Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules of Delinquent Participant Contributions and Asset (Held at End of Year) for the year ended December 31, 2024 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Liquid Trucking Companies 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the plan sponsors, OFC Development Corp., Inc., Schmidt Transportation, Inc. and Barto Trucking, LLC (collectively, the “Companies”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Effective October 17, 2024, the Plan changed trustees from Capital Bank and Trust Company to John Hancock Trust Company LLC and recordkeeper from Capital Group Retirement Plan Services to John Hancock Retirement Plan Services.

Eligibility – Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of each calendar month following completion of six months of service and attaining 19 years of age. Prior to October 17, 2024, employees were eligible to participate in the Plan after attaining the age of 21 and six months of service.

Contributions – Participants may contribute their annual compensation, not to exceed the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) through either pre-tax or after-tax Roth contributions. Participants age 50 and older by the end of the calendar year may contribute catch-up contributions. Participants may rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions, as well as the Companies' contributions, into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a target date retirement fund based on the participant's age. Effective October 17, 2024, automatically enrolled participants' deferral rates will automatically increase by 1% on each anniversary of enrollment up to a maximum of 10% or until the participant changes their deferral election. The Companies may make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan. For 2024 and 2023 the Companies discretionary matching contributions were 50% of the first 5% of eligible compensation a participant contributes to the Plan. The Companies may also make discretionary profit-sharing contributions. No discretionary profit-sharing contributions were made in 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's elective contributions and the Companies contributions, as well as an allocation of Plan earnings (losses), and a deduction of administrative fees. Allocations are based on account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their elective contributions plus actual earnings and losses thereon. Participants vest in the Companies’ contributions 20% after two years of credited service, and 20% each year thereafter, and are fully vested after six years of credited service. A year of service is defined as each plan year during which the participant completes 1,000 hours of service. Participants entire account becomes fully vested in the event the participant dies, is disabled or retirement conditions are satisfied.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of the participant's vested account balance or \$50,000. No more than one note receivable may be outstanding at any given time. The note receivable is secured by the balance in the participant's account. The interest rate on the loan will be the prime interest rate as of the date of the loan, plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions and ACH. Prepayments may be made by check. At December 31, 2024 interest rates on outstanding notes receivable ranged between 4.25% and 9.50%.

Payment of Benefits – On obtaining age 59½, termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or financial hardship, a participant may elect to receive any portion of their vested account as a lump-sum, or installment payments over a period of years not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant or the joint life expectancy of the participant and his or her designated beneficiary. If the vested account balance is \$5,000 or less, a mandatory distribution will be made and rolled over to an individual retirement account.

Forfeitures – At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$15,284 and \$34,506, respectively. These accounts are used to pay Plan administrative expenses or reduce the Companies’ contributions. During 2024 and 2023, forfeitures were used to pay plan expenses of \$31,901 and \$9,352, respectively, and \$32,195 and \$25,077 were used to reduce the Companies’ contributions during 2024 and 2023, respectively.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (“GAAP”) requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies - Continued

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payments of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Companies. Expenses paid by the Companies are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participants accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included within the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events – Plan management evaluated transactions and events occurring subsequent to December 31, 2024, and through October 6, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, to determine whether any events should be recognized or disclosed in these statements. There were no material transactions or events in the subsequent period requiring disclosure or recognition in the statements.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust (CT): Valued at NAV, based upon the market value of underlying investments, which may include separate accounts, equities, preferred stock, bonds, real estate, mutual funds, investment contracts, and security-backed contracts. The CT NAV was provided by the sponsor, Capital Bank and Trust Company, and is not a publicly quoted price in an active market.

5. Parties-in-interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by American Funds. Prior to October 17, 2024, the Plan engaged Capital Bank and Trust Company as trustee which is affiliated with American Funds; therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Effective October 17, 2024, the Plan engages John Hancock Retirement Plan Services LLC, whose responsibilities include investing assets, paying benefits to participants, and performing the recordkeeping of the Plan. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan to John Hancock Retirement Plan Services LLC qualify as party in interest transactions.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time by written notice to the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, participants become fully vested in the Companies' contributions.

7. Income Tax Status

The Plan is a pre-approved plan adopted by the Companies on October 17, 2024. On June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service stated that the plan document adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Section 401(a) of the IRC. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan. Although the Plan has since been amended, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by tax authorities. The plan administrator believes the Plan has no significant uncertain tax positions. Therefore, no provision or liability for uncertain taxes has been recorded in the financial statements.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investment options in a variety of investment securities which are exposed to various risks, such as, interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in value of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

You are responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted, and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2024. We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements and are based on your knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimate affecting the financial statement was the valuation of investments as certified by Capital Bank and Trust Company and John Hancock Trust Company LLC.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Form 5500 Procedures

We are required to obtain and read a substantially complete draft of Form 5500 prior to dating our auditor's report. The purpose of this procedure is to identify any material inconsistencies between the draft Form 5500 and the Plan's financial statements. We identified no material inconsistencies in performing and completing our audit.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in performing and completing our audit.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are clearly trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. We did not identify any misstatements.

Reportable Findings

For purposes of this letter, a reportable finding is a matter that includes one or more of the following: (1) noncompliance or suspected noncompliance with laws and regulations, (2) a finding that in our professional judgment is significant and relevant to you regarding your responsibility to oversee the financial reporting process, and (3) an indication of internal control deficiencies identified during the audit that have not been previously communicated to management by other parties and that we determined are sufficiently important to merit management's attention. See "Internal Control Deficiency Matters" below.

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, a disagreement with management is a disagreement on a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Internal Control Deficiency Matters

Except as discussed in the following paragraph, in planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of the Plan in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, we considered the Plan's system of internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control.

We were engaged to perform an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit of those financial statements as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit did not extend to investment information. Our audit also did not include a consideration of internal control relating to the investment information.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. However, as discussed below, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be significant deficiencies.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis.

A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance. We consider the following deficiencies in the Plan's internal control to be significant deficiencies:

We have prepared the financial statements; you, however, are responsible for the statements. Effective internal control is essential to prevent, detect and correct misstatements in financial statements. Preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles is a significant part of an entity's internal control. Our firm has appropriate controls over financial statement preparation; however, our controls cannot be considered as a substitute for or part of your internal control.

We consider the following to be other findings and considerations.

During audit procedures we identified nine terminated employees with an account balance subject to the Plan's mandatory distribution requirement that were not distributed from the Plan. We recommend the plan sponsor develop controls to identify such balances and work with John Hancock to make any corrective action.

During our audit procedures we identified one instance in which an employee had their PTO payout improperly excluded from eligible compensation and thus did not have the opportunity to defer on this compensation or receive the applicable match. Per the Plan document eligible compensation is defined as all W-2 wages. We recommend that the Plan Sponsor review the payroll system to ensure that the operation is consistent with the Plan document and work with John Hancock to take any necessary corrective action.

Other Matters

Our responsibility for the ERISA-required supplemental schedules accompanying the financial statements is to perform adequate procedures to evaluate whether the form and content of the ERISA-required supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, is presented in compliance with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, and whether the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).
