The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

### **Other Matters - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA**

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 and schedule of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

## **NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

### **1. Description of the Plan**

The following description of Sandstone Healthcare Group 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### **General:**

The Plan is a defined-contribution plan that was adopted on November 1, 2021, covering all full-time employees of Sandstone Healthcare Group, LLC, Sandstone Spring Valley, LLC, Sandstone of Tucson Rehab Centre, LLC, Sandstone Estates Rehab Centre, LLC, American Fork Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone American Fork, Bountiful Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Bountiful, Brigham City Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Pioneer Trail, Canyon Rim Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Canyon Rim, Millcreek Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Millcreek, Nephi Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Nephi, North Canyon Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone North Park, Redwood Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Taylorsville, Richfield Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Richfield, SLC Valley Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone South Lake, Willow Glen Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Brigham City and Willow Wood Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Holladay (collectively, the Company) who have attained the age of 21 or older and have completed at least one hour of service.

Effective November 1, 2024, Thrive Behavioral Hospital became a participating employer in the Plan. Employees were eligible to participate in the Plan immediately.

Eligible employees may enter the Plan each year on January 1 and July 1.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan added an auto enrollment provision. Employees that meet the eligibility requirements and do not decline enrollment are automatically enrolled in the Plan at 3% of eligible compensation. This provision applies to all participants in the Plan except those who have a salary deferral agreement in effect already that is at least equal to 3% of compensation. Employees become eligible to participate upon the next entry date (first day of each month) subsequent to completing three months of service.

Effective April 1, 2025, American Fork Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone American Fork, Bountiful Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Bountiful, Brigham City Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Pioneer Trail, Canyon Rim Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Canyon Rim, Millcreek Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Millcreek, Nephi Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Nephi, North Canyon Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone North Park, Redwood Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Taylorsville, Richfield Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Richfield, SLC Valley Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone South Lake, Willow Glen Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Brigham City and Willow Wood Nursing & Rehab, LLC dba Sandstone Holladay are no longer in the Plan.

### **1. Description of the Plan (continued)**

#### **General: (continued)**

The participants for these entities are no longer employees of the Company and are no longer eligible to participate in the Plan. The participants' assets will remain in the Plan until they are distributed. This also caused a partial Plan termination. Affected participants will be 100% vested in employer matching contributions.

#### **Contributions:**

Participants may contribute up to 100% of eligible compensation. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined-benefit or defined-contribution plans. Contributions are limited in accordance with Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations. The Plan permits discretionary matching contributions by the Company. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed 5% of each participant's first 15% of eligible compensation. All participants are eligible for matching contributions.

In addition, the Company may make annual discretionary profit-sharing contributions. Employees must have completed one year of service and be employed on the last day of the year to be eligible for such discretionary profit-sharing contributions. There were no discretionary profit-sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### **Participant accounts:**

Each participant directs their individual investments including their share of allocated Company contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with contributions, appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments and interest and dividend income. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances as defined by the Plan.

#### **Vesting:**

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of credited service. A participant is 20% vested after two years of credited service and an additional 20% vested after each additional year of credited service.

### **1. Description of the Plan (continued)**

#### **Participant loans:**

Loans are available to Plan participants at Prime (7.50% and 8.50% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively) plus 1.00% at the time of issuance. The minimum loan is \$1,000 and the maximum amount is equal to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the participant's account during the prior twelve-month period or 50% of their vested account balance. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. All loans must be repaid over a five-year period, unless the loan is for the purchase of a principal residence, for which the term of the loan may be as long as 30 years. Loan defaults are treated as distributions. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account.

#### **Payment of benefits:**

Upon retirement, death or disability, a participant becomes 100% vested in his or her account. Upon termination of service, a participant is entitled to receive only the vested percentage of his or her account balance. If a participant's vested balance does not exceed \$5,000, then the vested balance may only be distributed in a single lump-sum payment. Any balance that exceeds \$5,000 may be received as a single lump-sum payment or as partial withdrawals. Payments may be received as a cash distribution or rolled directly into an eligible retirement plan as an eligible rollover distribution.

The Plan also allows in-service withdrawals from a participant's vested account balance for hardship withdrawals.

#### **Forfeitures:**

If a participant terminates employment and is less than 100% vested in the employer account, then the participant will forfeit the nonvested portion of the employer account. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and will first be used to pay administrative expenses. Any remaining amounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions payable under the Plan.

### **2. Summary of significant accounting policies**

#### **Basis of accounting:**

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### **Investment valuation and income recognition:**

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest is recognized on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

#### **Notes receivable from participants:**

As described in Note 1, the Plan allows participants to borrow against their vested account balances and the loans are secured by the participants' account balances. Participant loans are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

#### **Contributions:**

Participants' contributions are recognized by the Plan when withheld from the participants' paychecks by the Company.

#### **Administrative expenses:**

All administrative costs, charges and expenses are paid by the Plan to the extent not paid by the Company.

#### **Payment of benefits:**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### **2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)**

#### **Use of estimates:**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits as of the end of the Plan year and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the period. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Subsequent events:**

The Plan Administrator has reviewed and evaluated subsequent events through September 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

### **3. Risks and uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### **4. Investments (information prepared and certified by Charles Schwab Trust Bank (the Trustee))**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the following information related to participant-directed investments included in these financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified to as complete and accurate by the Trustee as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Trustee certified to the completeness and accuracy of interest and dividend income of \$50,736 and net appreciation in fair value of investments of \$97,210 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Notes receivable from participants of \$23,677 and \$11,401 were also certified by the Trustee at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Interest rates on outstanding loans ranged from 8.75% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024 and from 8.75% to 9.25% at December 31, 2023.

### **5. Fair value measurements**

There are three levels of inputs used to measure fair value. The definition of each input is described below:

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the market value of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Interest-bearing cash: Valued at cost which approximates fair value.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan's valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

### **6. Party-in-interest transactions**

Some of the Plan's investments are shares of a mutual fund and cash accounts managed by the Trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

### **7. Plan termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in all of their account balances.

### **8. Tax status**

The Plan, a mass-submitter prototype plan, obtained its latest determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code.
