Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Emery & Sons Construction Group, LLC Retirement and Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Emery & Sons Construction Group, LLC Retirement and Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Emery & Sons Construction Group, LLC (the Company) who are at least 18 years of age. Employees who work on Davis-Bacon Act prevailing wage jobs during the first month of employment are eligible to participate in the Plan on their hire date. Otherwise, employees may participate the first day of the month following thirty days of employment. The Plan is subject to the requirements of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

Each participant may elect to contribute a portion of pretax and after tax compensation to the Plan up to the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) each year instead of receiving that amount in cash. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

The discretionary contributions made to the Plan were equal to 3% of each participant's wages on compensation not subject to the prevailing rate schedules for the year ending December 31, 2024. Discretionary contributions made during 2024 totaled \$294,089. Contributions for employees working on projects covered by a prevailing rate schedule are based on the appropriate fringe benefit rates, as determined by the Company. The Company made \$1,684,472 in prevailing wage contributions in 2024.

Investment Elections

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants have the opportunity to change their investment combinations on a daily basis.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings (losses), and (c) Plan expenses. Allocations are made in a manner which recognizes each participant's account balance, investment selection and timing of contributions and withdrawals. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, prevailing wage contributions, and rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of continuous service according to the following table:

Participants shall become 100% vested upon attainment of normal retirement age (65 years), death, or permanent disablement.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow against their Plan accounts subject to certain limitations. Loan amounts are subject to a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate comparable with rates charged by commercial lenders for loans under similar circumstances. Loan terms generally range from one to five years; however, if the loan is used to acquire a principal residence, the loan may be up to 30 years. Interest rates range from 3.25% to 8.50% for loans outstanding at December 31, 2024.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to any reason, participants with vested account balances of less than \$5,000 receive an automatic distribution to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Participants with vested account balances of \$5,000 or more may elect to receive a single lump-sum amount or choose to rollover their balance into another qualified retirement plan or IRA.

Participants may also elect to take in-service or hardship withdrawals subject to the terms of the Plan document and Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of non-vested accounts can be used to reduce employer contributions or pay administrative expenses. Forfeitures of \$24,428 were used in 2024 to pay administrative expenses. Unallocated forfeitures totaled \$6,307 at December 31, 2024 (\$4,846 at December 31, 2023).

Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. The fair value of a financial instrument is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion regarding fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for doubtful credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. The Plan permits the payment of certain Plan expenses to be made from the Plan's assets. Fees are charged to participants on a pro rata basis, equally to participant accounts, or specifically to a participant account for transactions specifically related to that participant. Audit and other services are paid for by the Company.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan's investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risk in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 3, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were issued.

Note 3 - Information Certified by Custodian

The Plan's investments are held by Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the Custodian of the Plan. Investment decisions are made at the direction of the participants. The investments are credited for earnings thereon and charged for withdrawals and expenses as charged by the Custodian. The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from the Custodian as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, that the following information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Custodian is complete and accurate:

- Noninterest-bearing cash
- Investments, at fair value
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received from selling an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. When determining the fair value measurements for assets and liabilities required to be recorded at fair value, the Plan considers the principal or most advantageous market in which it would transact and considers assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, such as inherent risk, transfer restrictions, and risk of nonperformance.

The Plan follows a fair value hierarchy to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Three levels of inputs may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 - quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 - unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Investment Trusts: Units held in collective investment trusts (CIT) are valued using the net asset value (NAV) of the CIT as reported by the CIT managers and is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CIT, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV of a CIT is calculated based on a compilation of primarily observable market information.

The Plan has an investment in the Morley Stable Value Fund, which is a CIT fund that invests in conventional, synthetic, and separate account investment contracts issued by life insurance companies, banks, and other financial institutions. Characteristics of these contracts allow for their principal value to remain stable regardless of the volatility of the financial markets. The contracts are nontransferable but provide for benefit responsive withdrawals and participant transfers to noncompeting options by Plan participants at contract value. Contract value represents invested principal and accrued interest thereon.

There are certain employer-initiated events which could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. The Company does not believe the occurrence of any such event which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants is probable. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Additionally, the Plan has multiple investments in Sloy, Dahl & Holst Collective Investment Funds which are CIT funds that invest primarily in mutual funds and money market funds. Each of the funds seek a competitive return for its investment style consistent with the stated risk and return profile of the particular fund.

Note 5 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in any unvested employer contributions.

Note 6 - Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan's volume submitter sponsor by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA sponsored by Spectrum Pension Consultants Inc., which has been adopted by the Plan, is acceptable pursuant to Section 401 of the IRC, and in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since adopting the sponsor plan. However, the Plan has not requested its own determination letter from the IRS. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently operating in compliance with the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements at December 31, 2024. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7 - Party-in-Interest Transactions

Spectrum Pension Consultants, Inc. provides third party administration services to the Plan, Sloy Dahl & Holst, LLC provides investment advisory services to the Plan, and Charles Schwab Trust Bank provides custodian services to the Plan. Transactions with these entities qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.
