We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Teague Nall and Perkins, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONT'D.)

Note 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Teague Nall and Perkins, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. The Plan is sponsored by Teague Nall and Perkins, Inc. (the "Company"). Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The purpose of the Plan is to encourage the Company's employees to systematically save and invest a portion of their current compensation so that they and their families may have a source of additional income upon their retirement or in the event of death.

General - The Plan, established January 1, 1987 and last restated August 1, 2021, is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company, except for union employees, leased employees, and non-resident aliens with no earned income in the United States, who have completed one month of service. Participants may begin participating in the Plan the first day of the month for which eligibility is met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Effective August 1, 2021, the Company adopted the Ascensus LLC Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan With CODA and The Vanguard Group's investment platform.

Plan Administration – The Plan is administered by the Board of Directors of the Company, and certain principals and executive officers of the Company serve as trustees of the Plan.

Effective August 1, 2021, Ascensus, LLC ("Ascensus") became responsible for the recordkeeping and administration of the Plan assets. Vanguard Group, Inc. ("Vanguard"), holds the Plan's investment assets and executes investment transactions in keeping with an agreement between Ascensus, LLC (an entity owned by Ascensus, Inc.) and Vanguard.

Contributions – Participants may contribute up to 100 percent of their pre-tax eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan. Newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a deferral rate of three percent of eligible compensation until the employee changes this election or opts out of the Plan. Participants may elect to contribute to the Plan on a pre-tax basis through traditional 401(k) deferrals or on an after-tax basis through Roth 401(k) deferrals. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participants may contribute up to the amount permitted by IRS regulations, which was \$23,000 and \$22,500 in 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants who meet certain age requirements are also permitted to make catch-up contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions of an additional \$7,500 in 2024 and 2023. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contribution into various investment options provided by the Plan.

The Company may make a discretionary match of 50% of the first 15% of compensation that a participant contributes during the Plan year on a per paycheck basis. Employees are immediately eligible on the date of entry to the Plan. In addition to the discretionary match, the Company may make discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan, which will be allocated to each participant's account as defined by the Plan. No profit-sharing contributions

occurred in 2024 or 2023. All Company contributions are invested at the direction of the participant.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan Document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options - Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct his or her contributions and Company contributions to any of the available investment options, which are comprised of mutual funds and a money market account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus or minus actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in any Company contribution portion of their accounts plus or minus actual earnings or losses thereon is based on years of service. A participant vests 20% each year after one year of credited service on any Company contributions until fully vested. Additionally, participants or their beneficiaries become immediately and fully vested in their Company contributions and related earnings upon full and permanent disability or death.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. A participant may have no more than one loan outstanding at one time. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, plus 1%, as of the date of the loan. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits - Participants who withdraw from the Plan during the year for reasons of military service, disability, retirement, death, or termination are entitled to their vested account balance. In addition, a participant may withdraw any part of his or her vested account after obtaining 59 ½. Payment of benefits to participants with balances less than \$1,000 will be made in a lump-sum distribution. Payments of benefits to participants with balances greater than \$1,000 can be made in either lump sum or installment payments. The non-vested portion of a terminated participant's account is generally forfeited and applied to increase further Company contributions. Hardship distributions may be made from the participant's elective deferral accounts in the Plan while the participant is still employed based on specific Plan provisions.

Forfeited Accounts - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$64,769 and \$73,536 respectively. This account may be used to reduce the Company's contributions, pay Plan expenses, or reinstate previously forfeited account balances of rehired participants. During 2024, \$22,316 of Plan expenses were paid from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Note 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a distribution based on the terms of the Plan document.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits - Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Expenses – Employees of the Company perform certain administrative functions for the Plan with no compensation from the Plan. In accordance with the provisions of the Plan, the Company pays a portion of the expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan, including costs relating to asset charges and recordkeeping and such expenses are not reimbursed by the Plan nor reflected in the accompanying financial statements. Expenses paid by the Plan are allocated to all participant accounts on a pro-rata basis or are charged directly to participant accounts for fees associated with establishment of a loan or a benefit payment. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Recent Accounting Pronouncement and Law Changes – On December 29, 2023, the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act (the "Secure Act") 2.0 was signed into law. The SECURE Act 2.0 is intended to expand coverage, increase retirement savings, and clarify retirement plan rules. The SECURE Act 2.0 changed existing long-term retirement rules, which included but is not limited to, increasing the age for required minimum distributions, expanding autoenrollment features, increasing the involuntary distribution limit, expanding penalty-free withdrawals, and providing enhanced opportunities for employee savings. The effective dates vary by each provision; however, the Plan will be formally amended to reflect these changes prior to the January 1, 2025 deadline.

Subsequent Events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 3, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - TAX STATUS

As a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan with CODA, the Company intends that the Plan and trust qualify under the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the prototype sponsor by a letter

dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 4 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditor not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Ascensus, LLC, the custodian of the Plan, as complete and accurate, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian with information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedules:

Note 5 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There were no changes in the valuation methodology for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money market funds: The reported value of the money market funds is the cash balance which approximates fair value. The valuation is classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 7 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by The Vanguard Group. The Plan uses The Vanguard Group's investment platform; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan paid \$26,331 in fees to The Vanguard Group during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not formally expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in the employer contribution portion of their account.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements and supplemental schedules, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP. Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards, as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our letter to you dated June 16, 2025. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

Significant Audit Matters

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

You are responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2024. We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Form 5500 Procedures

We are required to obtain and read a substantially complete draft of Form 5500 prior to dating our auditor's report. The purpose of this procedure is to identify any material inconsistencies between the draft Form 5500 and the Plan's financial statements. We identified no material inconsistencies in performing and completing our audit.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in performing and completing our audit.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all misstatements identified during the audit, other than those

that are clearly trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. You have corrected all such misstatements.

Reportable Findings

For purposes of this letter, a reportable finding is a matter that includes one or more of the following: (1) noncompliance or suspected noncompliance with laws and regulations, (2) a finding that in our professional judgment is significant and relevant to you regarding your responsibility to oversee the financial reporting process, and (3) an indication of internal control deficiencies identified during the audit that have not been previously communicated to management by other parties and that we determined are sufficiently important to merit management's attention. We identified the following reportable finding:

1. **Accuracy of Employee Data:** During our audit, we noted discrepancies between information listed on the Employee Census and in the personnel files, relating to employee data, such as date of birth, hire date and termination date. The information submitted to the Plan and the third party administrator (TPA) is used by the TPA to determine certain attributes of the employee, such as Plan entry, employer matching eligibility, vesting, in-service and required minimum distribution (RMD) eligibility, and forfeiture balances. As such, failure to keep and relay accurate employee data to the TPA may result in the status or eligibility of an employee being incorrectly determined. We recommend that employee data entered into the payroll system is reviewed to ensure it agrees with supporting documents in the personnel files. The accuracy of both new employee data and annual Census data should also be reviewed by an individual other than the preparer before it is sent to the TPA.

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, a disagreement with management is a disagreement on a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Other Matters

With respect to the ERISA-required supplemental schedule accompanying the financial statements, we made certain inquiries of management and evaluated the form, content, and methods of preparing the information to determine that the information complies with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the method of preparing it has not changed from the prior period, and the information is appropriate and complete in relation to our audit of the financial statements. We compared and reconciled the ERISA-required supplemental schedule to the underlying accounting records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves.

This information is intended solely for the use of the Plan Administrator and management of the Teague Nall and Perkins, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan and is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than these specified parties.
