INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Trustees and Administrators of the Sizzling Steak Concepts 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the Sizzling Steak Concepts 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024, the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Sizzling Steak Concepts 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024 stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Notes to Financial Statements**

December 31, 2024

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Sizzling Steak Concepts 401(k) Plan (the Plan) became effective February 1, 2008 as a retirement plan for employees of the Sizzling Steak Concepts, Inc. (the Sponsor). The Plan was restated in December 2024 from a multiple employer plan to a single employer plan and changed custodian and trustees. The Plan Sponsor is a member of a controlled group who also participate in the Plan upon adoption of the Plan.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Sponsor who are 21 years of age or older and have completed six months of service in which they worked at least 500 hours, as defined in the Plan agreement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Plan Administration – The Company is the administrator of the Plan and, as such, carries out the duties imposed by ERISA. The Company has delegated certain responsibilities for the operation and administration of the Plan. The Standard Insurance Company (Standard) and Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (Principal) (collectively, the Trustees) are responsible for the custody and management of the Plan's assets during 2024. At December 31, 2024, Principal maintains participant accounts and transactions related to participant-initiated activity.

Contributions – Participants are permitted to contribute their annual compensation on a pre-tax or after-tax Roth basis, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions up to the annual limit determined by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans and may direct the investment of their contributions into various options offered by the Plan.

The Company may make matching contributions to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the matching contribution was equal to 50% of the employee's elective salary deferral up to 6% of the employee's eligible compensation.

Participants' Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Plan earnings. The accounts are set up in participant-directed, individual accounts administered by the Plan trustee. Contributions and earnings or losses are credited to the accounts as the amounts are received by the trustee. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Investment Options – Participants direct the investment of their contributions into selected investment products offered by the Plan trustees. The investment options include fixed income accounts and various income, growth, value, blend, and international mutual fund accounts. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their accounts attributable to salary deferrals and rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in profit sharing contributions and any qualified non-elective contributions that may be made by the Company are based upon years of continuous service as follows:

Less than 2 years	0%
2 years of service	25%
3 years of service	50%
4 years of service	75%
5 years of service	100%

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are payable to participants or designated beneficiaries upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment, and are entitled to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in their account. Benefits may also be distributed in the event of a participant’s immediate and heavy financial need. Such distributions, which are considered hardship withdrawals, cannot exceed the amount required to relieve the financial need.

Participant Loans – The Plan allows participants to borrow up to two loans from their fund accounts. The minimum loan balance is \$1,000 and can be up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of: (1) \$50,000 minus the highest outstanding balance of loans in the past 12 months, or (2) one-half the present value of the participant’s account balance, subject to approval of the loan application. The interest rate is based on Prime +1%. Loans are repaid within a five-year period, unless the loan was made to acquire a primary residence, in which case the loan may be repaid over a 30-year period, consistent with commercial lending practices.

Forfeitures – If a participant terminates employment and is less than 100% vested in Employer matching contributions, the participant will forfeit the non-vested portion of the account. These accounts may be used to reduce future Employer contributions or pay Plan administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024, the forfeiture balance was \$13,200.

Plan Termination – Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right, under terms of the Plan, to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates in the Preparation of Financial Statements – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value except for its investment in the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option, which is valued at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an ordinary transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value represents contributions made under contract, plus interest, less withdrawals and administrative expenses. The Plan designates contract value as the only required measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and eliminates fair value measurement and certain disclosures.

Registered investment company funds held by the Plan are valued at fair value based on the daily closing price as reported by the funds. All of the registered investment company funds are open-ended and are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These registered investment company funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Pooled separate accounts are reported at the value reported to the Plan by the insurance company, which represents the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the accounts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net increase (decrease) includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Plan Administration Costs – Administrative expenses of maintaining the Plan may be paid by the Company or the Plan, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Certain administration fees are charged directly to the participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net increase (decrease) of fair value of investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events – Management has evaluated, for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements, subsequent events that have occurred through October 8, 2025, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN TRUSTEES

The Plan administrator, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of ERISA. Accordingly, the Trustees, determined to be qualified institutions by the Plan administrator, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the Schedule of Assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Accordingly, as requested by the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditor performed no procedures on the certified information other than to agree the certified information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4 – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted the non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan with CODA sponsored by Principal (the pre-approved plan). The IRS informed Principal by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that its pre-approved plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC and is appropriate for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and is tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

NOTE 5 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value accounting guidance establishes a framework for measuring fair value, which provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plans have the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology other than quoted prices included in Level 1 are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, and include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets,
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets,
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Below is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

Pooled Separate Accounts – Pooled separate accounts assign units of participation to the investor and through those units of participation, investors share in the gains and losses of all investments in the pooled account. Principal Life uses a unit value system of recordkeeping to track its obligations regarding the pooled separate accounts. Unit value means the dollar value for one unit. Contributions and transfers to the separate account increase the separate account's outstanding units. Payments, deducted expenses, and transfers from the separate account decrease the separate account's outstanding units. Pooled separate accounts are included in the fair value hierarchy table as level 2 investments.

Registered Investment Company Funds – Registered investment company funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024. The methods described above could produce a fair value calculation that is not indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan administrator believes these valuation methods are appropriate, the use of different methodologies or assumptions could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date.

NOTE 6 – CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (GIC) with Principal Life Insurance Company. Principal maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The GIC issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than zero percent. Such interest rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The GIC does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Because the GIC is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measure for the GIC. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract value of the investment contract, the Principal Fixed Income Guarantee Option, was \$601,164 at December 31, 2024. The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer’s ability to meet financial obligations. The issuer’s ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (2) a material misrepresentation, or (3) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

The Plan administrator does not believe that events, such as are described above, are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers, limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants, or result in termination of the contracts of the Plan with the issuer, or settle at an amount different than contract value.

NOTE 7 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE 8 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ERISA defines party-in-interest similar to a related party under U.S. GAAP, except that ERISA's definition is broader and includes all entities and individuals that provide services to the Plan; however, these entities may not necessarily be related parties. Plan management did not identify any related parties to the Plan that were not also considered to be parties-in-interest. The Plan did not enter into any material related party transactions during the Plan year related to compensation, arrangements, expense allowances or similar items.

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, and an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

The Company pays certain fees and expenses on behalf of the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan has included in its investment fund options certain funds managed by the Trustees or one of the Trustees' affiliates. Transactions in these funds are considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. Such transactions are permitted under provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.
