall market volatility.

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Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and those changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan evaluated subsequent events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through September 11, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya), the Custodian of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, certified the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected in the accompanying financial statements. This information was not audited by the Plan’s independent auditors. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, certified investment information consisted of the following:

NOTE 4 VALUATION OF INVESTMENTS

Investments are recorded at fair value in accordance with the provisions of the Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures Topic of the Codification, which establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to

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unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the Codification are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;

Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Below are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There were no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual and Money Market Funds: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end. NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. NAV is a quoted price in an active market.

Collective Trust: Valued using NAV per unit. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying investments owned by each fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. Participant-initiated transactions may occur daily at NAV.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes

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its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted the Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company Defined Contribution Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Plan (Pre-Approved Plan). The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) issued an opinion letter stating that the Pre-Approved Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. The Plan was subsequently amended and restated. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and operating in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes was included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions for recognition in the financial statements. The Plan Administrator concluded that there were no uncertain tax positions taken as of December 31, 2024.

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NOTE 6 RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Custodian of the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan pays investment management and recordkeeping fees to parties in interest. The Plan paid approximately \$46,000 and \$27,000 to parties in interest for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

In addition, administrative fees were paid indirectly through revenue sharing and are included in the net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.
