Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Volvo Group North America Voluntary Investment Pretax Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Volvo Group North America Voluntary Investment Pretax Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Volvo Group North America, LLC (the Company) as of January 1, 1985. The Plan has been amended throughout the years to comply with tax legislation and was most recently restated effective January 1, 2014, and most recently amended December 18, 2024. All nonbargaining employees who are regularly employed by the Company and bargaining employees, as allowed by collective bargaining agreements, are able to participate in the Plan. The Plan is administered by the Company, and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Benefit Plans Committee is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Benefit Plans Committee.

Effective September 3, 2024, the Arrow Truck Sales, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan merged into the Plan. Assets totaling approximately \$42 million were transferred in as a result of this merger.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute to the Plan by deferring 1% to 75% of their compensation during the Plan year, up to the maximum amount allowable in accordance with Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 402(g). Employees are automatically entered into the Plan 30 days after becoming eligible with a 3% deferral contribution rate (increasing to 5% for any hired or rehired employee on or after January 1, 2021) if they do not expressly elect either to contribute an amount other than 3% or to opt out of the Plan. Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan allowed for a special automatic enrollment whereby any employee not enrolled or any participant deferring less than 5% will be enrolled in the Plan at a 5% deferral rate if they do not expressly elect either to contribute an amount other than 5% or to opt out of the Plan. Effective January 1, 2023, the Plan will include an auto escalation clause whereby a participant's deferral rate will increase 1% on January 1, 2023, and then will increase 1% on April 1 of each subsequent year until the participant's deferral rate reaches 10%. The Plan also allows for Roth contributions to be made into the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2022, for all eligible employees, the Employer match will be 100% of the employees' contributions up to 5% of their compensation during the Plan year. The Plan allows for the Company to make profit sharing contributions regardless of any current or accumulated net profits.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Automatic and Transition Contributions

Effective January 1, 2022, for all eligible employees, the Employer shall make automatic contributions as a percentage of compensation as follows:

<u>Age of Participant as of January 1</u>	<u>Percent of Compensation</u>
Up to 29	1%
30 - 34	2%
35 - 39	3%
40 - 44	4%
45 - 49	5%
50 - 54	6%
55 and over	7%

For each Plan year beginning on January 1, 2022, and ending on December 31, 2026, the Employer shall make a transition contribution of 1% of compensation for eligible participating employees provided that the employee was:

- (1) Hired before January 1, 2013, and
- (2) Ceased to earn pension benefits under the Volvo Group North America Retirement Plan (Pension Plan) as a result of the amendment to freeze benefit accruals under the Pension Plan as of December 31, 2021.

Participant Accounts

Subject to certain eligibility requirements outlined in the Plan document, participant accounts are credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's matching contributions, and an allocation of the Company's profit sharing contribution. Participant accounts are also credited with an allocation of Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled to is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant vests 20% per year and is 100% vested after five years of vesting service. Effective January 1, 2022, a participant vests one-third per year and is 100% vested after three years of vesting service. Notwithstanding the above, a participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, upon death or upon permanent disability.

Master Trust

Volvo Group North America, LLC (VGNA) has established Volvo Group North America, LLC Target Retirement Fund Trust (the Master Trust) for the Plan and other retirement plans of affiliates of VGNA. The purpose of the Master Trust is to pool investment transactions and achieve uniform rates of return on comparable funds under all the affiliated plans. The Plan deposits funds in the Master Trust and owns an undivided interest in the net assets of the Master Trust.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at market rates. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Employees may receive the value of their account as a lump sum distribution upon termination, retirement, death, or disability, or they may elect to receive their benefits payable in quarterly, semiannual, or annual installments of substantially equal amounts over a certain period of years. If a participant terminated employment and the participant's account balance was never greater than \$1,000, the Plan administrator may authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. The Plan also allows for in-service distributions or withdrawals in the case of financial hardship subject to certain restrictions.

Effective April 1, 2015, the Plan was amended to allow participants to receive their benefits payable in monthly installments of substantially equal amounts over a certain period of years.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled approximately \$1,446,200 and \$175,800, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Company contributions. Forfeitures used to reduce Company contributions totaled approximately \$627,300 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustee. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The Plan's investment in the Master Trust represents the fair value of the Plan's proportionate share of the underlying net assets of the Master Trust. The pro rata share of investment income represents the Plan's proportionate share of total investment income of the Master Trust. Investment income includes recognition and allocation of interest income, dividend income, and realized and unrealized gains and losses, based upon each participating plan's share of the underlying net assets.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Master Trust Investment Fund

The value of the Plan's interest in the Master Trust is based on the beginning of year value of the Plan's interest in the trust plus actual contributions and allocated investment income less actual distributions and allocated administrative expenses. Investment income and administrative expenses relating to the Master Trust are allocated to individual plans based upon the amount of time the Plan's assets were invested in the Master Trust.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 5, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

State Street Bank and Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan through August 31, 2024, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of notes receivable from participants and investment information reflected on the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023, and the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from January 1, 2024 through August 31, 2024.

Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustee of the Plan effective September 1, 2024, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of notes receivable from participants and investment information reflected on the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from September 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 INVESTMENT IN MASTER TRUST

The Plan and certain other employee benefit plans of AB Volvo participate in a Master Trust. The following is a summary of investments, other assets, and liabilities, at fair value, in the Master Trust and the Plan's proportionate interest in the Master Trust as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, that was certified as complete and accurate by Transamerica Trust Company (Master Trust) and State Street Bank and Trust Company (Plan's Interest in Master Trust), as trustees, and furnished to the Plan administrator.

NOTE 5 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Collective Trust Funds – Valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

NOTE 8 PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan is placing reliance on an determination letter dated January 29, 2015, in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan’s tax counsel believe the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; and the IRS is currently conducting an examination of the Plan.

NOTE 9 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The recordkeeping services and management of the investments were provided by Transamerica Retirement Solutions and Street Bank and Trust Company, the recordkeeper and the trustee of the Plan, respectively through August 31, 2024, and are now being provided by Empower Trust Company, LLC. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 10 TRANSFERS WITH OTHER PLANS

Certain employees participating in retirement plans sponsored by subsidiaries of AB Volvo may transfer their employment from one subsidiary to another. Upon transferring employment, their retirement plan balances may also be transferred to a related subsidiary’s plan. These transfers between plans are included in net transfers from affiliated plans on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.
