**Note 1 – Description of Plan**

General

The following description of the Westchester Country Club 401(k) Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution pension plan established on January 1, 1997 and subsequently amended and restated. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 as amended (“ERISA”). All non-union employees of the Westchester Country Club (the “Club”) over the age of 21 who have been employed for at least one year and completed 1,000 hours of service during a Plan year are eligible to participate in the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to comply with the long-term part-time employee eligibility provisions of the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (“SECURE Act”). Under these provisions, employees who complete at least 500 hours of service in each of three consecutive 12-month periods and attain age 21 are eligible to make elective deferrals under the Plan, even if they have not satisfied the Plan’s standard 1,000-hour service requirement.

Beginning January 1, 2025, the Plan will be further amended, as required under the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022, to expand these eligibility provisions to employees who complete at least 500 hours of service in each of two consecutive 12-month periods.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a portion of their pre-tax annual compensation subject to certain limitations set under the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”). After-tax Roth contributions may be made to the Plan. The Club also contributes a percentage of eligible participants’ compensation, ranging from 2.35% to 7.12%, for all participants who have worked at the Club for 10 years or less with increased amounts based on additional service years. Participants need not make compensation deferrals into the Plan in order to be credited with the employer contribution. In addition, the Club may also elect to make discretionary matching profit-sharing contributions for eligible employees based on terms established in the Plan agreement.

The Plan allows for rollover contributions from other qualified plans.

Participant accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the (a) participant’s contribution, (b) allocations of the Club’s contribution and (c) Plan earnings net of an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Investment options

Each participant may direct the investment of their account into certain available investment options. The assets of the Plan are allocated to the applicable funds at the direction of the participant.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their and the Club's contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Payment of benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or periodic payments as further outlined in the Plan document. For termination of services due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. In addition, participants may elect in-service withdrawals of their elective deferral account balances after reaching age 59-1/2. Participants may also elect in-service withdrawals of their elective deferral account balances in their annuity contracts in the case of a hardship. Rollover account balances may be withdrawn at any time, provided the rollover contributions have been properly segregated. Minimum required distributions for participants also apply per Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") regulations.

Notes receivable from participants

Under the terms of the Plan, participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lower of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions over no longer than a five-year period or up to fifteen years for the purchase of a primary residence. Participants are limited to two outstanding loans at a time.

**Note 2 – Summary of significant accounting policies**

Basis of accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting, except for benefits that are recorded when paid.

Investment valuations and income recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are reported at contract value.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds)

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value based on the quoted market prices of the underlying securities within each fund.

Money market funds

The carrying amount approximates fair value because these instruments are liquid in nature.

Insurance company general account

Insurance company general account is measured at contract value. On the contract date, the contract value in any fixed interest allocation is equal to the portion of the initial premium paid and designated for allocation to the fixed interest allocation. On each business day after the contract date, the amount of contract value is calculated in each fixed interest allocation as follows:

- 1) The contract value in the fixed interest allocation is taken at the end of the preceding business day.
- 2) A daily rate of interest is credited at the guaranteed rate since the preceding business day.
- 3) (1) and (2) are added together.
- 4) Any transfers from that fixed interest allocation are subtracted from (3).
- 5) Any withdrawals, contract fees (including any rider charges) and premium taxes are subtracted from (4).

Realized and unrealized gains and losses from the investments in each account are credited to or charged against each account. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividends are recorded when received.

The aggregate of (a) the net unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value or contract value of investments for the year, and (b) the net gains or losses on disposition of investments during the year is reflected as net appreciation in investments for the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments are deducted from individual investments and are not reflected separately. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of return for such investments.

Fair value measurements

For assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis, Accounting Standards Codified Topic *Fair Value Measurements* requires quantitative disclosures about the fair value measurement separately for each major class of assets. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets.
- Level 2 – Quoted prices for identical assets in markets that are not active, quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, inputs other than quoted market prices, and inputs derived principally from observable market data.
- Level 3 – Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

The asset fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Money market funds:* the carrying amount approximates fair value because these investments are liquid in nature.

Investments at contract value

The Plan holds an investment contract that is comprised of an insurance company general account. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The following represents the investment at contract value held by the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023:

Contributions

Contributions from participants are recorded as they are withheld from the participants' wages. Contributions from the Club are recorded as earned.

Payment of benefits

Benefit payments to participants or their beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or December 31, 2023.

Administrative expenses

General administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Club and are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements. Certain other transaction-related participant expenses, such as those associated with loan maintenance and administration, are paid by the Plan and are included in the accompanying financial statements.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Club. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. These investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, credit and liquidity risks. Due to the level of risk associated with investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2024. The Plan's investments are not insured or protected by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation, or any other governmental agency, accordingly, the Plan is subject to the normal investment risks associated with investments. Any default on participant notes would be treated as a taxable distribution to the participant.

Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through September 24, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Accordingly, Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the Custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, the Supplemental Schedule H – Part IV – Line 4(i) – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 and the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**Note 6 – Plan termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Club has the right under the Plan to discontinue and terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA.

**Note 7 – Tax status**

The Plan utilizes a prototype Plan document which the IRS has opined and informed the prototype Plan Sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the prototype Plan document complies with section 401(a) of the IRC. Although the Plan does not have an IRS determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.
