### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Western Nevada Supply Company 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C)" audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

### **Note 1: Description of Plan**

The following description of the Western Nevada Supply Company (the “Company”) 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

**General:** The Plan is a defined contribution plan established on July 1, 1994, and was subsequently amended and restated on March 26, 2021. The Plan provides benefits for eligible employees of the Company and WN Mechanical Systems, Inc., a related company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

The Company is the Plan administrator and retains the services of third parties to assist in the administration of the Plan. Through December 31, 2024, the Plan’s trustee, third-party administrator, and recordkeeper was Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”).

**Eligibility:** Except for excluded employees, all employees who have reached twenty-one years of age are eligible to participate in the Plan. Eligibility requirements exclude employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement (unless the agreement requires the employees to be included under the Plan), residents of Puerto Rico, and nonresident aliens who do not earn any U.S. income. Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month subsequent to becoming eligible. An employee may elect not to participate in the Plan.

**Participant contributions:** Participants may elect to contribute up to 90% of their eligible compensation to the Plan, subject to the maximum allowed under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Participants who have attained the age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make “catch-up” contributions, subject to statutory limitations. Participants are also permitted to deposit into the Plan distributions received from other plans (rollovers). Deferrals consist of pre-tax 401(k) contributions and Roth 401(k) contributions. The Plan agreement has an automatic enrollment feature for all eligible employees to allow for an automatic deferral of 3% of the participant’s compensation thirty days after date of hire, unless the employee opts out or makes a different election. Participants who are auto-enrolled are subject to a 1% deferral increase each July 1<sup>st</sup> until the percentage reaches a maximum elective deferral of 8%.

**Employer matching contributions, net:** The Company may, at its sole discretion, make annual employer matching and non-elective contributions to eligible participants at the option of the Company’s Board of Directors. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company has implemented a match of 50% of deferred compensation for eligible participants, up to a maximum of \$7,000. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made total discretionary matching contributions of approximately \$887,000, or approximately \$870,000 (net of forfeitures).

**Participant accounts:** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, and allocations of: (a) the Company's matching contribution, (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Investment options:** The Plan provides for investments to be directed by participants into a number of investment options held by the trustee. Participant investment options include a variety of mutual funds and a money market fund. Some Plan investments are units of funds managed by the trustee, therefore, these investments and most investment transactions are party-in-interest transactions. Earnings of each investment fund are allocated to participants' accounts in proportion to each participant's share of that fund.

**Vesting:** Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. The employer's matching contributions and non-elective contributions vest at a rate of 25% per year starting after the first full year of service. Should a participant's employment be terminated before their account is fully vested, the non-vested portion of the account will be forfeited.

**Notes receivable from participants:** Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested portion of the participant's individual account, whichever is lower. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable interest rate set by the Plan administrator. Loan terms range from one to five years, but may not exceed five years, except for loans used for a purchase of a primary residence, which may be repaid over a longer period. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of benefits:** On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or separation from service, participants may receive benefits in a lump sum payment, in accordance with the Plan. Unless otherwise instructed by the participant, participants with vested account balances of \$1,000 or less upon separation will receive a lump sum cash payout, and participants with vested account balances ranging from \$1,000 to \$7,000 will automatically be rolled over to an individual retirement account ("IRA").

As an active participant in the Plan, a participant may, upon attaining the age of 59 ½, request the distribution of his or her balance. In addition, a participant may apply for a hardship withdrawal, if he or she is experiencing an immediate heavy financial need as defined by the specific criteria of the Plan.

**Forfeited accounts:** Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and, if elected by the Company, will be used to pay administrative expenses or used to reduce employer contributions. Forfeitures remaining in the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were approximately \$20,000 and \$29,000, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, approximately \$18,000 of employer contributions were reduced by Plan forfeitures.

**Administrative expenses:** Substantially all administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan. Separate fees for loan processing and certain investments as specified in the service agreement, are charged to individual participant's accounts.

### **Note 2: Significant accounting policies**

**Basis of accounting:** The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). Contributions from participants are recorded when withheld from the participant. Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

**Use of estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements and accompanying notes and schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment valuation and income recognition:** The Plan's investments are stated at their fair values. The shares of registered investment companies (mutual funds) are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset values of shares held by the Plan at year end. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The money market fund is valued at cost plus accrued interest, which approximates fair value. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Fair value measurements:** The Plan performs fair value measurements in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures. Refer to Note 3 for the fair value measurement disclosures associated with the Plan's investments.

**Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments:** The earnings, expenses, realized gains and losses, and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in registered investments companies and other investments are recorded in the accompanying financial statements as net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

**Subsequent events:** The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued which is the date of the independent auditors' report.

### **Note 3: Fair value**

The Plan performs fair value measurement in accordance with ASC 820 which defines fair value as the price that would be received from selling an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The accounting guidance for fair value measurement requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The standard establishes a fair value hierarchy based on the level of independent, objective evidence surrounding the inputs used to measure fair value. A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The fair value hierarchy is as follows:

- Level 1: quoted prices in active market for identical assets or liabilities;
- Level 2: inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities; or
- Level 3: unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Fidelity, the trustee of the Plan, as complete and accurate, except for comparing such information to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

### **Note 5: Party-in-interest transactions**

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held investments of approximately \$40,190,000 and \$34,414,000, respectively, in mutual funds and a money market account managed by Fidelity. Fidelity is the trustee as defined by the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

### **Note 6: Plan termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contribution account balances.

### **Note 7: Income tax status**

The prototype plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the prototype plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Subsequent to receiving this opinion letter, the prototype plan was amended. The Plan administrator believes that the amended prototype plan, as adopted by the Company, is operating in compliance with the requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

### **Note 8: Risks and uncertainties**

The Plan provides for investments in various investment securities which, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits and participant account balances.

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Western Nevada Supply Company 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C)" audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### ***Opinion on the Financial Statements***

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

#### ***Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA***

### **Note 1: Description of Plan**

The following description of the Western Nevada Supply Company (the “Company”) 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

**General:** The Plan is a defined contribution plan established on July 1, 1994, and was subsequently amended and restated on March 26, 2021. The Plan provides benefits for eligible employees of the Company and WN Mechanical Systems, Inc., a related company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

The Company is the Plan administrator and retains the services of third parties to assist in the administration of the Plan. Through December 31, 2024, the Plan’s trustee, third-party administrator, and recordkeeper was Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”).

**Eligibility:** Except for excluded employees, all employees who have reached twenty-one years of age are eligible to participate in the Plan. Eligibility requirements exclude employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement (unless the agreement requires the employees to be included under the Plan), residents of Puerto Rico, and nonresident aliens who do not earn any U.S. income. Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month subsequent to becoming eligible. An employee may elect not to participate in the Plan.

**Participant contributions:** Participants may elect to contribute up to 90% of their eligible compensation to the Plan, subject to the maximum allowed under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Participants who have attained the age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make “catch-up” contributions, subject to statutory limitations. Participants are also permitted to deposit into the Plan distributions received from other plans (rollovers). Deferrals consist of pre-tax 401(k) contributions and Roth 401(k) contributions. The Plan agreement has an automatic enrollment feature for all eligible employees to allow for an automatic deferral of 3% of the participant’s compensation thirty days after date of hire, unless the employee opts out or makes a different election. Participants who are auto-enrolled are subject to a 1% deferral increase each July 1<sup>st</sup> until the percentage reaches a maximum elective deferral of 8%.

**Employer matching contributions, net:** The Company may, at its sole discretion, make annual employer matching and non-elective contributions to eligible participants at the option of the Company’s Board of Directors. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company has implemented a match of 50% of deferred compensation for eligible participants, up to a maximum of \$7,000. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made total discretionary matching contributions of approximately \$887,000, or approximately \$870,000 (net of forfeitures).

**Participant accounts:** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, and allocations of: (a) the Company's matching contribution, (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Investment options:** The Plan provides for investments to be directed by participants into a number of investment options held by the trustee. Participant investment options include a variety of mutual funds and a money market fund. Some Plan investments are units of funds managed by the trustee, therefore, these investments and most investment transactions are party-in-interest transactions. Earnings of each investment fund are allocated to participants' accounts in proportion to each participant's share of that fund.

**Vesting:** Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. The employer's matching contributions and non-elective contributions vest at a rate of 25% per year starting after the first full year of service. Should a participant's employment be terminated before their account is fully vested, the non-vested portion of the account will be forfeited.

**Notes receivable from participants:** Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested portion of the participant's individual account, whichever is lower. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable interest rate set by the Plan administrator. Loan terms range from one to five years, but may not exceed five years, except for loans used for a purchase of a primary residence, which may be repaid over a longer period. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of benefits:** On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or separation from service, participants may receive benefits in a lump sum payment, in accordance with the Plan. Unless otherwise instructed by the participant, participants with vested account balances of \$1,000 or less upon separation will receive a lump sum cash payout, and participants with vested account balances ranging from \$1,000 to \$7,000 will automatically be rolled over to an individual retirement account ("IRA").

As an active participant in the Plan, a participant may, upon attaining the age of 59 ½, request the distribution of his or her balance. In addition, a participant may apply for a hardship withdrawal, if he or she is experiencing an immediate heavy financial need as defined by the specific criteria of the Plan.

**Forfeited accounts:** Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and, if elected by the Company, will be used to pay administrative expenses or used to reduce employer contributions. Forfeitures remaining in the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were approximately \$20,000 and \$29,000, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, approximately \$18,000 of employer contributions were reduced by Plan forfeitures.

**Administrative expenses:** Substantially all administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan. Separate fees for loan processing and certain investments as specified in the service agreement, are charged to individual participant's accounts.

### **Note 2: Significant accounting policies**

**Basis of accounting:** The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). Contributions from participants are recorded when withheld from the participant. Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

**Use of estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements and accompanying notes and schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment valuation and income recognition:** The Plan's investments are stated at their fair values. The shares of registered investment companies (mutual funds) are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset values of shares held by the Plan at year end. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The money market fund is valued at cost plus accrued interest, which approximates fair value. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Fair value measurements:** The Plan performs fair value measurements in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures. Refer to Note 3 for the fair value measurement disclosures associated with the Plan's investments.

**Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments:** The earnings, expenses, realized gains and losses, and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in registered investments companies and other investments are recorded in the accompanying financial statements as net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

**Subsequent events:** The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued which is the date of the independent auditors' report.

### **Note 3: Fair value**

The Plan performs fair value measurement in accordance with ASC 820 which defines fair value as the price that would be received from selling an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The accounting guidance for fair value measurement requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The standard establishes a fair value hierarchy based on the level of independent, objective evidence surrounding the inputs used to measure fair value. A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The fair value hierarchy is as follows:

- Level 1: quoted prices in active market for identical assets or liabilities;
- Level 2: inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities; or
- Level 3: unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Fidelity, the trustee of the Plan, as complete and accurate, except for comparing such information to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

### **Note 5: Party-in-interest transactions**

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held investments of approximately \$40,190,000 and \$34,414,000, respectively, in mutual funds and a money market account managed by Fidelity. Fidelity is the trustee as defined by the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

### **Note 6: Plan termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contribution account balances.

### **Note 7: Income tax status**

The prototype plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the prototype plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Subsequent to receiving this opinion letter, the prototype plan was amended. The Plan administrator believes that the amended prototype plan, as adopted by the Company, is operating in compliance with the requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

### **Note 8: Risks and uncertainties**

The Plan provides for investments in various investment securities which, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits and participant account balances.
