NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Galati Yacht Sales, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. For more complete information, participants should refer to the Plan instrument, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Plan administrator.

General

The Plan was formed effective January 1, 2001 by Galati Yacht Sales, LLC. (the Plan Administrator). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is a defined contribution plan.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all employees, as defined in the Plan, who have completed three months of service and attained the age of 18.

Funding

Each year participants may contribute between 1% and 80% of pretax annual compensation as defined in the Plan. According to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) rules, the deferral may not exceed \$23,000 in 2024 and \$22,500 in 2023. Participants who have reached at least age 50 may contribute an additional catch-up yearly contribution of \$7,500 during 2024 and 2023. Eligible participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified benefit or contribution plans.

The employer matches 25% of the participant contribution not to exceed 5% of compensation. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, employer-provided matching contributions, allocations of employer-provided non-elective (profit sharing) contributions, Plan earnings (losses), and charged with management or service fees and allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan.

Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan. Additional administrative fees are charged by the custodian upon fund withdrawal. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

Vesting

Participant contributions are 100% vested. Employer's discretionary contributions are 25% vested after one year of service, 50% vested after two years of service, and 100% vested after three years of service. Automatic 100% vesting occurs upon attainment of normal retirement age (65), upon retirement due to disability, upon death, and upon termination of the Plan.

To have a year of service for vesting purposes, employees must complete at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year.

Investment Options

Participants may direct contributions to any of the investment options offered by the Plan. The investment options include money market funds and various stock and bond funds. The fund values are computed daily by the custodians and reflect changes in the unit values of the investments (see Note 3).

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement or separation from service with the Employers, the participant may elect to receive a single lump-sum cash payment. Also, upon reaching age 59½, participants may receive a lump-sum cash payment for any portion of their vested accounts on a yearly basis.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be used to restore other forfeitures, reduce future employer contributions, reallocate as employer contributions, or pay Plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts were \$3,055 and \$0, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeiture balances were used.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants can borrow up to 50% from the vested balance of their fund account with a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000. Note terms range from one to five years or up to 15 years for the purchase of a principal residence. Participants can only have two notes outstanding at any time. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a fixed rate commensurate with the Plan's prevailing rates at the time the note is approved. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions, therefore, they become payable in full upon termination of employment. Participant loans had outstanding balances for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 of \$59,729 and \$72,346, respectively. The participant loans have various maturities through 2036 with interest rates ranging between 4.25% and 9.50%.

Termination

Although there is no intent to do so, the Plan document provides for termination of the Plan subject to the provisions of the agreement and ERISA. If the Plan were to be terminated, all participant account balances would become immediately vested.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting and Use of Estimates

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, except that benefits are recorded when paid. The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (see Note 3). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants (see Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements).

Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Financial instruments, which potentially expose the Plan to concentrations of credit risks, as defined by GAAP, consist primarily of contributions receivable and investments. The Plan invests in mutual funds and collective investment trust, which, inherent in the fair market value determination, include the risk factor of credit worthiness for each individual debt security.

NOTE 3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

GAAP provides a framework for measuring fair value, expands disclosures about fair value measurements, and establishes a fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value summarized as follows:

Level 1: Inputs using the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

NOTE 3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methods used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 4. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 5. TAX STATUS

The Plan is exempt from Federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, therefore, no provision for Federal income taxes has been made. In addition, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain the tax-exempt status.

The master prototype plan from which the Plan was drafted received a favorable determination from the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed to operate and is currently being operated in compliance with all applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, management believes that the Plan is qualified and that the related trust is exempt from taxation under the Internal Revenue Code.

NOTE 5. TAX STATUS (Continued)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is no longer subject to such audits for tax periods prior to 2021.

NOTE 6. RELATED PARTIES AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Slavic Integrated Administration, Inc. (SIA), the Plan's third-party administrator receives fees for recordkeeping services along with participant account administrative and asset fees. The total fee paid by the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$42,255.

Slavic Mutual Funds Management Corporation (SMF), which is owned by the stockholders of SIA, is the investment advisor to the Plan. Participants, if they elect this service, are charged a quarterly advisor fee. The total fee paid by the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$26,986.

The party-in-interest transactions above are exempt from prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 7. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

The Department of Labor's (DOL) regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-102 requires that participant contributions be remitted to the Plan on the earliest date on which they can be reasonably segregated from the Company's general assets. Failure to remit participant contributions to the Plan in a timely manner results in a prohibited transaction, which must be separately reported to the DOL and may result in penalties to the Plan administrator.

During 2024, the participant deferrals totaling \$20,607 (including loan payments of \$892) were not remitted timely to the Plan due to a technical issue with the payroll provider. Subsequent to the due date, but prior to the Plan's year-end, all contributions were remitted. Correction of interest and investment gain was to be subsequently remitted. These are shown as pending correction in the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions.

NOTE 8. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through October 1, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
