NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

General and Eligibility: The Schenker, Inc. 401(k) Savings and Investment Plan (the “Plan”) is a defined contribution plan, which is available to employees after two months of service if they are expected to complete one year of service. The Plan defines an “employee” as any person employed by Schenker, Inc. (the “Company” and “Plan Administrator”) or any affiliated company that has adopted the Plan. Employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement are excluded from participation.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) as amended. The descriptions contained in these financial statements provide only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

Administration: The Plan is administered and overseen by the Schenker, Inc. 401(k) Savings and Investment Plan Administrative Committee (the “Committee”). Transamerica Retirement Solutions Corporation (“TRSC”) is the Plan record keeper and State Street Bank and Trust Company (“SSBT”) is the custodian of all investments, except as noted below. Investment options are made available through TRSC and Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (“TFLIC”), an affiliate of TRSC. TFLIC manages and maintains the guaranteed investment contract and variable annuity accounts.

Contributions: Eligible employees may contribute from 1% to 100% of their salary up to the maximum percentage of compensation and dollar amount permissible under Internal Revenue Code section 402(g). Participants who have attained age 50 by the close of the Plan year may also make additional “catch up” elective deferral contributions in accordance with the provisions of Internal Revenue Code section 414(v). When participants meet the eligibility requirements, they will be automatically enrolled to defer 3% of their compensation unless they go online to change this automatic election. Participants who are automatically enrolled will have their balances automatically increased by 1% each year unless they go online to change this automatic increase. The maximum savings rate is 10% for automatic increases.

Effective January 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to remove the Non-Qualified Automatic Enrollment Arrangement Safe Harbor Matching Contribution and add a discretionary matching contribution. The discretionary matching contribution for 2024 was \$0.50 for every \$1 contributed of elective deferrals, up to the first 6% of compensation. The Company made \$12,544,106 in discretionary matching contributions during the Plan year ended December 31, 2024. The Company has the right to make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan. There were no profit-sharing contributions made for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024.

Participants may elect to invest contributions among one or more of the investment funds offered by the Plan. Additionally, they may subsequently change their contribution rates, redesignate the allocation of contributions or transfer existing balances between investment funds, subject to the limits set forth in the Plan. Company matching contributions during any Plan year are allocated to participant accounts based on the amount of salary redirection contributions elected by the participants.

Vesting: Participants’ contributions and safe harbor match contributions received prior to January 1, 2021 plus earnings thereon are 100% vested at all times. Participants become 100% vested in the Company’s discretionary matching plus earnings after one year of service. Prior to July 1, 2023, vesting service was calculated on an hourly basis. Beginning July 1, 2023, service is based on elapsed time, with each current participant receiving credit for the most favorable method.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's and Company's contributions. In addition, each participant's account is credited with an allocation of the Plan's investment income (loss) and is charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation, contributions and account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is that benefit which can be provided from the vested portion of the participant's account.

Forfeited Accounts: At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$1,644,333 and \$575,315, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce future Company contributions or to pay administrative expenses. During 2024, \$132,368 of forfeitures were used to reduce the Company contribution and \$117,077 of forfeitures were used to offset Plan administrative expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Any participant may request a loan of no less than \$1,000 and no more than 50% of the participant's current vested account balance at the time the request is made, not to exceed \$50,000. A \$75 loan administration fee is deducted from the participant's account upon issuance of the loan check.

One loan per participant may be outstanding at any given time and all loan repayments must be made by payroll deduction. Loans may be repaid in full at any time, however, partial prepayments are not allowed. Loans are due, with interest equal to the prime rate plus 4%, in installments over a specified period of time, not to exceed five years unless the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence in which case the loan must be paid back within ten years. Should a participant terminate with an outstanding loan, the outstanding balance becomes due and payable at the end of the calendar quarter following the quarter that the last payment was due. If the loan is not repaid upon termination, it is considered a taxable distribution, and the participant will be responsible for all penalties and taxes associated therewith.

Withdrawals and Distributions: Prior to October 1, 2002, upon termination of employment, death, disability or attaining normal or early retirement age, participants had the option to be paid the entire value of their vested account in a lump-sum cash payment, to request a direct rollover to an IRA or another qualified plan, or to receive annuity payments based upon the guidelines specified in the Plan document. Effective October 1, 2002, the automatic form of distribution under the Plan is a lump sum, with partial payments as the optional form of distribution. However, any participant in the Plan as of September 30, 2002, who took a distribution prior to December 31, 2002, retains the right to apply the distribution options that were available under the Plan as in effect on September 30, 2002. Any distributions taken after December 31, 2002 must be in a lump sum, as the automatic form of distribution, with installments and partial payments as the optional form of distribution.

Company contributions allocated to the Plan prior to January 1, 1990 shall be available for withdrawal at any time. Voluntary (after tax) contributions previously made to the Plan are available for withdrawal at any time. Participants with account balances over \$5,000 also have the option of maintaining their investment with no further contributions up to age 70 ½, or age 72 for participants born after July 1, 1949.

Participants who have attained age 59 ½ during the plan year may elect to take an in-service withdrawal subject to plan provisions.

Hardship Withdrawals: Hardship withdrawals may be made by Plan participants upon written request to, and approval from, the Plan Administrator. If approved, the distribution is limited to the amount necessary to meet the financial need created by the hardship.

Retirement, Death and Disability: A participant or his beneficiary is entitled to 100% of his or her vested account balance upon retirement, death or disability. Prior to July 1, 2023, the Plan's Normal Retirement Age was the later of age 65 or the 5th anniversary of the 1st day of the plan year in which plan participation began. Beginning July 1, 2023, normal retirement age is when participant attains age 65.

Administrative and Investment Management Expenses: Loan origination fees associated with notes receivable from participants and the Plan's record keeping and custodial fees are paid by the Plan and are reflected in the financial statements as administrative expenses of the Plan. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and included in the investment income (loss) reported by the Plan. All other expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America under the accrual basis.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participants' account balances.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments, other than a fully benefit-responsive contract measured at contract value, are reported at fair value as further described in Note 4. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Benefit Payments: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period and, when applicable, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties: The Plan holds various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, liquidity, credit and overall market volatility risk, including global events, such as the coronavirus pandemic. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the sensitivity of certain fair value estimates to changes in valuation assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 - CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS AND NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by State Street Bank and Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan (which includes the Prudential Stable Value Bond Collective Trust), and Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is the price that would be received by the Plan for an asset or paid by the Plan to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date in the Plan's principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability. Contract value is the relevant measure for the Plan's fully benefit-responsive contract, because contract value is the amount Plan participants generally receive when executing transactions under the terms of the contract and Plan provisions. Fair value measurements are determined by maximizing the use of observable inputs and minimizing the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy places the highest priority on unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and gives the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of inputs within the fair value hierarchy are defined as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

In some cases, a valuation technique used to measure fair value may include inputs from multiple levels of the fair value hierarchy. The lowest level of significant input determines the placement of the entire fair value measurement in the hierarchy.

The following descriptions of the valuation methods and assumptions used by the Plan to estimate the fair values of investments apply to investments held directly by the Plan.

Collective trusts: The fair values of participant units held in a collective trust are based on the net assets values per unit as reported by the fund managers. The collective trust provides for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net assets values per share with no advance notice requirement.

Mutual funds: The fair values of mutual fund investments are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges (Level 1 inputs).

Variable annuity accounts: The fair values of participation units held in subaccounts (“Secure Path for Life Variable Investment Options”) of the Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company Pooled Account No. 44 are based on the net asset values reported by the fund managers as of the financial statement dates and recent transaction prices. Each of the subaccounts invests in one of the Vanguard Target Date mutual funds. The investment strategies of these subaccounts are consistent with each of the mutual funds identified in the name of the fund. The subaccounts provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net asset value per share.

Guaranteed investment contract with Insurance Company: The Plan holds a guaranteed investment contract that is not fully benefit-responsive, and, accordingly, is measured at fair value. The fair value of the investment contract has been determined to approximate contract value, based upon the lack of contractual maturity, the frequency of the re-setting of crediting interest rates, the credit quality of the issuer, the liquidity of the contract with respect to participant transactions, and the contractual terms which provide for all participant transactions to be executed at contract value and which prohibit the transfer or assignment of rights under the contract to a third party (Level 3 inputs).

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - SYNTHETIC INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan holds a fully benefit-responsive synthetic investment contract with Prudential Insurance Company of America ("Prudential" or "Issuer"), which is stated at contract value, which is generally the amount a participant would receive if he or she would initiate a withdrawal or transfer from the contract under the provisions of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made to the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract value of the Plan's fully benefit-responsive investment contract, by type, is presented below:

Under the synthetic investment contract, the Plan holds units of the Prudential Core Intermediate Bond Collective Trust ("Collective Trust") issued by Prudential Trust Company and participation in a wrapper contract issued by Prudential. The wrapper contract provides a minimum guaranteed rate of return on the Plan's investment in the Collective Trust and provides that all payments for Plan participant transactions will be executed at contract value. Prudential's guarantees under the wrapper contract are backed by the net assets of its general account. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the Issuer or otherwise.

The Plan's investment contract specifies certain conditions under which distributions from the contract would be payable at amounts below contract value. Such circumstances include Plan termination, Plan merger, premature contract termination initiated by the Company, and certain other Company-initiated events that result in distributions exceeding a set amount. The contract limits the circumstances under which the Issuer may terminate the contract. Examples of circumstances which would allow the Issuer to terminate the contract include the Plan's loss of its qualified status, uncured material breaches of responsibilities, or material and adverse changes to the provisions of the Plan. If one of these events were to occur, the Issuer could terminate the contract at an amount less than contract value. Currently, management believes that the occurrence of an event that would cause the Plan to transact contract distributions at less than contract value is not probable.

The crediting interest rate of the contract is based on an agreed-upon formula with the Issuer, as defined in the contract agreement, but cannot be less than zero percent. Such interest rates are reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The key factors that influence future interest crediting rates could include the following: the level of market interest rates; the amount and timing of participant contributions, transfers and withdrawals into/out of the contracts; and the duration of the underlying investments backing the contract.

NOTE 6 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor Regulations as any party providing fiduciary services for the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the employer and certain others. Certain investments of the Plan are managed by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company and therefore these are considered party-in-interest investments. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. Additionally, the Plan held notes receivable with certain participants as assets at December 31, 2024 and 2023, which also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Any direct or indirect expenses paid for by the Plan, as described in Note 1, are considered party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event that a termination of the Plan should occur, the entire value of each participant's account (including employer contributions) shall become fully vested and shall be paid to the respective participant regardless of years of service.

NOTE 8 - TAX STATUS OF THE PLAN

The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) issued an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 indicating that the prototype plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has been amended from the original prototype document, Plan management believes that the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events for recognition and disclosure through October 1, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
