Opinion

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Tri Dal Excavation & Utilities, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the “Plan”), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

Tri Dal Excavation and Utilities, Inc. (the “Company”) established the Plan effective as of January 1, 2016. The Plan is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (“IRC”) and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

On October 14, 2016, the Plan purchased 1,000,000 shares of the Company’s common stock, becoming the sole shareholder of the Company, in exchange for a note payable. The Plan holds the common stock in a trust (the “Trust”) established under the Plan. The stock was purchased at a price of \$48 per share, for an aggregate purchase price of \$48,000,000. As the Plan makes debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock is allocated to eligible employees’ accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC.

The note payable is secured by a pledge by the Trust of the unallocated shares of the Company held by the Trust. The Company has no rights against shares of the Company once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the Plan. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to the accounts of employees with vested rights in allocated common stock (allocated), and common stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated).

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after completion of one year of service (1,000 hours of service in a 12-month period), provided they are at least 18 years of age.

The Plan is administered by the Company. The duties of the Plan Administrator are to oversee the operations and administration of the Plan in accordance with the specific terms of the Plan and to keep accurate records and reports. Blue Ridge ESOP Associates is the Plan’s record keeper. Greatbanc Trust Company was appointed Trustee. The Trustee and record keeper may be removed by the Company or may resign. In any such event, the Company will appoint a successor.

Contributions

Each year, the Company may make a discretionary contribution to the Plan. The contribution may never be less than the amount required to pay the note payable entered into by the Plan and/or current expenses of the Trust. If a contribution is made, the contribution will be allocated to each eligible participant in a ratio determined by the participant’s compensation. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. The Plan does not permit participant contributions or rollovers of participant money into the Plan.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant’s account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company’s common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants’ non vested accounts. Participants who have completed 1,000 hours of service in the plan year for which the contribution is made who are eligible employees of the Company and employed on the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant’s account based on the ratio of the participant’s account balance.

Vesting

Vesting in each participant’s account is based on years of vesting service, as defined in the Plan. A participant is 100 percent vested after three years of credited service. Full and immediate vesting will also occur upon normal retirement age (age 65), death (if employed by the Company), or disability (if employed by the Company), as defined in the Plan. Participants who leave the Company before they are fully vested in the Company’s contributions forfeit their non-vested portion.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Payment of Benefits

A participant's or beneficiary's time of payment is based on the amount of the participant's vested account balance and the election made by the participant or beneficiary. If a participant's vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Trustee, as directed by the Plan Administrator, shall distribute the participant's vested account balance in a lump sum payment. If a participant's vested account balance exceeds \$1,000 but does not exceed \$5,000, and the participant does not elect to receive a distribution, the Plan Administrator will direct the Trustee to pay the distribution in a direct rollover to an individual retirement plan designated by the Plan Administrator. If the participant's vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant must consent, in writing, to any distribution of his or her vested account balance. If the participant whose vested account balance exceeds \$5,000 and that participant elects to have his or her vested account balance paid to him or her upon separation from service, and the participant experiences a separation from service by reason of death, disability, or retirement, the Plan Administrator will direct the Trustee to commence distribution of the participant's vested account balance no later than one year after the close of the plan year in which such event occurs. The Trustee will commence distribution of a participant's vested account balance who separates from the Company for any reason other than death, disability or retirement no later than one year after the close of the fifth plan year following the plan year in which the participant separated from service. Unless a participant affirmatively elects to delay distribution in writing to a later date, if a participant whose vested account balance exceeds \$5,000 does not consent to an earlier distribution, the Trustee will commence distribution of the participant's vested account balance not later than sixty days after the plan year in which the latest of following occur:

- (i) the participant reaches his normal retirement date
- (ii) the participant's tenth anniversary of the year in which the participant commenced participating in the Plan
- (iii) the participant separates from service.

A participant with a vested account balance that exceeds \$1,000 is generally entitled to receive a distribution as a lump sum payment, a direct rollover into an eligible retirement plan. The Plan Administrator may, at its sole discretion, distribute the participant's vested account balance attributable to Company stock in substantially equal installments over a period not to exceed five years. The distribution period may be extended based on the balance in the participant's account. Participants are not entitled to demand distribution in the form of Company stock. Distribution of a participant's Company stock account shall be made in cash.

The amount to be distributed is based upon the account valuation date immediately preceding the distribution. Distributions are made in cash or, if a participant elects, in the form of Company common stock plus cash for any fractional share of common stock. Benefits are recorded when paid and totaled \$332,078 and \$435,674 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Included in the Plan's assets at December 31, 2024 and 2023 are benefits totaling \$1,024,006 and \$214,729 allocated to participants who have elected to withdraw from the plan but have not yet been paid.

Administrative Expenses

As provided in the Plan agreement, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company.

Voting Rights

The Trustee is required to vote all Company stock held by it as part of the Plan assets at such time and in such manner as the Administrator shall direct. Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the Trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by the Administrator.

Put Option

Under Federal income tax regulations, the employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the current value of the stock.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may, during the first 90 days following the end of each plan year, elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a 6-year period. In each of the first 5 years, a participant may diversify up to 25 percent of the value of the account balance held in Company stock, less any amounts previously withdrawn. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50 percent.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to reinstate previously forfeited account balances of inactive participants, if any, or are added to any employer contribution made for the Plan year in which such forfeitures occur, allocated each year among the accounts of participants otherwise eligible to share in the allocation of discretionary contributions in the same proportion that each such participant's compensation for the year bears to the total compensation of all such participants for the year. Forfeitures of terminated non vested account balances allocated to remaining participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$14,763 and \$2,387, respectively.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the significant accounting policies consistently applied in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements follows:

Method of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

In preparing financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, management is required to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan investment consists solely of the Company's common stock, which is exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The shares of Company common stock are stated at fair value. Changes in market value are reflected in operations. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on the trade-date basis. The net appreciation (depreciation) of investments includes realized gains and losses on sales during the period and current changes in unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in the market value of investments held at year end.

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA and the IRC. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated October 31, 2017, stating that the Plan is qualified under the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed, and being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. NOTE PAYABLE

On October 14, 2016, the Company issued 1,000,000 shares of common stock to the Plan in exchange for a note payable of \$48,000,000 (the “ESOP Loan”) and the Plan became the sole shareholder of the Company. The ESOP Loan is secured by a pledge by the Trust of the shares of the Company issued to the Plan. The ESOP Loan will be paid in twenty-five equal annual installments of principal and interest commencing on December 31, 2016. Interest accrues on the ESOP Loan at a rate of 1.95% per annum. Payments made on the ESOP Loan shall be made solely out of contributions made by the Company and its subsidiaries and affiliates, dividends and distributions paid on the shares held by the Plan, or the proceeds of any subsequent loan made to repay the ESOP Loan. As the ESOP Loan is repaid, shares are released from collateral and allocated to active employees, based on the proportion of debt service paid in the year. The note payable balance is \$32,121,119 and \$33,813,973 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

9. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

10. RECENT ACCOUNTING PRONOUNCEMENTS

In July 2025, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) issued Accounting Standards Update (“ASU”) 2025-05, Financial Instruments – Credit Losses (Topic 326): Measurement of Credit Losses for Accounts Receivable and Contract Assets. This amendment simplifies the estimation of expected credit losses for current accounts receivable and contract assets arising from revenue transactions under Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 606, such as contributions receivable. The amendment provides a practical expedient to assume current economic conditions remain unchanged over the life of these assets when estimating credit losses, without incorporating macroeconomic forecasts. Additionally, non-public entities may elect to consider cash collections received after the balance sheet date, but before financial statement issuance, in their loss estimates. ASU 2025-05 is effective for the fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2025, with early adoption permitted, and requires prospective application.

The Plan is currently assessing the impact of this recent accounting pronouncement will have on its financial statements.

11. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 22, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
