To the Plan Trustees of the Cantex Continuing Care Network Employees Savings Trust

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Cantex Continuing Care Network Employees Savings Trust (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C)"). Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 9 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Co., Pivot Rehabilitation Services, LLC, Advanced Primary Care Practice, LLC, El Paso Continuing Care Center Ltd. Co. and Cantex Continuing Care Network LLC (collectively, the "Company" or "Employers") who have one month of service and are age twenty-one or older. The Summary Plan Description was amended January 1, 2024 to change the service requirement for eligibility to six months, applicable to new hires only. The entry date to the Plan will be the first day of the Plan year quarter coinciding with the date when the employee satisfies the eligibility requirement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Board of Trustees is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Board of Trustees.

Contributions

Participating employees may elect to contribute any amount not less than one percent and not more than fifty percent of their eligible compensation to the Plan, subject to a limit on calendar year contributions set forth by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"), which was \$23,000 in 2024. Participants who have reached age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company elected to match twenty percent of participant contributions including catch-up contributions up to five percent of eligible compensation, limited to one percent of compensation. The Company may also elect to make discretionary non-matching contributions. Each eligible participant's account is allocated a percentage of any non-matching contributions based on the ratio of the eligible participant's

compensation to the total compensation of all eligible employees. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no discretionary non-matching contributions. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations. The Summary Plan Description was amended January 1, 2024 to allow roth deferrals into the Plan.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. For participants hired on or before December 31, 2023, the participant is 50% vested after two years of credited service and 100% vested after three years of credited service. For participants hired on or after January 1, 2024, the vesting schedule for Company contributions is as follows:

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loans bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions. The January 1, 2024 Plan amendment restricts the number of participant loans outstanding to a maximum of one.

Payment of benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Other payment options are available upon request of the participant or beneficiary and upon approval of the Trustees. Upon termination of service, the Company has the option to require those participants with vested account balances less than \$1,000 to take lump-sum distributions unless a direct rollover is elected. If a participant's vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, they may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution, receive installments over a specified period of time, or roll over their vested account balance. For all participants who have terminated with a vested account balance between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Plan administrator has the right to automatically rollover the balance to an individual retirement account ("IRA") designated by the Plan administrator. As of January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to allow for automatic cash out for terminated balances less than \$1,000 and automatic rollover for terminated balances between \$1,000 and \$7,000, excluding rollover contributions. The participant bears all expenses of the IRA.

Forfeited accounts

Forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested account balances are to be used to reduce the Employers' matching contributions and non-elective contributions, if any, for the Plan year immediately following the Plan year in which the forfeiture occurs. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, included in the Stable Value fund is \$0 and \$3,061 in nonparticipant-directed unallocated forfeitures. Employer contributions were reduced by \$6,000 from forfeited nonvested accounts for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 2 - Summary of accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance companies. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Excess contributions payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2024. There were no excess contributions payable at December 31, 2024.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 6, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Fair value measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities ("Level 1") and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs ("Level 3"). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") issued Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Interest-bearing account: Valued using discounted cash flows that are observable.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued using the net unit value, which is based on the fair value of the underlying assets of the account.

Note 4 - Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts

Stable Value Fund (general account)

The Stable Value Fund ("SVF") in which the Plan is invested is provided under a group annuity contract issued by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company, Inc. ("TFLIC"). Such contract is a traditional investment contract with TFLIC and it does not have a maturity date.

This fund is part of the general assets of TFLIC (its general account) and is not subject to GAAP audited financial statements. The Plan does not own any underlying securities of TFLIC's general account. The Plan has guaranteed benefits under the terms of the contract. The contract value of the Plan assets invested in the SVF is reflected on the employer level fund statement. The contract value equals deposits made to the SVF, plus interest credited under the terms of the contract, less any withdrawals.

TFLIC considers the SVF to be a benefit-responsive fund. Under the terms of the contract, participants are generally permitted to make benefit distributions and transfers from the SVF to noncompeting funds at contract value, and transfers are subject to a 90-day equity wash provision.

Note 5 - Related party transactions and party-in-interest transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor ("DOL") Regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the Employers, and certain others. Certain plan investments are managed by Transamerica Life Insurance Company Inc. (the "Custodian"), and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan also allows participants to receive loans; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 6 - Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 7 - Tax status

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 - Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 - Certified investments

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, that is disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Transamerica Life Insurance Company Inc., the trustee of the Plan.

Note 10 - Nonexempt transactions

As reported on the supplemental schedule of delinquent participant contributions (Schedule H, Line 4a), certain Plan contributions were not remitted to the trust within the time frame specified by the DOL's Regulation 29 (CFR 2510.3-102), thus constituting nonexempt transactions between the Plan and the Company for the year ended December 31, 2024.
