### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Ipsen, Inc. Employee Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Notes to Financial Statements

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#### Note 1. Plan Description

The following description of Ipsen, Inc. Employee Savings Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General:** The Plan was formed March 17, 1986. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Ipsen, Inc. and Ipsen Holding-USA (together, the Company). Prior to a 2023 plan amendment, employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after having attained age 21. Effective July 3, 2023, the Plan was amended to reduce the age requirement from 21 to 18. Participants may enroll in the Plan on the first day of each month coinciding with or following the date that the eligibility requirements are met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan is administered by the Company's Retirement Plan Committee. The Retirement Plan Committee has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The Retirement Plan Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Company's Board of Directors.

**Contributions:** Participants are automatically enrolled at a deferral rate of 3% of compensation unless they make an elective deferral. Effective April 1, 2024, an automatic deferral rate increase equal to 1% of eligible compensation applies to all eligible participants deferring less than 7% of eligible compensation, unless otherwise elected by the participant. Such automatic 1% deferral rate increases will be applied to all affected participants on an annual basis each April 28, until such time as each participant's deferral election is equal to 7% or until the participant elects to opt out of the automatic increase provision. The Plan includes both a Roth option to allow elective contributions to be made on a post-tax basis and a pretax (tax-deferred) option. Participant contributions are limited to the lesser of 60% of eligible compensation or the maximum contribution dollar amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants who will attain age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans, as defined in the Plan, and are reflected as rollover contributions. The Company makes a matching contribution of 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation deferred by the participant and 50% of the next 4% of eligible compensation deferred. The Company also allows an annual discretionary matching contribution to all participants who made employee contributions during the year, are employed on the last day of the plan year and worked greater than 1,000 hours. There was no discretionary matching contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**Participant accounts:** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of: (a) the Company's contributions and (b) plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting:** Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of continuous service, whereby participants are 100% vested after three years of credited service. There are further alternate vesting schedules for specific situations such as for employees who had been participants in specific plans which had been merged into this plan in prior years and employees with matching contributions made prior to certain dates, as further defined in the plan documents.

### Notes to Financial Statements

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#### Note 1. Plan Description (Continued)

**Payment of benefits:** Upon termination of service for any reason, participants may elect to receive benefits in the form of a lump-sum amount equal to the vested value of their account, in installments over their life expectancy, or a direct rollover distribution. Due to a previous plan merger, only participants who transferred into the Plan from the Centorr Vacuum Industries defined benefit plan may elect an annuity form of distribution. In-service withdrawals at age 59½, and hardship withdrawals, are also permitted.

**Investment options:** Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct Company and participant contributions in any of the investment options offered by the Plan. Participants have the option to transfer monies between investments and change their investment options on a daily basis. If a participant does not make an election, their contributions will be deposited into a Fidelity Freedom Fund based upon the participant's age at the time of such investments.

**Notes receivable from participants:** Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or 50%, of their vested account balance. Note terms may not exceed five years unless the note is for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the term may not exceed 10 years. A participant may only have one outstanding note at a time. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account, and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates, as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions or direct payment.

**Forfeited accounts:** At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$24,640 and \$8,346, respectively. Nonvested employer contributions forfeited by terminated participants are used either to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce the Company's future contributions. In 2024, Company contributions were reduced by approximately \$22,600 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

#### Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

**Basis of accounting:** The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment valuation and income recognition:** Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Retirement Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

**Notes receivable from participants:** Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions, based upon the terms of the Plan document. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

**Contributions:** Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Payment of benefits:** Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

**Administrative and other expenses:** The plan is responsible for payment of investment advisory and recordkeeping fees; however, the Company may pay the Plan's expenses directly. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account, and are included in administrative and other expenses.

**Subsequent events:** Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through September 25, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.

#### Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

**Level 1:** Applied to valuations based on readily available, unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets.

**Level 2:** Applied to valuations based upon quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets; or valuations based on models where the significant inputs are observable (e.g., interest rates, yield curves, prepayment speeds, default rates, loss severities) or can be corroborated by observable market data.

**Level 3:** Applied to valuations that are derived from techniques in which one or more of the significant inputs are unobservable.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Shares of registered investment companies (mutual funds):** Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV), and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

**Units of collective investment trusts:** The collective investment trusts are valued based on the NAV per unit of the collective investment trust funds. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. The NAV is based upon the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the trust less its liabilities. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Plan management evaluates the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the investments and size of the transfer relative to total net assets available for benefits. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no transfers in or out of Level 3.

#### Note 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue Company contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA and Internal Revenue Code (IRC). In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts and the net assets of the Plan would be allocated to the participants on the basis of their individual account balances.

#### Note 6. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are shares of registered investment companies managed by an affiliate company of Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity). Fidelity is the trustee, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fidelity and its affiliates also performed administrative and recordkeeping services for the Plan. During 2024, the Plan paid administrative fees of approximately \$30,000 to Fidelity and its affiliates.

Certain employees of the Company provide administrative services to the Plan. These employees are not paid from the Plan for their services. In addition, certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan, and are excluded from these financial statements.

#### Note 7. Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved defined contribution plan sponsored by Fidelity Management & Research Co. The pre-approved defined contribution plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS as to its qualified status. The opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan has been amended since the receipt of the opinion letter. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that no uncertain tax position exist. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
