Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Pepé Motors Corporation 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Pepé Motors Corporation 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

### **Other Matter—Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA**

The supplemental schedule H, Line 4i-Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting

and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

#### A. Description of Plan

The following description of the Pep'e Motors Corporation 401(k) Plan (The Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more comprehensive description of the Plan's provisions.

- 1) *General.* The Plan is a defined-contribution plan covering all full-time employees of the Company who have three months of service and are age 21 or older. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Effective April 15, 2024, the Plan was amended to allow both pretax and Roth deferrals.
- 2) *Contributions.* Each year, participants may contribute up to 100 percent of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants are also able to designate part or all of their contributions as Roth 401(k) contributions, which are made on an after-tax basis. In addition, participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.
- 3) *Participant Accounts.* Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.
- 4) *Vesting.* Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon.
- 5) *Investment Options.* Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employee contributions in various percent increments in any of several mutual fund investment options. Participants may change their investment options in their self directed brokerage accounts.
- 6) *Participant Notes Receivable.* Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant notes fund. Loan terms range from one to five years or up to fifteen years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with the prime rate published in the Wall Street Journal plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions.

- 7) *Payment of Benefits.* On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or as an annuity. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. As part of The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES), participants could take a larger amount of a coronavirus related distribution, with multiple years repayment terms, and allowed suspension of 2020 required minimum distributions, as defined. The Plan adopted the provisions of CARES in April 2020.
- 8) *Forfeited/ Cash Holding Accounts.* At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was \$41,660 and \$16,599, respectively in the forfeiture account. The amounts consisted of uncashed checks which were negotiated in subsequent years. Any remaining amounts will be used to reduce future Plan expenses.
- 9) *Recent Legislation.* The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement ("Secure") Act was enacted in December 2019 and became effective January 1, 2020. The Secure Act was designed to encourage investing for retirement by increasing the required minimum distribution age and making certain other changes to certain tax-qualified retirement plans. On December 29, 2022, Congress officially passed the SECURE 2.0 Act. The act contained required and optional provisions aimed at improving coverage and savings with effective dates ranging from immediate to 2024 and beyond. The legislation is aimed at helping Americans better prepare for their financial future while strengthening the retirement system as a whole for both employers and employees. Principal areas of the act addressed participant saving assistance, required minimum distributions (RMD), catch-up contributions and lost participants. There are provisions which are currently part of the Plan design, including the provisions designed to assist with participant savings, automatic enrollment, and the RMD provisions required for 2023, which have already been adopted by the Plan. Additional provisions of the SECURE 2.0 Act will be evaluated and implemented in accordance with future regulations and guidance, and the Plan will be amended as applicable.

#### B. Summary of Accounting Policies

##### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting, whereby income is recorded when earned and expenses are recorded when incurred.

##### Investment Valuation Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note F for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

In May 2015, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued ASU 2015-07, Fair Value Measurement (Topic 820) Disclosures for Investments in Certain Entities that Calculate Net Asset Value per Share or Its Equivalent, which removes the requirement to categorize within the fair value hierarchy all investments for which fair value is measured using the net asset value per share practical expedient. The ASU was effective for the Plan on January 1, 2017. Management has determined based on the expanded definition of Readily Determinable Fair Value Per ASU 2015-10, Technical Corrections and Improvements, that net asset value of the mutual funds does not qualify as a practical expedient and such investments should continue to be included in the fair value hierarchy.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by Pepé Motors Corporation (the Company) and therefore excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

#### Subsequent Events

Management evaluated subsequent events for potential disclosure in or adjustment to the Plan's financial statements through September 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Based on such evaluation, no events have occurred that, in the opinion of management, warrant recognition in the financial statements or disclosure in the notes to the financial statements. Also, as a result of the COVID-19 coronavirus, economic uncertainties have arisen that could result in a negative impact to the Plan's financial statements. An estimate of the potential financial impact is unknown at this time.

#### Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, if any, at the date of the financial statements, and additions to and deductions from net assets available for benefits during the period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

#### Advance of Participant Contributions

Amounts credited to participants for contributions applicable to a subsequent plan year are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. Participant deferrals for the January 3, 2025 payday were conveyed to the Plan on December 31, 2024.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2024. See Note J for discussion of the 2024 excess contributions payable.

Other Income

Other income consists of reimbursed expenses for 2024. There was no Other income reported for 2023.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit risk are part of the holdings in Plan's investments. Management believes that American Funds Capital Bank and Trust Company maintains the Plan's investments with high credit quality institutions and attempts to limit the credit exposure to any particular investment.

Financial Instruments

The financial instruments shown as assets in the statements of net assets available for benefits are traditional in nature. Investments in mutual funds, which are recorded on a trade-date basis, are carried at fair value in accordance with Accounting Standards Codification 820, "Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures" (ASU 820). The carrying value of all other financial instruments, including receivables and payables, approximate their fair values.

**C. Information Certified by Trustees (Unaudited)**

Plan investments held by American Funds Capital Bank and Trust Company, which consist primarily of mutual funds, are stated at fair value. Fair value of shares of mutual funds represents the net asset value of such shares as of the close of business at the end of the period.

The following is a summary of the Plan's investment information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the years then ended, included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedules, that was prepared by, or derived from, information prepared by American Funds Capital Bank and Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, and furnished to the Plan management. The Plan management has obtained certifications from the trustee that such information is complete and accurate. Accordingly as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditor not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information which appears throughout the financial statements and supplemental schedules related to the following assets at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

**D. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would be 100 percent vested in their accounts.

**E. Tax Status**

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by certain taxing jurisdictions; however there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**F. Investments and Fair Value Measurements**

The Fair Value Measurements Topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820, Fair Value Measurement, are briefly described below:

- Level 1     Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2     Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets, and inputs that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the financial instrument.
- Level 3     Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Cash-money market fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The money market fund is an open-end mutual fund that is registered with the SEC. This fund is required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The money market fund held by the Plan is deemed to be actively traded.

Mutual Funds: Shares of mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

**G. Risks and Uncertainties**

The plan invests in various investments. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**H. Unallocated Assets and Liabilities**

The total value of participants account balances as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 consist of the investments at fair value. Amounts relating to cash, participant contributions receivable, notes receivable from participants, advance of participants' contributions, and excess contributions payable are not reflected in the participants account balances but are reflected in the net assets available for benefits per the financial statements. **I. Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions**

The Plan's investments are managed by American Funds Capital Bank and Trust Company. American Funds Capital Bank and Trust Company is the trustee and record keeper for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and quarterly account maintenance are included in administrative expenses. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations. The above mentioned party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

**J. Excess Contributions Payable**

As of December 31, 2024, the Plan had recorded excess contributions payable of \$134,652, which relates to the failed average deferral percentage for the 2024 Plan year. As of December 31, 2024, refunds payable to highly compensated employees included employee contributions of \$114,154, as increased for related investment gains of \$20,498. These amounts are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to 2024 contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the participants subsequent to the Department of Labor's prescribed due date of March 15, 2025.

In September, 2025, the Company filed IRS form 5330 to report and pay an excise tax with respect to the 2024 late remittances of excess contributions due to the participants as required pursuant to Section 4975 of the Code. The amount paid was \$11,400.

As of December 31, 2023, the Plan had recorded excess contributions payable of \$202,062, which relates to the failed average deferral percentage for the 2023 Plan year. As of December 31, 2023, refunds payable to highly compensated employees included employee contributions of \$167,576, as increased for related investment gains of \$34,486. These amounts are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to 2023 contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the participants prior to March 15, 2024.
