Note A - Description of the Plan

The following description of Naturescape 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Naturescape 401(k) Retirement Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Naturescape (the "Company") and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). All employees, unless specifically excluded, who have completed at least three months of service with the Company, as defined in the Plan, are eligible to participate in the Plan. Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employer and employee contributions to any combination of available investment options.

Contributions

Participants may make voluntary contributions to the Plan. Contributions are limited to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also make after-tax Roth contributions. The combined pretax and Roth contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make "catch-up" contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers).

The Company elected to contribute a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 200% of the participant's elective deferral up to 6% of the participant's compensation. The Company may also make discretionary matching contributions and profit-sharing contributions as determined by the Company on an annual basis. The Company made safe harbor contributions of \$703,205 for the year ended December 31, 2024. There was no discretionary matching or profit sharing contributions made during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution and Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in the account balances of their salary deferral, rollover contributions and the Company's safe harbor matching contributions. In the event of termination of employment, a participant is entitled to receive a percentage of the amount in their Company matching and profit-sharing contributions based on the number of years of service prior to such termination. Participants become 100% vested in Company matching contributions and Company profit sharing contributions after three years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan administrator may direct the custodian of the Plan to make loans to active participants. The minimum loan amount that can be taken is \$1,000 and the maximum loan amount is limited to 50% of the participant's vested account balance less any existing loan balance or \$50,000 less the participants highest outstanding loan balance in the past twelve months, whichever is less. The interest rate on all loans is determined by the Plan administrator at the inception of the loan and is fixed for the duration of the loan. Interest rates are commensurate with local prevailing rates.

Note A - Description of the Plan (Continued)

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, disability, or death, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her vested account. Vested balances less than \$1,000 are automatically paid in a lump-sum to the participant. In addition, a participant may withdraw all or a portion of his or her account balance prior to termination in the event of financial hardship and attaining age 59 ½.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or plan administrative expenses. During 2024, no forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions or plan administrative.

Expense Budget Account

The Plan maintains an unallocated expense budget account (EBA) which is used to pay allowable expenses of the Plan. The EBA is funded through deductions of participants' account balances. Administrative expenses of \$61,854 for the year ended December 31, 2024 is net of \$35,377 in Plan expenses paid from the EBA. The balance in the expense budget account was \$3,147 and \$2,828 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note B - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes both realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan and totaled \$61,854 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 1, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note C - Certification of Investment Information

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Transamerica Life Insurance Company Inc. (the "insurance company" of the Plan).

Note D - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note D - Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Pooled separate accounts are similar to mutual funds except they are issued by insurance companies and are not publicly traded like mutual funds. Each plan's share of a pooled separate account is determined on a participation-unit or variable-unit basis. The plan's equity account provides a cumulative record of the number of participation units credited to the account and the number of units allocated or withdrawn from the account. The balance of participation units credited to the account, multiplied by the current participation-unit value equals the amount of equity account assets held on behalf of the policyholder at any given time. The participation-unit value is adjusted periodically, usually each business day, to reflect investment results under the separate account.

Note E - Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Transamerica Life Insurance Company. The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The investment objective of the Stable Value Option is to provide stability of principal with a declared interest rate credited to participant account balances. This investment choice is not guaranteed by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or any other governmental agency. The net crediting rate was 1.65% from January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with Transamerica and is reviewed every six months for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and with participants are probable of occurring.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include the following: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

Note F - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contribution accounts.

Note G - Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan Committee by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note H - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note I - Related-Party Transactions

The Plan investments are held, invested and maintained by Transamerica Life Insurance Company, the asset custodians and recordkeepers, as applicable, as defined by the Plan, and third-party administrative services are performed by Northwestern Wisconsin Associates, Inc. These services qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The fees for these services paid by the Plan were approximately \$23,624 for the year ended December 31, 2024.
