## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

**Note 1: Description of Plan**

The following description of the Crutchfield Corporation (“Company”) Profit Sharing Plan (“Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement or Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

*General.* The Plan is a defined contribution plan, established January 1, 1977 by the Company to provide retirement security for eligible employees. It covers all employees who have completed 1,000 hours of service. On August 27, 1996, the Plan was amended to allow employee contributions under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code. The 401(k) portion of the Plan covers all employees who have completed thirty days of service. The Plan is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees is responsible for oversight of the plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

*Contributions.* Each year, the Board of Directors of the Company determines its contribution to the Plan. Each employee may contribute a portion of his or her salary up to the limits prescribed by law. 401(k) participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds.

*Participant Accounts.* Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (a) the Company’s contribution, (b) plan earnings (losses), and (c) forfeitures of terminated participants’ nonvested accounts, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

*Vesting.* Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company contributions portion of their accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after 3 years of credited service.

*Payment of Benefits.* On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account, or installments over a period not to exceed the life expectancies of the participant and his or her beneficiary. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-

sum distribution. The total amount allocated to persons who elected to withdraw from the plan but had not been paid as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$345,705 and \$0, respectively.

*Forfeited Accounts.* At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$201,107 and \$104,256, respectively. These accounts will be allocated to participants in the same manner as employer contributions.

*Loans to Participants.* Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Interest rates are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through semi-monthly payroll deductions.

*Parties in Interest.* The Plan engages in various types of business transactions with companies and individuals considered parties in interest under ERISA Section 3(14). The Plan has agreements with the following parties in interest: Crutchfield Corporation pays certain fees on behalf of the Plan and provides the services of its employees for the administration of the plan; Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company provides custodial, investment, administrative, and compliance testing services, Milestone Investments provides advisory services; and Thomas Hancher & Company provides independent auditing services.

**Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

*Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements are presented on the modified cash basis of accounting, whereby contributions to be made by the plan sponsor and excess contributions payable to participants are accrued, but all other income and expenses are recognized when received and disbursed, respectively.

*Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements requires that the plan administrator make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the

measurement date. Shares of regulated investment companies are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

*Notes Receivable from Participants*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The specific identification method is used with respect to uncollectible loans. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment (distribution) based on the terms of the Plan document. There is, therefore, no provision for delinquent accounts.

*Excess Contributions Payable*

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions (participant deferrals). The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

*Expenses*

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of participant loans are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of the fair value of investments.

*Payment of Benefits*

Benefits are recorded when paid.

*Date of Management's Review*

Management has reviewed subsequent events through October 2, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. No events have occurred since the balance sheet date that would have a material impact on the financial statements.

The Plan's investments, consisting entirely of mutual funds (including investments bought, sold, and held during the year), increased in value by \$9,631,596 in 2024 and increased in value by \$10,714,914 in 2023.

**Note 4: Fair Value Measurements**

ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identified assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include —

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices which are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the methodologies used by the Plan for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Values at quoted market prices on the active market on the date on which the securities are traded, which represents the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation which may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**Note 5: Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan would be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

**Note 6: Tax Status**

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended and restated since receiving that determination letter, the plan administrator and Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and is tax-exempt. No provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, the plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

**Note 7: Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
