Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Kingston Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter—Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

Kingston Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) is a qualified defined contribution plan that covers all eligible employees of Kingston Technology Company, Inc. (the “Company”). The Plan was established on January 1, 1992 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Investment fund options are participant-directed.

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

A. Eligibility

The Plan covers all eligible employees of the Company as defined in the Plan document.

Eligible employees may begin contributing to the Plan on the first day of the month coincident with or following their hire dates. To become eligible for employer matching contributions, the employee must contribute to the Plan.

To be eligible for a discretionary profit sharing contribution in a given plan year, employees must have at least one year of service, have worked at least 1,000 hours during the plan year and be employed on the last day of the plan year. Effective January 1, 2022, 1,000 work hours and employment on the last day of the plan year requirements do not apply in cases of death, disability and retirement.

B. Contributions

Under the terms of the Plan, participants may contribute up to 75% of their compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to a maximum dollar limitation as defined by the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”). The Company matched 100% of employee contributions up to a maximum of \$3,000, subject to certain statutory limitations for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Company made a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to all eligible employees ranging from a minimum of \$5,000 to a maximum of \$10,000 for the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The discretionary profit sharing contribution is based on single allocation formula under which all eligible employees receive a uniform percentage of compensation. The total profit-sharing contribution for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$4,222,711 and \$4,267,423, respectively.

The Plan allows rollovers from other qualified plans, 403(a), 403(b) and 457(b) plans, individual retirement accounts (IRAs) and Roth elective deferrals.

C. Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution, rollover contributions, the Company’s contributions and allocations of Plan net earnings or losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan document. Participants direct the investment of their contributions and the Company’s contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

D. Forfeitures

Upon termination from the Company, a participant forfeits any nonvested employer matching and profit sharing contributions and earnings on those contributions. The Company is allowed to use the forfeited funds to pay the administrative expenses of the Plan and to reduce employer contributions.

In 2024, \$147,853 of nonvested account balances were forfeited and \$124,000 was used to offset employer contributions. In 2023, \$91,312 of nonvested account balances were forfeited and \$106,000 was used to offset employer contributions. Unallocated forfeitures totaled \$150,965 and \$79,418 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

E. Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, rollover contributions, and actual earnings or losses thereon. Participants' interests in Company contributions and earnings thereon vest based on the number of years of service. Company matching contributions are fully vested after three years of service, as follows:

F. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are eligible to request a loan from the Plan for any reason. Loans are limited to the lesser of 50% of the participant's vested account balance or \$50,000. The interest rate is fixed at a stated rate determined by the plan administrator on the date of the loan. As of December 31, 2024, interest rates on existing loans ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%. The interest rate for new loans is updated monthly based on the prime rate listed in the Wall Street Journal on the last business day of the prior month plus 1%. A participant's loan is collateralized by the balance in the participant's account, as acknowledged by a promissory note. Payments on the loans are made through payroll deductions, unless the employee is on a leave of absence, over a maximum 5-year term. If the loan is used to purchase a primary residence, the maximum term is extended to 15 years.

G. Benefit Payments and Withdrawals

In the event of termination, normal retirement, disability, or death, the participant's account, if greater than \$5,000 will be distributed either in a lump sum equal to the value of the vested account or participants may defer distribution until retirement, as defined by the Plan document.

Participants that choose to defer the distribution of their accounts continue to participate in investment gains and losses; however, they are not eligible for matching or profit sharing contributions made by the Company. Pension accounts (separate accounts established to hold the balances transferred pursuant to the merger of a Money Purchase Pension Plan into the Retirement Savings Plan in 2001) will be payable in the form of a paid-up annuity contract and will be subject to the joint and survivor annuity requirements of the Retirement Equity Act of 1984. If the benefit is less than or equal to \$5,000, it will be distributed in a lump sum or as a direct rollover at the participant's election. If the participant does not elect a lump sum or direct rollover and the participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the account balance will automatically be rolled over to an IRA with a third party trust company. Benefit payments upon the death of a participant are made to the beneficiary. All withdrawals are subject to limits specified in the Plan and by the Code.

Benefits are recorded when paid. Hardship withdrawals are permitted.

H. Retirement Age

Benefits under the Plan begin when a participant retires, dies, is disabled or ceases to be an employee, whichever applies. Normal retirement age is 65. Early retirement is not permitted.

I. Administrative Expenses

To the extent administrative expenses were not paid by the Company, they were paid out of the assets of the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, administrative expenses paid by the Plan (consisting primarily of redemption fees) totaled \$7,202 and \$6,365, respectively.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of investment securities offered by the Plan. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risks. Due to the risk associated with investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in market values, interest rates or other factors in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed an intent to do so, the Company has the right to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, participants shall become fully vested as of the termination date.

NOTE 4 - INCOME TAX STATUS

Effective January 1, 2009, the Plan was amended to adopt the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Prototype, which has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service stating that the Plan is in compliance with applicable sections of the Code. The Plan has been amended since adopting the Plan document. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken a tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 5 - FINANCIAL INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Information regarding investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and investment income for the years then ended that is disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by T. Rowe Price Trust Company ("T. Rowe Price"), the trustee of the Plan.

NOTE 6 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting guidance on measuring fair value establishes a hierarchy that prioritizes valuation inputs into three levels based on the extent to which inputs used in measuring fair value are observable in the market. Under the fair value hierarchy Level 1 inputs are quoted prices for identical securities in an active market. Level 2 inputs are quoted prices for similar instruments and model-based valuation techniques for which all significant assumptions are observable in the market or can be corroborated by observable market data. Level 3 inputs are generally unobservable and typically reflect management's estimates of assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability.

Level 1 investments consist of mutual funds and cash and cash equivalents and are valued at their quoted market prices. The investments measured at net asset value are common/collective trusts. Shares may be redeemed at any time at net asset value. There are no restrictions on redemptions and no unfunded commitments to purchase additional shares. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recognized on the ex-dividend date.

NOTE 7 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by an affiliate of the trustee. Any purchases and sales of these investments are performed in the open market at fair value. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibitions of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTE 8 - PLAN AMENDMENTS

In October 2022, the Plan was amended effective January 1, 2023 to adopt the following changes:

- Add On-going After-Tax Contributions and After-Tax Contribution limit of 10% of compensation.

- Add After-Tax Rollover Contributions.
- Add in-Plan Roth Rollover Contributions for both distributable and non-distributable amounts for Pre-Tax, After-Tax, Rollover and After-Tax Rollover sources.
- Add After-Tax Contributions and In-Plan Roth Rollover Contributions to amounts available for loan calculation and redemption.
- Add After-Tax Contributions, In-Plan Roth Rollover Contributions and After-Tax Rollover Contributions to amounts available for hardship withdrawals.
- Add After-Tax Rollover Contributions to amounts available at any time.
- Add After-Tax Contributions to amounts available for withdrawals at age 59½.
- Change Automatic Contribution Arrangement effective date to align with restatement effective date (January 1, 2023).

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan adopted the following amendments:

- To increase after-tax contribution limit up to 30% of compensation each payroll period, provided that combined after-tax and regular participant contributions do not exceed 75% of compensation.
- Expanded eligibility and vesting for eligible participants and updated required minimum distribution rules to exclude designated Roth contributions in accordance with the SECURE 2.0 Act.

NOTE 9 - T. ROWE PRICE STABLE VALUE COMMON TRUST FUND

The Plan invests in the T. Rowe Price Stable Value Common Trust Fund, a collective trust that invests in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. The fund is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. As such, the investment is reported at contract value, which represents the amount participants would receive if they initiated a benefit-responsive transaction under the terms of the Plan.

The crediting rate is based on a formula established by T. Rower Price but may not be less than 0%. The average crediting rate was 1.15% and 3.12% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Certain restrictions may limit the Plan's ability to redeem its investment in the fund at contract value, and market value adjustments and/or redemption charges may apply. The plan administrator does not believe that any events limiting the Plan's ability to transact at contract value are probable of occurring.

NOTE 10 - RECLASSIFICATION

Certain balance for the 2023 Plan year was reclassified to conform to the 2024 presentation. The reclassification had no effect on prior year net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 11 - RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO THE FORM 5500
