Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the financial statements of EssilorLuxottica Retirement Savings Plan 1 (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the related notes to the financial statements.

- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. As explained in Note 6 to the financial statements, the HumanWare USA, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan; the Rosin Optical Company, Inc. Retirement Plan; the Midland Optical 401(k) Plan; the Satisloh North America, Inc. Employee Savings and Retirement Plan; the DAC Vision Incorporated 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan; and the Walman Optical Company 401(k) Plan were merged into the Plan during 2024. Our opinion has not been modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

Note 1 - Plan Description

The following description of EssilorLuxottica Retirement Savings Plan 1 (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by EssilorLuxottica USA, Inc. (the "Company"), as defined in the plan agreement. The Plan provides participants the opportunity to save for future financial needs by setting aside a portion of their compensation through payroll deductions.

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan for the purpose of making salary deferral contributions as soon as administratively practical. Employees are eligible to receive an employer safe harbor matching contribution after attaining 21 years of age and 1 year of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The EssilorLuxottica ERISA committee controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. The Plan's administrative function is being performed by Fidelity Workplace Services, LLC. Fidelity Management Trust Company serves as the trustee of the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 75 percent of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations.

Participants may also make contributions to the Plan in the form of a rollover of funds from another qualified plan.

The Plan provides for employer safe harbor matching contributions of 100 percent of the participant's contributions, not to exceed 6 percent of the employee's deferred compensation. The Company may also make annual discretionary contributions. The Company did not make any annual discretionary contributions during 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Company's contributions and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct the investments of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Investments

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Company contributions are invested according to participants' directions. All participant and company match contributions, if any, are invested directly into these elected funds.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100 percent vested in employee salary, rollover, and employer safe harbor matching contributions and any income or loss thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of service. For legacy Luxottica participants, as defined in the plan document, participants vest in the discretionary contributions made by the company 20 percent after one year of service and an additional 20 percent after each subsequent year of service, until they become fully vested after five years of service. For Vision Associates participants, as defined in the plan document, participants are immediately vested in any discretionary contributions made by the Company.

Note 1 - Plan Description (Continued)

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the excess of the highest outstanding balance of loans from the Plan during the 1-year period ending on the day before the date on which such loan was made or 50 percent of their account balances. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest based on local prevailing rates determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions over a period not to exceed 5 years, with the exception of mortgage loans, which may be repaid over 15 years.

Benefit Payments

Distributions are payable upon retirement, death, disability, termination of employment, or attainment of 59½ years of age in the form of a lump-sum amount equal to the vested balance of a participant's account.

Participants may request that all or a portion of their accounts be distributed in the case of financial hardship, as defined in the plan document.

Forfeitures

If a participant is not fully vested on his or her termination date, the nonvested amount of the account is forfeited. Forfeitures are used to reduce future company contributions or to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested account balances totaled \$1,046,168 and \$109,758, respectively.

The plan used approximately \$1,393,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024 to reduce employer contributions.

Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain plan assets are in investment funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) or its affiliates. Fidelity is the trustee, as defined by the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, as defined under ERISA guidelines. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund.

Termination

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event that the Plan is terminated, participants would become fully vested in their accounts.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value except as noted below. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

The fully benefit-responsive unallocated investment contract was valued at contract value. Contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents deposits made to the contract, plus earnings at guaranteed crediting rates, less withdrawals and fees.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are recorded at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest. Participant notes receivable are written off when deemed uncollectible.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and the Plan, as provided in the plan document.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including September 30, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Certified Information

Fidelity Management Trust Company (the "Trustee") holds the Plan's investments and participant notes receivable and executes all related transactions. The investment and participant notes receivable balances and related income and losses included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets held at end of year are based solely on information certified by the Trustee.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards require certain assets and liabilities be reported at fair value in the financial statements and provide a framework for establishing that fair value. The framework for determining fair value is based on a hierarchy that prioritizes the valuation techniques and inputs used to measure fair value.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Level 1

Fair values determined by Level 1 inputs use quoted prices in active markets for identical assets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Fair values determined by Level 2 inputs use other inputs that are observable, either directly or indirectly. These Level 2 inputs include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active, and inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset.

Level 3

Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs, including inputs that are available in situations where there is little, if any, market activity for the related asset.

In instances where inputs used to measure fair value fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy, fair value measurements in their entirety are categorized based on the lowest level input that is significant to the valuation. The Plan's assessment of the significance of particular inputs to these fair value measurements requires judgment and considers factors specific to each asset.

The following valuation methodologies have been used to value the Plan's investments:

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are valued at quoted prices reported in active markets.

Money Market Fund

The money market fund is valued at quoted prices reported in active markets.

Common/Collective Trust Funds

The common/collective trust funds are valued at net asset value per share or its equivalent of the funds, which is based on the fair value of the funds' underlying net assets. There are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments.

Note 5 - Tax Status

The Plan uses a preapproved plan. The preapproved plan has received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) indicating that the Plan, as designed, is qualified for federal income tax-exempt status. The Plan has not individually sought its own determination letter.

Note 6 - Plan Mergers

Effective March 4, 2024, the HumanWare USA, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan merged into the Plan. Accordingly, participants and their related account balances totaling approximately \$600,000 were transferred to the Plan in March 2024.

Effective March 4, 2024, the Rosin Optical Company, Inc. Retirement Plan merged into the Plan. Accordingly, participants and their related account balances totaling approximately \$4,200,000 were transferred to the Plan in March 2024.

Effective November 8, 2024, the Midland Optical 401(k) Plan merged into the Plan. Accordingly, participants and their related account balances totaling approximately \$6,200,000 were transferred to the Plan in November 2024.

Effective December 31, 2024, the Satisloh North America, Inc. Employee Savings and Retirement Plan was merged into the Plan. Accordingly, participants and their related account balances totaling approximately \$27,300,000 were transferred to the Plan in December 2024. Approximately \$300,000 of participant notes receivable were in transit at December 31, 2024 and are reflected as part of plan merger receivable on the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Effective December 31, 2024, the DAC Vision Incorporated 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan was merged into the Plan. Accordingly, participants and their related account balances totaling approximately \$6,300,000 were transferred to the Plan in December 2024. Approximately \$40,000 of participant notes receivable were in transit at December 31, 2024 and are reflected as part of plan merger receivable on the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Effective December 31, 2024, the Walman Optical Company 401(k) Plan was merged into the Plan. Accordingly, participants and their related account balances totaling approximately \$97,700,000 were transferred to the Plan in December 2024. Approximately \$1,500,000 of participant notes receivable were in transit at December 31, 2024 and are reflected as part of plan merger receivable on the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 7 - Investment Contract

At December 31, 2023, the Plan had a benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company (EAIC). EAIC maintained the contributions in a general account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The investment contract issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that was guaranteed to the Plan.

Interest was credited on contract balances using a single portfolio rate approach. Under this methodology, a single interest rate was applied to all contributions made to the product, regardless of the timing of those contributions. Interest crediting rates were reviewed on a semiannual basis for resetting but could not be less than 2 percent. When establishing interest crediting rates for this product, EAIC considered many factors, including current economic and market conditions, the general interest rate environment, and both the expected and actual experience of a reference portfolio within the issuer's general account.

Generally, there were no events that could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value paid within 90 days or, in rare circumstances, contract value paid over time. There were no events that allowed the issuer to terminate the contract and that required the plan sponsor to settle an amount different than contract value paid either within 90 days or over time. The Plan's liquidation of this contract during 2024 did not limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value during 2024.

As described in Note 2, because the contract was fully benefit responsive, contract value was the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets attributable to the investment contract. Participants could ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investments at contract value.
