## Independent Auditor's Report

To the Plan Administrator and Trustees of

### 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Mary Ann Morse Healthcare Corp. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### a. General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Mary Ann Morse Healthcare Corp. (the Plan Sponsor). The Plan's Trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan, the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitoring investment performance and reports to the Plan Administrator. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### b. Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan when they reach the age of twenty-one and complete two months of service. The Plan excludes employees not expected to work 1,000 hours per year, union employees, non-resident aliens, per diem employees, and pay-in-lieu of benefit employees from participating in the Plan. Effective January 1, 2024, long-term part-time employees who worked 500 hours of service in the previous three consecutive years are eligible to participate in the Plan. Effective January 1, 2025, the SECURE Act of 2022 (SECURE Act 2.0) changed the eligibility service requirement for long-time part-time employees to 500 hours of service in the previous two consecutive years.

#### c. Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, up to the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to make post-tax (Roth) contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover contributions). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan provides for automatic enrollment deferrals whereby eligible participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan with a deferral contribution of 3% of eligible compensation, with their deferral contribution percentage automatically increasing by 1% on the first day of each subsequent plan year, up to a maximum of 6%, unless the employee elects otherwise. Participants may opt-out or elect a different deferral amount at any time.

The Plan Sponsor may make a discretionary matching contribution on behalf of all participants who have made elective contributions for the plan year. The Plan Sponsor made discretionary matching contributions of 25% of the first 6% of eligible compensation, totaling \$106,376 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan Sponsor may also make a discretionary non-elective contribution. The Plan Sponsor did not elect to make a discretionary non-elective contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### d. Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Plan Sponsor's discretionary contributions, and an allocation of plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant's earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### e. Vesting

Participants are fully vested at all times in their voluntary contributions, discretionary non-elective contributions, and earnings thereon. Participants become vested in their Plan Sponsor discretionary matching contributions based on years of service as follows:

A participant becomes fully vested upon death or disability.

#### f. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may, at their option, borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or one-half their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any time. Loan terms range from one to five years, unless for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the term may be up to fifteen years. All loans shall bear an interest rate of the prime rate plus 1% per year. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

#### g. Contributions Payable

The Plan's qualified institution recorded contributions for the plan year ended December 31, 2025, to participants accounts in 2024. The contributions amounts of \$24,717 are recorded as a liability with corresponding reductions to participant and employer contributions.

The Plan processed corrective distributions for the excess contributions of \$71 for the 2023 plan year.

#### h. Payment of Benefits

The Plan provides for a normal retirement benefit to be paid to participants who have reached the age of 65, with no option for early retirement. On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested account balance or periodic installments over a period not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant or beneficiary. The Plan requires balances up to \$1,000 to be paid out to participants upon termination and requires balances exceeding \$1,000 up to \$5,000 to be rolled over to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Effective July 1, 2024, the involuntary force out distribution limit was increased to \$7,000 per the SECURE Act 2.0.

A participant may also request a withdrawal upon demonstration to the Plan Administrator that they were suffering a "hardship". Hardship is defined in applicable regulations promulgated or to be promulgated pursuant to the applicable section of the IRC or standards established by the Secretary of the Treasury or their delegate.

### 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

#### i. Forfeitures

Forfeitures represent the non-vested Plan Sponsor discretionary matching contributions forfeited by participants who terminate their employment and withdraw from the Plan. Forfeitures may be used to reduce the Plan Sponsor's contributions or reduce plan expenses. There were \$9,013 and \$825 of unallocated forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, the Plan Sponsor used \$550 of forfeitures to pay plan expenses.

#### j. Revenue Credit Account

Pursuant to service agreements between the Plan Sponsor and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya), the qualified institution, service fees in excess of an amount defined in the agreement are credited to the Plan's revenue credit account. The revenue credit account is used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, credits to the revenue credit account totaled \$2,768. During the year ended December 31, 2023, the Plan Sponsor paid administrative expenses totaling \$2,496 from the revenue credit account. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance in the revenue credit account is \$2,126 and \$1,835, respectively, held in the fixed annuity contract.

### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of Presentation

The Plan prepares its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (U.S. GAAP) established by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). References to U.S. GAAP in these notes are to the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC).

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's pooled separate accounts are stated at fair value. Units held by the Plan in the pooled separate accounts are based on each fund's daily net asset value (NAV), which is considered by the Plan Administrator to be the best approximation of fair value. Gains and losses are recognized as incurred upon sale or maturity of investments based on market value changes during the period. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the qualified institution. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurement.

Fixed annuity contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contract because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation of investments includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. No allowances for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. As of December 31, 2024, there were no defaulted loans.

#### Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and the discretionary matching contributions from the Plan Sponsor are recorded in the year which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation. Plan Sponsor discretionary non-elective contributions are recorded when such contributions are authorized by the Plan Sponsor's Board of Trustees.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to administration of participant loans and processing of distributions, and recordkeeping are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Direct plan expenses are paid through Voya's Expense Account for Service Expenditures (EASE Account). The EASE Account is funded through revenue sharing (see Note 1j and Note 8). Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of investments.

#### Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 12, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Except as disclosed in Note 1b, there were no events that met the criteria for recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

### 3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S QUALIFIED INSTITUTION

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the qualified institution, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental schedule, Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment transactions and investment income reported in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

At the request of the Plan Administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year as of December 31, 2024.

### 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants as of the measurement date. *Fair Value Measurement* establishes a hierarchy of the valuation techniques based upon whether the inputs to those valuation techniques reflect assumptions other market participants would use based upon market data obtained from independent sources (also referred to as observable inputs).

The fair value hierarchy is as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

*Pooled separate accounts:* The pooled separate accounts are valued using the accumulation unit value which is calculated daily as the number of accumulation units held is multiplied by the accumulation unit value. The accumulation unit value is first established when a new fund starts and is then determined daily based on the NAV as a practical expedient of the shares of the underlying fund, plus the fund's dividends and less any account charges. Transactions occur daily in and out of the accounts. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value, unless it is probable that all or a portion of the pooled separate account will be sold for an amount different from NAV. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had no plans to sell the pooled separate accounts at an amount different from NAV.

There has been no change in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Investments that are measured at fair value using the NAV per share (or its equivalent) as a practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- (a) These funds' investment objective is to seek the highest total return over time with an increased emphasis on capital preservation as the target date approaches. Thereafter, an emphasis will be placed on high current income with a secondary focus on capital appreciation.
- (b) These funds seek long-term growth of capital and income. The funds invest primarily in common stocks of companies that appear to offer superior opportunities for capital growth and most of which have a history of paying dividends. They may invest significantly in securities of issuers domiciled outside the United States.
- (c) These funds seek investment results that track the total return of the common stocks that comprise the S&P Small Cap 500 Index.
- (d) The fund invests in the investments that mirror the established market indexes.
- (e) These funds' investment objective is to provide growth of capital by investing in financial service companies, foreign companies and mid- to small-cap companies.
- (f) These funds seek to allocate assets among equity, bond and money market funds based on their predetermined glide path as the fund approaches its target date, becoming more conservative prior to retirement, as time elapses.
- (g) This fund seeks current income consistent with preservation of capital and liquidity. The fund normally invests at least 99.5% of its total assets in cash, U.S. Government securities and/or repurchase agreements fully collateralized by cash or U.S. Government securities.

### 5. FIXED ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan has a fixed annuity contract with Voya. Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with participant contributions and investment income and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The fixed annuity contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

### 5. FIXED ANNUITY CONTRACT (Continued)

Because the fixed annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measure attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the fixed annuity contract. Contract value, as reported by the qualified institution, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract limits the percentage of the investment for periodic elective transfers to variable investments within the Plan during any twelve-month period.

The contract is guaranteed against loss of principal, minus all withdrawals, including charges and adjustments. The guarantee is based on the ability of the qualified institution to meet its financial obligations from the general assets of the qualified institution. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 3%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another Plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the Plan to qualify for exemption from Federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator believes that it is not probable that any events will occur that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants.

The fixed annuity contract does not permit Voya to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

### 6. TAX STATUS

The Plan Sponsor has obtained an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the restated prototype plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan Administrator timely adopted the restated prototype plan. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become fully vested and all accrued benefits shall be paid to participants in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

### **8. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Section 3(14) of ERISA defines a party-in-interest to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. Accordingly, transactions with investment funds managed and held by the qualified institution and expenses paid to the Plan's third-party administrator from plan assets are considered party-in-interest transactions. During 2024, the Plan paid administrative expenses to the qualified institution totaling \$8,296, which is presented net of \$2,768 of the revenue sharing credit from the EASE Account in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

### **9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

### **10. DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS**

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor failed to segregate and remit in a timely manner certain participant contributions (salary reduction amounts) from its assets within the required time period as specified by the United States DOL Reg. 2520.3012. Failure to segregate and remit contributions within the specified time period is a prohibited transaction. The Plan Sponsor intends to take corrective action during the 2025 plan year.

## Independent Auditor's Report

To the Plan Administrator and Trustees of  
Mary Ann Morse Healthcare Corp. 401(k) Plan:

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Mary Ann Morse Healthcare Corp. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). ### 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Mary Ann Morse Healthcare Corp. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### a. General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Mary Ann Morse Healthcare Corp. (the Plan Sponsor). The Plan's Trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan, the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitoring investment performance and reports to the Plan Administrator. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### b. Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan when they reach the age of twenty-one and complete two months of service. The Plan excludes employees not expected to work 1,000 hours per year, union employees, non-resident aliens, per diem employees, and pay-in-lieu of benefit employees from participating in the Plan. Effective January 1, 2024, long-term part-time employees who worked 500 hours of service in the previous three consecutive years are eligible to participate in the Plan. Effective January 1, 2025, the SECURE Act of 2022 (SECURE Act 2.0) changed the eligibility service requirement for long-time part-time employees to 500 hours of service in the previous two consecutive years.

#### c. Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, up to the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to make post-tax (Roth) contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover contributions). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan provides for automatic enrollment deferrals whereby eligible participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan with a deferral contribution of 3% of eligible compensation, with their deferral contribution percentage automatically increasing by 1% on the first day of each subsequent plan year, up to a maximum of 6%, unless the employee elects otherwise. Participants may opt-out or elect a different deferral amount at any time.

The Plan Sponsor may make a discretionary matching contribution on behalf of all participants who have made elective contributions for the plan year. The Plan Sponsor made discretionary matching contributions of 25% of the first 6% of eligible compensation, totaling \$106,376 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan Sponsor may also make a discretionary non-elective contribution. The Plan Sponsor did not elect to make a discretionary non-elective contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### d. Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Plan Sponsor's discretionary contributions, and an allocation of plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant's earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### e. Vesting

Participants are fully vested at all times in their voluntary contributions, discretionary non-elective contributions, and earnings thereon. Participants become vested in their Plan Sponsor discretionary matching contributions based on years of service as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vesting Percentage</u>
Less than 2 Years	0%
2 Years	20%
3 Years	40%
4 Years	60%
5 Years	80%
6 or more Years	100%

A participant becomes fully vested upon death or disability.

#### f. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may, at their option, borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or one-half their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any time. Loan terms range from one to five years, unless for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the term may be up to fifteen years. All loans shall bear an interest rate of the prime rate plus 1% per year. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

#### g. Contributions Payable

The Plan's qualified institution recorded contributions for the plan year ended December 31, 2025, to participants accounts in 2024. The contributions amounts of \$24,717 are recorded as a liability with corresponding reductions to participant and employer contributions.

The Plan processed corrective distributions for the excess contributions of \$71 for the 2023 plan year.

#### h. Payment of Benefits

The Plan provides for a normal retirement benefit to be paid to participants who have reached the age of 65, with no option for early retirement. On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested account balance or periodic installments over a period not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant or beneficiary. The Plan requires balances up to \$1,000 to be paid out to participants upon termination and requires balances exceeding \$1,000 up to \$5,000 to be rolled over to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Effective July 1, 2024, the involuntary force out distribution limit was increased to \$7,000 per the SECURE Act 2.0.

A participant may also request a withdrawal upon demonstration to the Plan Administrator that they were suffering a "hardship". Hardship is defined in applicable regulations promulgated or to be promulgated pursuant to the applicable section of the IRC or standards established by the Secretary of the Treasury or their delegate.

#### i. Forfeitures

Forfeitures represent the non-vested Plan Sponsor discretionary matching contributions forfeited by participants who terminate their employment and withdraw from the Plan. Forfeitures may be used to reduce the Plan Sponsor's contributions or reduce plan expenses. There were \$9,013 and \$825 of unallocated forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, the Plan Sponsor used \$550 of forfeitures to pay plan expenses.

#### j. Revenue Credit Account

Pursuant to service agreements between the Plan Sponsor and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya), the qualified institution, service fees in excess of an amount defined in the agreement are credited to the Plan's revenue credit account. The revenue credit account is used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, credits to the revenue credit account totaled \$2,768. During the year ended December 31, 2023, the Plan Sponsor paid administrative expenses totaling \$2,496 from the revenue credit account. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance in the revenue credit account is \$2,126 and \$1,835, respectively, held in the fixed annuity contract.

### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of Presentation

The Plan prepares its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (U.S. GAAP) established by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). References to U.S. GAAP in these notes are to the FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC).

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's pooled separate accounts are stated at fair value. Units held by the Plan in the pooled separate accounts are based on each fund's daily net asset value (NAV), which is considered by the Plan Administrator to be the best approximation of fair value. Gains and losses are recognized as incurred upon sale or maturity of investments based on market value changes during the period. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the qualified institution. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurement.

Fixed annuity contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contract because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation of investments includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. No allowances for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. As of December 31, 2024, there were no defaulted loans.

#### Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and the discretionary matching contributions from the Plan Sponsor are recorded in the year which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation. Plan Sponsor discretionary non-elective contributions are recorded when such contributions are authorized by the Plan Sponsor's Board of Trustees.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to administration of participant loans and processing of distributions, and recordkeeping are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Direct plan expenses are paid through Voya's Expense Account for Service Expenditures (EASE Account). The EASE Account is funded through revenue sharing (see Note 1j and Note 8). Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of investments.

#### Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 12, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Except as disclosed in Note 1b, there were no events that met the criteria for recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

### 3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S QUALIFIED INSTITUTION

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the qualified institution, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental schedule, Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment transactions and investment income reported in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

At the request of the Plan Administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year as of December 31, 2024.

### 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants as of the measurement date. *Fair Value Measurement* establishes a hierarchy of the valuation techniques based upon whether the inputs to those valuation techniques reflect assumptions other market participants would use based upon market data obtained from independent sources (also referred to as observable inputs).

The fair value hierarchy is as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

*Pooled separate accounts:* The pooled separate accounts are valued using the accumulation unit value which is calculated daily as the number of accumulation units held is multiplied by the accumulation unit value. The accumulation unit value is first established when a new fund starts and is then determined daily based on the NAV as a practical expedient of the shares of the underlying fund, plus the fund's dividends and less any account charges. Transactions occur daily in and out of the accounts. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value, unless it is probable that all or a portion of the pooled separate account will be sold for an amount different from NAV. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had no plans to sell the pooled separate accounts at an amount different from NAV.

There has been no change in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Investments that are measured at fair value using the NAV per share (or its equivalent) as a practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- (a) These funds' investment objective is to seek the highest total return over time with an increased emphasis on capital preservation as the target date approaches. Thereafter, an emphasis will be placed on high current income with a secondary focus on capital appreciation.
- (b) These funds seek long-term growth of capital and income. The funds invest primarily in common stocks of companies that appear to offer superior opportunities for capital growth and most of which have a history of paying dividends. They may invest significantly in securities of issuers domiciled outside the United States.
- (c) These funds seek investment results that track the total return of the common stocks that comprise the S&P Small Cap 500 Index.
- (d) The fund invests in the investments that mirror the established market indexes.
- (e) These funds' investment objective is to provide growth of capital by investing in financial service companies, foreign companies and mid- to small-cap companies.
- (f) These funds seek to allocate assets among equity, bond and money market funds based on their predetermined glide path as the fund approaches its target date, becoming more conservative prior to retirement, as time elapses.
- (g) This fund seeks current income consistent with preservation of capital and liquidity. The fund normally invests at least 99.5% of its total assets in cash, U.S. Government securities and/or repurchase agreements fully collateralized by cash or U.S. Government securities.

### 5. FIXED ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan has a fixed annuity contract with Voya. Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with participant contributions and investment income and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The fixed annuity contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

### 5. **FIXED ANNUITY CONTRACT** (Continued)

Because the fixed annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measure attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the fixed annuity contract. Contract value, as reported by the qualified institution, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract limits the percentage of the investment for periodic elective transfers to variable investments within the Plan during any twelve-month period.

The contract is guaranteed against loss of principal, minus all withdrawals, including charges and adjustments. The guarantee is based on the ability of the qualified institution to meet its financial obligations from the general assets of the qualified institution. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 3%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another Plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the Plan to qualify for exemption from Federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator believes that it is not probable that any events will occur that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants.

The fixed annuity contract does not permit Voya to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

### 6. **TAX STATUS**

The Plan Sponsor has obtained an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the restated prototype plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan Administrator timely adopted the restated prototype plan. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### 7. **PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become fully vested and all accrued benefits shall be paid to participants in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

### **8. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Section 3(14) of ERISA defines a party-in-interest to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. Accordingly, transactions with investment funds managed and held by the qualified institution and expenses paid to the Plan's third-party administrator from plan assets are considered party-in-interest transactions. During 2024, the Plan paid administrative expenses to the qualified institution totaling \$8,296, which is presented net of \$2,768 of the revenue sharing credit from the EASE Account in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

### **9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

### **10. DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS**

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor failed to segregate and remit in a timely manner certain participant contributions (salary reduction amounts) from its assets within the required time period as specified by the United States DOL Reg. 2520.3012. Failure to segregate and remit contributions within the specified time period is a prohibited transaction. The Plan Sponsor intends to take corrective action during the 2025 plan year.
