Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Morehouse College Defined Contribution Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency ("qualified institution"), provided that the investment information is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 8 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section -

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).



Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Morehouse College Defined Contribution Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

A. General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") covering all employees of Morehouse College (the "College"), except individuals working less than twenty hours per week and student employees. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the first of the month following date of hire. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Morehouse College Fiduciary Committee oversees governance of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

The College is responsible for the general administration of the Plan. The only investment products that are available to 403(b) plans are registered investment companies, such as mutual funds, which are held in custodial accounts, and annuity contracts including insurance company pooled separate accounts. The Plan's investments are held by Teachers Insurance Annuity Association of America - College Retirement Equities Fund ("TIAA-CREF") and Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company ("VALIC").

B. Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Additionally, participants with at least 15 years of service with the College are eligible for an optional "15-year Catch-Up." Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various registered investment company funds and annuity contracts, including a pooled separate account, as investment options for participants. All participants, beginning on the first day of the month following 30 consecutive days of employment, will receive a nonelective employer contribution equal to 3% of their compensation. Additionally, participants receive an employer matching contribution equal to 1% if an employee contributes 2% and 3% if an employee contributes 5%. Contributions are subject to certain statutory limitations.

As of December 31, 2015, participants ceased making contributions to VALIC. The assets have not been transferred to another custodian. VALIC continues to maintain custody over these assets in the Plan.

C. Participants' Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with (i) the participant's contributions, (ii) the College's contributions and (iii) the participant's account earnings. Each participant's account is charged with (i) the participant's withdrawals, (ii) the participant's account losses and (iii) an allocation of administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

D. Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their voluntary contributions and the College's nonelective and matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Forfeited non-vested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$21,671 and \$20,626, respectively.

E. Payment of Benefits

A participant may withdraw up to a maximum of 100% of elective deferrals and rollover contributions in the event of a participant's heavy and immediate financial hardship, as defined in the Plan agreement. Hardship distributions cannot exceed the amount of the participant's financial hardship and may not be repaid by the participant.

The Plan Administrator may be required by law to recognize obligations the participant incurs as a result of court-ordered support or alimony payments. The Plan Administrator must honor a qualified domestic relations order ("QDRO"). If a QDRO is received by the Plan Administrator, all or a portion of the participant's account balance may be used to satisfy the obligation.

In-service withdrawals of all or a portion of a participant's vested account balance may be withdrawn by a participant after reaching age fifty-nine and one-half. In-service withdrawals of all or a portion of a participant's rollover account balance may be withdrawn at any time.

Upon termination of service, retirement, disability, or death, a participant or beneficiary may receive the value of the account through a lump sum distribution, installments over a period not to exceed the remaining life expectancy of the participant or his or her beneficiary, an annuity contract, or ad-hoc distributions.

Distributions from the Plan will normally be subject to income taxes and in certain circumstances may also be subject to Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") penalties, unless the distribution is transferred to another qualified plan or individual retirement account.

F. Plan Loans

Plan loans are permitted from TIAA-CREF annuity accounts under the Plan to the extent permitted by the governing annuity documents and applicable law. The loan program is administered by TIAA-CREF. A portion of the participant's account is reserved, or held as collateral, to cover the outstanding loan in case of default. Loans are issued directly from funds owned by TIAA-CREF and not directly from a participant's account. For all such loans, interest and principal are paid by the participant directly to TIAA-CREF. These loans are not considered assets of the Plan and, therefore, are not reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits. However, the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) reflects the collateral associated with non-distributable loans in default status. The interest rate is determined by TIAA-CREF and may be fixed or variable. These TIAA-CREF loans amounted to \$84,783 and \$151,369 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

G. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested balance or \$50,000. Participants are allowed to have up to three outstanding loans at a time. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1.00% and range from 4.25% to 9.50% for the year ended December 31, 2024. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

B. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles ("U.S. GAAP") requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

C. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments, other than fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Fiduciary Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by its investment advisors and the certifying entities. See Note 3 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in Plan funds were deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, these management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

D. Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid by the Plan.

E. Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

F. Administrative Expenses

The College pays certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan including legal, accounting, and Plan administration. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan totaled \$82,154 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

G. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

H. Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through October 6, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no Plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 inputs for the periods presented.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies and money market account: Fund holdings are generally valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing services, except those held by the money market funds, whose holdings are valued at amortized cost. These funds are valued using the net asset value ("NAV") held by the Plan at year-end. The fair values of accumulation units held by the Plan in TIAA-CREF registered investment companies are based on each account's daily NAV. TIAA-CREF accounts are not all exchange-traded but are classified within Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy because they are redeemable daily at the NAV quoted by TIAA-CREF. Data for NAVs are available daily to the Plan Administrator and Plan participants on NASDAQ's website and provides sufficient corroborated evidence to ascertain the relationship between each fund's NAV and the values of individual underlying holdings. Underlying holdings are primarily valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources.

Pooled separate account ("PSA"): The TIAA Real Estate Account is a variable annuity and invests mainly in real estate and real estate-related investments. The fair value of the Plan's interest in the TIAA Real Estate Account (a pooled separate account) is based on the fund's published NAV. Plan participants may redeem quarterly. The unit value of the fund is calculated daily and available to Plan administrators and Plan participants on NASDAQ's website, and thus is classified as Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy. Underlying holdings are primarily valued using independent appraisals or independent pricing sources. There are no unfunded commitments from participants in the Plan who invest in the account.

Traditional non benefit-responsive annuity account: Valued at contract value, which approximates fair value. The contract value of the TIAA Traditional Annuity equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contracts less any withdrawals. The TIAA Traditional Annuity is not available for sale or transfer on any securities exchange. Transfers from the TIAA Traditional Annuity Account are also restricted. Participants may only transfer between investment options in substantially equal amounts over a 10-year period or a 5-year period dependent upon which account has been selected. Accordingly, transactions in similar investment instruments are not observable, and thus are classified within Level 3 of the fair value hierarchy.

Variable annuity contracts: Investments are held in separate accounts that include mutual funds valued at NAV per share at the close of each business day as reported by each fund, which is then adjusted for dividends and separate account fees. This value is deemed equivalent to NAV, which is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The accounts allow for daily redemptions and contributions. There are no unfunded commitments from participants in the Plan who invest in the contracts.

The methods described above may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while Plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. ANNUITY CONTRACTS

The Plan has benefit-responsive annuity contracts with TIAA-CREF and benefit-responsive fixed annuity contracts with VALIC. TIAA-CREF and VALIC maintain the deposits in unallocated general funds to which they add interest at the contract rate and charge participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The annuity contract issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

For the annuity contracts that are fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the annuity contracts. The benefit-responsive contracts are presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by TIAA-CREF and VALIC, represents contributions made under the contracts plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 1%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a monthly or annual basis for resetting.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes in the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (1) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, (3) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or (4) a material misrepresentation. The Plan Administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are not probable of occurring.

The annuity contracts do not permit the insurance companies to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

5. TAX STATUS

The College entered into an adoption agreement of the TIAA Simplified ERISA 403(b) Volume Submitter Plan (the "Volume Submitter Plan"). The Volume Submitter Plan received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS on August 7, 2017, which stated that the Volume Submitter Plan and related trust were designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the latest opinion letter and has not obtained an updated opinion letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and that the Plan was qualified and tax exempt as of December 31, 2024, and has no income subject to unrelated business income tax. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

TIAA-CREF and VALIC perform services for, sell products to, and manage and maintain certain investments for the Plan for which fees are charged to the Plan. The Plan has a revenue credit account with TIAA-CREF held in the TIAA Traditional Annuity Benefit - Responsive investment, which is funded through a revenue sharing agreement with TIAA-CREF. During 2024, no funds were used to pay administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balances available in the revenue credit account were \$131,760 and \$91,945, respectively. Party-in-interest transactions also include notes receivable from participants.

Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has expressed no intent to do so, the College has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.
