

Note 1: Description of the Plan

The following description of the Pacific Utility Installation, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Pacific Utility Installation, Inc. (the Company) established the Plan effective January 1, 2017. The Plan operates as a leveraged employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (IRC), as amended and is subject to applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

On January 1, 2017, the Plan purchased common stock of the Company through a term loan secured by the purchased shares, and holds the stock in a trust established under the Plan. As the Plan makes debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC.

The term loan is collateralized by the unallocated shares of the Company's common stock. The lender has no rights against shares of the Company common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the Plan. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to:

- a. the accounts of employees with rights in allocated common stock (allocated), and
- b. common stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated).

Eligibility

Employees of the Company are generally eligible to participate in the Plan once they have met the 21 years of age and one year of service, providing they worked at least 1,000 hours during such Plan year. Participants who do not have at least 1,000 hours of service during such Plan year or are not employed on the last working day of a Plan year are not eligible for an allocation of Company contributions for such year.

Contributions

The Company may make contributions in cash or dividends to the Plan in the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its term loans. The Company may also make additional discretionary cash and stock contributions to the Plan in an amount determined by the Company's Board of Directors. Employee contributions are not permitted.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions on account of death, disability, or retirement are made pursuant to the Plan in the year following the event. Distributions for other separations from service commence in the fifth plan year following the separation from service and are made in five annual installments. The amount to be distributed is based upon the immediately preceding valuation date. Distributions are made in cash or, if a participant elects, in the form of Company common stock plus cash for any fractional share of common stock.

Vesting

Vesting in the Company's contributions is based on years of service. A participant is 20% vested after two years of service, increasing 20% each year thereafter. A participant is fully vested at the earliest of six years of service, reach the mandatory retirement age, disability or death.

Voting Rights

Participants are entitled to direct the voting of any voting shares of Company stock allocated to their account with respect to any vote required for the approval or disapproval of any corporate merger, or consolidation, recapitalization, reclassification, liquidation, dissolution, or sale of substantially all the assets of a trade or business. The Committee of the Plan, appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company, is the legal representative of the Plan's assets. For all unallocated shares and for allocated shares that no voting direction has been received, the Committee shall have the right to vote these shares for the Plan.

Diversification

Participants who are at least age 55 and have at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their Company common stock balance. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a 6-year period. In each of the first 5 years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of their Company stock account. In the last, or sixth year, in which the diversification option is available, participants may elect a diversification of a cumulative amount up to 50% of their Company stock account. Participants who make this election will be offered at least three investment options. In lieu of offering such investment options, the Committee may direct that all amounts subject to participant elections under this section be distributed to qualified participants.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company common stock held by the Plan and its participants, which are not readily tradable on an established market or are subject to trading limitations, include a put option (liquidity put). The liquidity put is a right to demand that the Company buy shares of its stock held by the participant for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company may pay for the purchase with interest not exceeding a period of five years.

The purpose of the liquidity put is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash. In addition, if the Company elects to pay the purchase price of the stock option under the installment method, then the Company shall give the participant who is exercising the put option the Company's promissory note for the full unpaid balance of the purchase price. The Plan's independent trustee may, in its sole discretion, assume the Company's rights and obligations with respect to purchasing the Company common stock.

Administration of Plan Assets

The independent trustee of the Plan holds the Plan's assets and invests cash received, interest and dividend income and makes distributions to participants. The Company is the Plan Administrator. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Administrative expenses for the Trustee's fees are paid directly by the Company.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Allocations

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (“allocated”) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (“unallocated”), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and are allocated to eligible individual plan participants in the period which debt service is actually paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investments are held in the Company's common stock.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments consists of net realized gains or losses and the net unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Note 3: Parties-in-interest Transactions

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform services or have fiduciary responsibilities to the Plan. Such parties are parties-in-interest under ERISA. The Company paid certain administrative expenses of the Plan, including recordkeeping and audit fees. The Plan holds Company common stock and has related debt payable to the Company. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions for which a statutory exemption exists.

Note 4: Fair Value Measurement

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). There are three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820. Level 1 inputs are quoted market prices in active markets for identical investments that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date. Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted market prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the Plan's investments, either directly or indirectly. Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for the Plan's investments.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Company common stock - The fair value of the Company's common stock was determined by an independent appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the income and market valuation techniques. The asset-based approach was not used as it provides no consideration of earnings. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and market comparable. Plan management has concluded that a market participant would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability. This investment is classified within Level 3 of the valuation hierarchy because the asset value is not based on an active market with quoted prices and was determined using observable and unobservable inputs.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5: Investments

On January 1, 2017, the Plan purchased 1,092,500 shares of common stock from the shareholders of the Company for \$7,000,000. These shares represent 100% of the issued and outstanding stock of the Company. The purchase price was funded by a term loan from the shareholders totaling \$7,000,000, as described in Note 6. Note 6: Notes Payable

On January 1, 2017, the Plan entered into two term loan agreements totaling \$7,000,000 with the shareholders of the Company. The proceeds of the loans were used to purchase 1,092,500 shares of Company's common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loan. Shares are released from collateral and allocated to participants as payments of principal and interest are made. The number of shares released in any year is the number of shares held as collateral, times the ratio of the current year payments divided by all years' principal and interest payments. This resulted in 86,194 shares being released and allocated for the plan year ended December 31, 2024. During 2021, the Plan refinanced one of the loans by obtaining a new loan from the Company for \$3,200,000 and paying off one of the loans for \$3,500,000. The loans have interest rates of 6.5% and 4.0%. The Plan may prepay the loan at any time without penalty. The Plan must generally make the following principal and interest payments each year:

Note 7: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the Company will direct the distribution of such participant accounts in a manner permitted by the Plan.

Note 8: Tax Status

The Plan has received a determination letter dated July 16, 2018, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated the Plan and related trust, as designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan and the related trust is tax exempt.

Note 8: Tax Status, Continued

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and believes there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

Note 9: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan investments consist primarily of the Company common stock, which is exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in estimates and assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 10: Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 3, 2025, the date the Plan financial statements were available to be issued.
