INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Trustees
Electroimpact, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Electroimpact, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTE 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Electroimpact 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

General:

The Plan, sponsored by Electroimpact, Inc., (Sponsor), is a contributory defined contribution Plan covering all eligible employees of the Sponsor. Collective bargaining employees, students, and interns are not eligible to participate in the Plan. Employees are immediately eligible to make elective deferrals and receive the employer safe harbor match and profit sharing contributions. Eligible employees may enter the Plan immediately upon their employment commencement date.

On December 29, 2022, the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law, which provides both required and optional future enhancements to tax qualified retirement plans and their participants. The provisions of the SECURE 2.0 Act may be effective and operationalized prior to formally amending the Plan document. The Plan has until December 31, 2026 to formally amend the Plan documents. The Plan is implementing the required provisions in accordance with the applicable effective dates and is also continually evaluating the optional provisions of the Act.

Contributions:

Each year participants may contribute up to a maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Code of eligible compensation as defined by the Plan. Participant contributions may be made as pre-tax or Roth elective deferrals. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollovers).

The Sponsor will contribute a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100 percent of each participant's deferral contributions not exceeding 4 percent of the participant's compensation. Deferrals in excess of 4 percent of pay are disregarded in computing a participant's match.

The Sponsor may also contribute a nonelective profit sharing contribution at the discretion of the Sponsor's Board of Directors. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Sponsor elected to make a profit sharing contribution of 4.42 percent of eligible compensation.

Participant Accounts and Investment Options:

Contributions from Plan participants and the related Plan Sponsor safe harbor matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. Contributions to participant accounts are deposited into participant-directed funds and self-directed brokerage accounts at Charles Schwab Trust Bank. Within the participant-directed accounts, participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Sponsor periodically reviews the investment fund options available to participants and drops or adds investment funds as warranted.

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocation of the Sponsor's contribution and Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest equal to 3 percent over prime rate. The prime rate was 7.5 and 8.5 percent at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer between investment funds and the Participant Loan fund. Loan terms range from one to five years, or more if for the purchase of a primary residence.

Vesting:

Participants are 100 percent vested in all participant salary deferral contributions, rollovers, safe harbor matching contribution and the related earnings at all times. Vesting in the portion of the account attributable to the nonelective profit sharing contribution plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of credited service. Generally, a participant is 100 percent vested after five years of credited service or upon retirement, death, total disability, or termination of the Plan.

Forfeitures:

Nonvested account balances forfeited into the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, were \$159,976 and \$39,285, respectively. Forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested account balances may be used to reduce the Sponsor's nonelective contribution or pay Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$83,484 of forfeitures were used to pay Plan administration fees and reduce the Sponsor's contribution.

Payment of Benefits:

On termination of service, a participant with an accrued benefit of \$7,000 or less may elect to receive their vested account balance in a lump-sum amount or rollover their account to another qualified account as provided under the terms of the Plan. The distribution date will be the earliest administratively feasible date determined by Third Party Administrator and Custodian. Terminated participants with an accrued benefit in excess of \$7,000 may leave the funds in the Plan or elect to receive a distribution in a lump sum.

Upon death or disability, a beneficiary or participant will receive 100 percent of their account balance paid as if retired. If the balance is less than \$7,000, a lump-sum distribution will be made regardless of election, paid at the earliest administratively feasible date. Pre-retirement and hardship distributions are allowed in accordance with the terms of the Plan.

NOTE 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation:

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and present the net assets available for Plan benefits and the changes in those net assets.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions of net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits:

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid. Amounts allocated to accounts of participants who elected to withdraw from the Plan, but have not yet been paid, were \$-0- at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Administrative and Investment Management Expenses:

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or Plan Sponsor, as determined by the trustees, plan document, or service provider agreements. Expenses that are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements and are not intended to be reimbursed by the Plan. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments are presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3. Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan is exposed to market and credit risk due to the various foreign and domestic investment securities that may be selected by the participant in any combination. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as foreign currency exchange rate, interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 4. Information Certified by the Custodian

Certain information related to cash-non interest bearing and investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024 by Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the Custodian, as follows:

- Cash - non interest bearing and investments reflected on the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments and interest, dividends, and capital gains reflected on the accompanying Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investments reflected on the Supplementary Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) at December 31, 2024.

NOTE 5. Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques and inputs used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and transact that price.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Accounts primarily consist of non-interest bearing cash and investments in mutual and money funds, common stock, and unit investment trusts that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices. Additionally, there are preferred stocks, government and corporate obligations and certificates of deposits that are valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities.

Stable Value Collective Investment Trust: This fund is a Collective Investment Trust valued at net asset value per unit as calculated by the Fund. This net asset value per unit is determined mostly by the Fund's various underlying investments' value at the close of each day. While the resulting net asset per unit value is not the same underlying investments' value, the financial trend should be the same. In accordance with FASB ASC Subtopic 820-10, certain investments that were measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in this table are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statement of net assets available for benefits. The Collective Trust has a daily redemption frequency and a sixty day notice period for Plan level redemption.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation techniques and inputs are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different techniques and inputs or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 6. Party-in-Interest Transactions and Administration of Plan Assets

A party-in-interest is defined as a fiduciary or employee of the Plan, any person who provides service to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50 percent or more of such an employer or employee organization, or a relative of such persons mentioned.

The Plan's investment options are held in participant directed and self-directed accounts at Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the Custodian of the Plan; therefore, any transaction executed with Charles Schwab Trust Bank qualifies as a party-in-interest transaction.

As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to plan operations to various service providers. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions.

The Plan Sponsor, Electroimpact, Inc., is a party-in-interest. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Sponsor. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. The Sponsor has the discretion to appoint or remove any trustee or agent of the Plan. The Trustees have the full power to administer the Plan and apply all of its provisions on behalf of the Sponsor.

NOTE 7. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by CCH Incorporated which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020. Although the opinion letter is not specific to the Plan, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code; therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan has maintained its tax-exempt status and has taken no material uncertain tax positions that require adjustments to the financial statements; therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements.

NOTE 8. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

NOTE 9. Subsequent Events

Date Through Which Subsequent Events Evaluated:

The date to which event occurring after December 31, 2024, the date of the most recent statement of net assets available for benefits, have been evaluated for possible adjustments to the financial statements or disclosure is September 26, 2025, which is the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.

Subsequent to December 31, 2024, the Plan was amended to discontinue the Safe Harbor matching contribution, effective April 7, 2025. The ability for the Plan Sponsor to make discretionary match and non-elective profit sharing contribution remains.
