1 Description of Plan

The following description of the Cargill Employee Retirement Account Plan (the Plan) of Cargill, Incorporated and Associated Companies (the Company) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan began on January 1, 2007.

(a) General

The Plan is a qualified defined-contribution retirement plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The purpose of the Plan is to stimulate employee savings for future financial security.

The Plan is funded by discretionary contributions from the Company based on age and service. Contributions are held in a trust fund and are separate from the Company assets.

Participants are eligible to participate if hired or rehired by the Company on or after January 1, 2007 and are a U.S. employee with salaried benefits. Participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan on their date of hire. Unvested participants in the Cargill, Incorporated and Associated Companies Salaried Employees' Pension Plan under the age of 40 as of December 31, 2006 also became participants of the Plan on January 1, 2007. Participants are eligible to receive their vested account balance upon retirement, termination of employment, death, or total and permanent disability.

(b) Trust Agreement and Plan Administration

The investment assets of the Plan are held in the Cargill Employee Retirement Account Plan Trust (Trust), with Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company (the Trustee).

Recordkeeping for the Plan is outsourced to The Vanguard Group (Vanguard). Participants' accounts are revalued each day the New York Stock Exchange is open for trading.

(c) Contributions

The Company may make a discretionary contribution to the Plan on participants' behalf each plan year. Participant age and service are used to determine the Company's contribution and allocation to participant accounts. Participants must be employed on the last day of the plan year to receive an allocation unless their employment is terminated due to death, disability, or retirement on or after age 55. The contribution will be made following the plan year.

The Vanguard Target Retirement Trust Select Funds are “one decision” funds that simplify investing for retirement. The participant can choose the one fund nearest to his/her expected year of retirement (2070, 2065, 2060, 2055, 2050, 2045, 2040, 2035, 2030, 2025, or 2020). As that date approaches, the fund gradually and automatically reduces risk by shifting from stocks to bonds. The Vanguard Target Retirement Income Trust Select maintains a fixed allocation intended to provide retirees with income while preserving their original investment.

Participants may invest in one or more funds in multiples of 1% to 100% of the amount being invested. Unless specified otherwise, contributions made on participants' behalf will be automatically invested in the Vanguard Target Retirement Fund that most closely matches the year in which participants reach age 65.

A participant will automatically become 100% vested upon death, total disability, or upon retirement as defined in the plan document. Forfeitures of nonvested accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures used to offset employer contributions and plan expenses were \$19,613 and \$1,855,567, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance of forfeitures were \$18,667 and \$81,050, respectively.

Participants are 100% vested in their plan accounts after completing three years of service.

(d) Benefit Payments and Withdrawals

Benefit payments and withdrawals may be made upon the members reaching the early or normal retirement date or due to termination, disability, death, or hardship. Early retirement date is the first of the month in the month that a participant attains age 55 with three or more years of service. Normal retirement date is the date on which a participant attains age 65. On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, installment payments – monthly (12 payments per year), quarterly (four payments per year), semiannually (two payments per year), or annually (one payment per year), or partial payments. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution or installment payments – monthly (12 payments per year), quarterly (four payments per year), semiannually (two payments per year), or annually (one payment per year).

2 Summary of Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

(b) Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value with changes recorded in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for the discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation and depreciation, which include realized and unrealized gains and losses, are determined and applied daily according to market changes.

(c) Expenses

Trustee and certain other administrative expenses are paid by the participants out of Plan assets. Other administrative expenses are paid by the Company.

(d) Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

(e) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements, in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual amounts could differ from those estimates.

(f) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investment in a variety of investment funds. Investments in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant accounts and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

3 Information Certified by Trustee

The Trustee holds the Plan's investment assets, executes and collects transactions therein pursuant to discretionary authority granted to the Trustee concerning purchases and sales of investments in the Trust fund, and collect the related net investment return.

The Trustee has provided the plan administrator with certifications as to the completeness and accuracy of investment assets investment returns of the Plan as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, as outlined in the following table:

4 Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below.

Basis for fair value measurement:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices of similar or identical assets in markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of valuation methodologies used for investment assets held and carried at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Mutual funds – Valued daily based on quoted prices from national exchanges and commonly used third-party pricing services. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
- Common/collective trusts (CCTs) – Valued utilizing the respective net asset values as reported by such trusts, which represents readily determinable fair value, and are reported at fair value.
- Brokerage Option – The brokerage option consists of actively traded mutual funds, common stock, and common/collective trusts that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices, and cash.
- Stable value funds – The unit value is calculated at the end of each business day. The unit value is based on the fair value of the investment contract fund's holdings divided by the total number of outstanding units to obtain a daily unit value (NAV). The NAV is considered to be the readily determinable fair value. The funds have a daily redemption frequency and a daily redemption notice period.

4 Fair Value Measurements (cont.)

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5 Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest tax determination letter dated October 20, 2017, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and the Trust created thereunder was exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(a). The Plan has been amended since this determination letter. However, the Company believes the Plan, as amended, continues to meet the requirements of Section 401(a) of the Code and the related Trust is exempt from income tax under Section 501(a) of the Code. Therefore, no provisions for income taxes have been made.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6 Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

7 Party-in-Interest Transactions

Transactions resulting in plan assets being transferred to or used by a related party are prohibited under the ERISA unless a specific exemption applies. Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company, Trustee of the Plan, is a party-in-interest, as defined by ERISA, as a result of investing plan assets in certain of their funds. However, such transactions are exempt under Section 408(b)(8) and are not prohibited by ERISA.

8 Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events from the statement of net assets available for benefits date through September 15, 2025, the date at which the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined there are no other items to disclose.
