Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of ABC Company 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. Note 1. Plan Description

Associated Clinic of Psychology (the Company) established the Associated Clinic of Psychology 401(k) Plan (the Plan), a defined contribution plan adopted under section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code, to provide retirement income and other benefits to qualified employees. The following is not a comprehensive description of the Plan, and therefore, does not include all situations and limitations covered by the Plan. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Plan Operations

The Company is the sponsor and administrator of the Plan, Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (the Custodian) is responsible for holding the assets of the Plan, executing investment transactions and making disbursements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following 6 months of employment if they have attained the age of 21. The following employees are excluded from the Plan: leased employees, union employees, and reclassified employees.

Contributions

Each year, eligible employees can contribute an amount up to 100 percent of compensation as defined in the Plan, limited by requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the IRC). The Company makes "safe harbor" contributions to the plan equal to 3% of compensation for all eligible employees. In addition, the Company may make discretionary non-elective contributions to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. The Plan also accepts rollover contributions from participants.

Participants may direct the investment of the contributions into various investment options under the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's matching and non-elective contributions and (b) Plan earnings. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and discretionary contributions portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant's account vests at the rate of 20% per year after one year of credited service and is 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, death, disability or retirement, a participant (or the participant's beneficiary in the case of death) will receive the vested portion of his or her account as a lump-sum payment. Hardship distributions during employment are permitted.

Investments

Participants may direct their accounts to be invested in one or more mutual funds maintained in a pooled separate account at Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company. The funds range from low-risk guaranteed interest accounts to high-risk international growth funds.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$1 and \$1, respectively. Forfeitures can be used to reduce future employer contributions to the Plan. In 2024, \$255 of forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions.

Expense Budget Account

At December 31, 2024, unallocated nonvested accounts totaled \$1,055. Funds from the expense budget account can be used to reduce fees.

Participant Loans

Participant loans are not permitted.

Administration

Certain members of the Company serve as Plan Trustees. Certain Plan expenses are absorbed by the Company at the Company's discretion.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenue and expense during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company. See Note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net gain from investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded upon distribution.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in various combinations of investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risk factors including, but not limited to, interest rates, market conditions and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Assets Available for Benefits in future periods.

Note 3. Information Certified by the Custodians

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by **Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company**, the custodian of the Plan.

Note 4. Plan Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax period in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

Note 5. Termination of Plan

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

Note 6. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of and insurance pooled account. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the pooled separate account, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal in order to ensure that securities liquidation will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
