**Note 1    Description of the Plan**

The following description of the Griffin Greenhouse Supplies, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

***General***

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Griffin Greenhouse Supplies, Inc. (the “Company”) who have one year of eligible service and are age nineteen or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended.

***Contributions***

Each year, participants may contribute up to Internal Revenue Service dollar limitations as defined in the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers forty mutual funds and a fixed annuity as investment options for participants. The Company matches 25% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company’s board of directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

For the year ending December 31, 2024, the Company’s profit sharing contribution was \$707,857. These amounts were funded in March 2025.

***Participant’s Individual Accounts***

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of the Company’s contribution and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative and investment expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their contribution plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s contribution portion of their account is based on years of service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

**Note 1 Description of the Plan (Continued)**

*Notes Receivable from Participants*

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at commercial bank rates, determined at the time of the loan. Loans currently outstanding bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

*Payment of Benefits*

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account, or annual installments over a ten-year period. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant will receive the value of their vested interest as a lump-sum distribution.

*Funding Policy*

The Company remits employee deferral and company matching contributions to the Plan on a bi-weekly basis.

*Forfeited Accounts*

Forfeited accounts are amounts forfeited by participants who have terminated their employment and who have withdrawn from the Plan.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$131,350 and \$146,375, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts of \$82,269 and \$852, respectively were used to reduce employer contributions and pay plan expenses.

**Note 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

*Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, except for benefit payments which are recorded when paid.

*Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reporting amounts of assets and liabilities and changes in those assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

*Contributions*

Participant contributions are recorded when the Company makes payroll deductions from eligible Plan participants. Employer contributions are accrued in the period in which they become obligations of the Company.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

*Notes Receivable from Participants*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

*Payment of Benefits*

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Professional fees are paid by the Plan. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

**Note 3 Fair Value Measurements**

The Financial Accounting Standards Board's ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Topic 820, Fair Value Measurements, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

---

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

---

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

---

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

---

The assets or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Note 3 Fair Value Measurements (Continued)**

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. These methodologies were consistently applied to all assets and liabilities carried by the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual Funds:* Valued at the daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily Net Asset Value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

**Note 4 Fixed Annuity**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract (the “Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund”) with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“Empower”). The entire general account assets of Empower back this contract. The methodology for calculating the interest rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The interest crediting rate is reset quarterly. The average yield for 2024 and 2023 was 1.41% and 1.23%, respectively.

Certain events may limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Empower. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor, or (c) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants are probable of occurring.

The investment contract is fully benefit-responsive and therefore is included in the financial statements at contract value, which approximates fair value, as reported to the Plan by Empower. Contract value represents contributions made under the fixed annuity, less Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses.

**Note 5 Information Prepared and Certified by Trustees**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance by 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, trustee of the Plan, certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and related investment activity in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the accompanying supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

**Note 6 Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and a fully benefit-responsive investment contract managed by the Trustee of the Plan. Transactions involving these investments are considered party-in-interest transactions. These transactions, are not, however, considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions, but are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

**Note 7 Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

**Note 8 Tax Status**

The Plan Sponsor has adopted a prototype plan, in which the IRS stated that the restated prototype plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). The Plan Administrator timely adopted the restated prototype plan. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in accordance with IRC requirements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 9 Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**Note 10 Subsequent Events**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 11, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available for issuance, for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements.
