1. Plan Description

The following description of Eden Home Services 401(k) Plan (the Plan), formerly EmpRes Healthcare 401(k) Plan, provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan's most recent restatement was effective June 1, 2023, which is also the effective date of the change in Plan name to Eden Home Services 401(k) Plan.

General

The Plan is a 401(k) defined-contribution plan which was adopted July 1, 1999, covering all employees who are at least 18 years old and have completed three months of service. Eligible participants may enter the Plan the first day of the calendar quarter after or coinciding with the fulfillment of these requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan's Trustees oversee governance of the Plan.

The Plan sponsors are EmpRes Healthcare Group, Inc. and affiliated companies (collectively, the Employer). The Employer operates locations, including assisted living and skilled nursing facilities and home services entities in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, California, Arizona, Nevada, South Dakota, and Wyoming. Management of the Employer, including financial services, is located in Vancouver, Washington. Effective May 1, 2023, EmpRes Healthcare Group, Inc. exited its assisted living and skilled nursing operations to focus on the home services line of business.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute, on a pre-tax basis or post-tax basis designated as Roth elective deferrals, a percentage of their annual compensation up to the limits provided by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Individuals who attain age 50 by the end of the Plan year are eligible to make additional pre-tax "catch-up" contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified, defined-contribution plans. All participant contributions shall be fully vested at all times. Newly eligible participants are automatically enrolled at 4 percent, increasing 2 percent annually on the first day of the Plan year up to a maximum of 10 percent.

Discretionary Employer matching contributions and other discretionary Employer contributions are allowed under the Plan; however, no Employer contributions have occurred since inception of the Plan.

The Plan's investments are held in a trust fund administered by Principal Life Insurance Company and Principal Trust Company, the custodians of the Plan. Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employee contributions in any investment option provided by the Plan. Descriptions of the individual investment options are available from the Plan Administrator. Participants may change investment options at any time.

1. Plan Description, continued

Participant Accounts

The account of each participant is credited with the participant's contribution and Plan earnings or losses. Each participant's account is charged with any fees or expenses related to individual investment options and fees associated with loan processing. Allocations of Plan earnings are based on individual participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Payments of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account, direct rollover to an eligible retirement plan, annual installments over periods defined by the Plan or an annuity.

In-service withdrawals are permitted for participants aged 59½ and older from their vested account balance. The Plan provides for hardship withdrawals in the event of an immediate and heavy financial need in an amount not to exceed the lesser of the participant's vested account or the amount of the financial need.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their deferral and rollover contributions. Vesting in any Employer contribution is based on years of service, subject to a graded vesting schedule. A participant is 100 percent vested after five years of service. The portion of an individual's account that is not vested at the time an employee terminates their employment is forfeited. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeited non-vested accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years with payments not less frequently than quarterly. Participants may have no more than one loan outstanding at any time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 8 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net change in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid from Plan assets. Some administrative expenses are paid directly by the Employer and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net change in fair value of investments. Fees distributions and for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account.

Recent Accounting Standard Adopted

On January 1, 2023, the Plan adopted Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-13 Financial Instruments – Credit Losses (Topic 326): *Measurement of Credit Losses on Financial Instruments*, and all related amendments (Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 326), which replaced the incurred loss methodology for recognizing credit losses with an expected loss methodology that is referred to as the current expected credit loss (CECL) methodology. CECL requires an estimate of lifetime expected credit losses to be recognized for financial assets based on historical experience, current conditions, and reasonable and supportable forecasts, and for the financial assets to be presented at the net amount expected to be collected on the statements of net assets available for benefits. The financial assets held by the Plan that are subject to ASC 326 are corrective contributions receivable and participant contributions receivable.

The Plan adopted ASC 326 effective January 1, 2023. There was no impact to the financial statements as a result of adopting this standard.

3. Information Certified by the Plan Custodians

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal Life Insurance Company and Principal Trust Company, acting as custodians for the Plan, have certified that the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules is complete and accurate as of and for the years ended December 31:

4. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Employer. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Certain Plan investment options are funds managed by Principal Life Insurance Company, a custodian of the Plan. These transactions qualify as exempt, party-in-interest transactions. Total fees paid by the Plan directly to Principal Life Insurance Company for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$161,274 and \$229,421, respectively, including administrative fees totaling \$161,274 and \$163,117, respectively. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

5. Plan Termination and Spin Off

Although the Employer has not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan Agreement, it may do so at any time subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

In August 2023, in connection with the Company's exit from assisted living and skilled nursing operations to focus on the home services line of business, \$11,678,454 in participant balances were spun off and transferred to a new EmpRes Healthcare 401(k) Plan sponsored by Couve Healthcare Consulting. As a result of these changes, there was a partial Plan termination. The affected participants became 100 percent vested in their accounts.

6. Tax Status

The Plan has been restated to adopt a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit-Sharing Plan with CODA. Principal Life Insurance Company, the sponsor of the pre-approved plan, has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020 that the Plan document is acceptable under IRC Section 401. The Plan Administrator and tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

8. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Pursuant to ASU 2015-07, *Fair Value Measurements*, the pooled separate accounts measured at NAV have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. All pooled separate accounts investments held by the Plan have no unfunded commitments, and the investments may be redeemed by participants on a daily basis with no required notice period.

Common/collective trust: Units held in the common/collective trusts are valued using the NAV of the fund. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and therefore these investments have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily at NAV. All common/collective trusts investments held by the Plan have no unfunded commitments, and the investments may be redeemed by participants on a daily basis with no required notice period.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. All mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds as part of a group annuity contract that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and are deemed to be actively traded and have a readily determinable fair value. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price.

10. Nonexempt Transactions

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, participant contributions and participant loan repayments totaling \$217 and \$105,882, respectively, were not remitted to the Plan within the appropriate time period by the Employer. \$734,972 in uncorrected late remittances from the years ended December 31, 2020 through 2022, are also included in reported late remittances and were fully corrected in 2024. Late remittances related to the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 are pending correction as of the date of the independent auditor's report. Remittances totaling \$841,071 and \$840,854 were reported as late on the Form 5500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Employer is taking appropriate steps to correct the situation by calculating lost earnings and interest and intends to further implement procedures to ensure that all future remittances are made within the prescribed time period.
