Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Nortech Systems 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Nortech Systems 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan. Nortech Systems, Incorporated (the “Company”) is the administrator and sponsor of the Plan. The Plan was established on January 1, 1991 and uses Fidelity Management Trust Company as the Plan trustee (the “Custodian”). The Plan was most recently restated on January 1, 2022. The Company has established a plan administrative committee (the “Committee”) to oversee the Plan’s administration. The Committee is responsible for determining the investment options available to participants, determining appropriate education for participants and determining plan design changes. The Plan participants are responsible for the direction of their account balances into specific investment options. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended.

Eligibility:

Employees of the Company who are not covered by collective bargaining agreements under which they have specifically negotiated coverage by the Plan, who are not resident aliens, who have attained the age of eighteen years or older and have completed three months of service are eligible to participate for employee deferrals and employer match. For discretionary non-elective contributions, employees must complete 1,000 hours during the Plan year and be employed on the last day of that Plan year. Plan entry dates are the first day of month.

Contributions:

Each year, participants may contribute up to 60 percent of compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate. Effective January 1, 2024, automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation, an increase from 3%, with an automatic annual increase of 1% up to a maximum of 12%. Contributions for automatically enrolled participants are invested in a designated balanced fund unless changed by the participant. The Company may make discretionary employer matching and non-elective contributions. Effective January 1, 2024, the Company’s discretionary employer matching contribution was changed to 100% of employee deferrals for the first 2% and 25% for the next 4%, limited up to 3% of eligible compensation. Prior to January 1, 2024, the Company’s discretionary employer match was 37.5% of employee deferrals, limited up to 6% of eligible compensation. Total employer matching contributions were \$706,032 and \$457,656 for the Plan years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. No employer non-elective contributions were made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

NOTE 1. (CONTINUED)

Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with participant pre-tax deferrals, participant post-tax Roth contributions, Company matching contributions, and any other discretionary contributions made by the Company and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations of employer discretionary contributions are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Participant accounts are valued at the end of each business day. The benefit the participant is entitled to is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting:

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service, as defined by the Plan. A participant is fully vested after 5 years of service. Each participant also becomes 100% vested upon normal retirement age as defined in the Plan, at the time of the participant's death, if the participant becomes totally or permanently disabled, or termination of the Plan.

Notes receivable from participants:

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balances or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear fixed interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50% which are commensurate with prevailing market rates at the time of loan approval. Loans must be repaid within five years, except a loan used to build, purchase, or substantially remodel a principal home may be repaid over a ten-year period. Principal and interest can be paid through bi-weekly payrolls or in alternative procedures provided by the Plan's administrator. All loans must at minimum be paid on at least a quarterly basis.

Payment of benefits:

Distributions to terminated or retired participants are made in a single lump-sum payment to the participant (or in the case of death, the participant's beneficiary) or periodic installments over a period specified by the Plan. Effective January 1, 2024, if terminated/retired participants do not voluntarily elect to move their funds out of the Plan, vested account balances between \$1,000 and \$7,000 (previously \$5,000) are rolled into an Individual Retirement Account at the Custodian on the employee's behalf. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan administrator can authorize the benefit payment without the Participant's consent.

Active (not terminated/retired) participants experiencing financial hardship may withdraw a portion of their account balance as defined in the Plan and withdrawals are limited pursuant to the Plan's provisions.

Forfeitures:

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$61 and \$0, respectively. Forfeited balances of terminated participant's non-vested Company contributions are used first for administrative expenses and second to reduce any Company contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$8,269 and \$2,067 in forfeitures were used to pay plan expenses, and \$38,542 and \$37,699 in forfeitures were used to reduce Company matching contributions.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are maintained on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition:

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for the discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participants Plan accounts and are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit distribution is recorded based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to certain administrative activities are paid for by the Plan and are included in the administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent events:

In preparing the financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The Custodian of the Plan has certified as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment and notes receivable information reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to adjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobserved inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are adjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means;

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The Mutual Funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the Custodian, is a readily determinable fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan's Committee believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 5. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the Plan's Custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7. PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, received from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") on the Prototype Non-standardized Profit Sharing Plan with CODA indicating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and is therefore not subject to tax under the current income tax law. The prototype Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's Committee to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Plan's statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9. SECURE ACT 2.0

In December 2022, Securing a Strong Retirement Act ("SECURE 2.0") was passed into law. The effective date of the provisions of SECURE 2.0 vary from becoming effective immediately through 2028. Those provisions include both required and optional elements. The Plan's Committee has evaluated those provisions and administratively adopted an increase to the force out limit for terminated participants (see Note 1, Payment of benefits subnote). The Plan's Committee will determine other optional provisions to elect in the future.

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Nortech Systems 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Nortech Systems 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan. Nortech Systems, Incorporated (the “Company”) is the administrator and sponsor of the Plan. The Plan was established on January 1, 1991 and uses Fidelity Management Trust Company as the Plan trustee (the “Custodian”). The Plan was most recently restated on January 1, 2022. The Company has established a plan administrative committee (the “Committee”) to oversee the Plan’s administration. The Committee is responsible for determining the investment options available to participants, determining appropriate education for participants and determining plan design changes. The Plan participants are responsible for the direction of their account balances into specific investment options. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended.

Eligibility:

Employees of the Company who are not covered by collective bargaining agreements under which they have specifically negotiated coverage by the Plan, who are not resident aliens, who have attained the age of eighteen years or older and have completed three months of service are eligible to participate for employee deferrals and employer match. For discretionary non-elective contributions, employees must complete 1,000 hours during the Plan year and be employed on the last day of that Plan year. Plan entry dates are the first day of month.

Contributions:

Each year, participants may contribute up to 60 percent of compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate. Effective January 1, 2024, automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation, an increase from 3%, with an automatic annual increase of 1% up to a maximum of 12%. Contributions for automatically enrolled participants are invested in a designated balanced fund unless changed by the participant. The Company may make discretionary employer matching and non-elective contributions. Effective January 1, 2024, the Company’s discretionary employer matching contribution was changed to 100% of employee deferrals for the first 2% and 25% for the next 4%, limited up to 3% of eligible compensation. Prior to January 1, 2024, the Company’s discretionary employer match was 37.5% of employee deferrals, limited up to 6% of eligible compensation. Total employer matching contributions were \$706,032 and \$457,656 for the Plan years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. No employer non-elective contributions were made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

NOTE 1. (CONTINUED)

Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with participant pre-tax deferrals, participant post-tax Roth contributions, Company matching contributions, and any other discretionary contributions made by the Company and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations of employer discretionary contributions are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Participant accounts are valued at the end of each business day. The benefit the participant is entitled to is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting:

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service, as defined by the Plan. A participant is fully vested after 5 years of service. Each participant also becomes 100% vested upon normal retirement age as defined in the Plan, at the time of the participant's death, if the participant becomes totally or permanently disabled, or termination of the Plan.

Notes receivable from participants:

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balances or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear fixed interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50% which are commensurate with prevailing market rates at the time of loan approval. Loans must be repaid within five years, except a loan used to build, purchase, or substantially remodel a principal home may be repaid over a ten-year period. Principal and interest can be paid through bi-weekly payrolls or in alternative procedures provided by the Plan's administrator. All loans must at minimum be paid on at least a quarterly basis.

Payment of benefits:

Distributions to terminated or retired participants are made in a single lump-sum payment to the participant (or in the case of death, the participant's beneficiary) or periodic installments over a period specified by the Plan. Effective January 1, 2024, if terminated/retired participants do not voluntarily elect to move their funds out of the Plan, vested account balances between \$1,000 and \$7,000 (previously \$5,000) are rolled into an Individual Retirement Account at the Custodian on the employee's behalf. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan administrator can authorize the benefit payment without the Participant's consent.

Active (not terminated/retired) participants experiencing financial hardship may withdraw a portion of their account balance as defined in the Plan and withdrawals are limited pursuant to the Plan's provisions.

NOTE 1. (CONTINUED)

Forfeitures:

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$61 and \$0, respectively. Forfeited balances of terminated participant's non-vested Company contributions are used first for administrative expenses and second to reduce any Company contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$8,269 and \$2,067 in forfeitures were used to pay plan expenses, and \$38,542 and \$37,699 in forfeitures were used to reduce Company matching contributions.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are maintained on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition:

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for the discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participants Plan accounts and are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit distribution is recorded based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 2. (CONTINUED)

Administrative expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to certain administrative activities are paid for by the Plan and are included in the administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent events:

In preparing the financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The Custodian of the Plan has certified as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment and notes receivable information reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to adjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobserved inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are adjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means;

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE 4. (CONTINUED)

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The Mutual Funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the Custodian, is a readily determinable fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan's Committee believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 5. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the Plan's Custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7. PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, received from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") on the Prototype Non-standardized Profit Sharing Plan with CODA indicating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and is therefore not subject to tax under the current income tax law. The prototype Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's Committee to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Plan's statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9. SECURE ACT 2.0

In December 2022, Securing a Strong Retirement Act ("SECURE 2.0") was passed into law. The effective date of the provisions of SECURE 2.0 vary from becoming effective immediately through 2028. Those provisions include both required and optional elements. The Plan's Committee has evaluated those provisions and administratively adopted an increase to the force out limit for terminated participants (see Note 1, Payment of benefits subnote). The Plan's Committee will determine other optional provisions to elect in the future.
