Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the financial statements of RH2 Engineering Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (the financial statements).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL's) *Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure* under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank, or similar institution or insurance carrier, that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank, or similar institution or insurance carrier, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's *Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure* under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of, and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note (3) to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance, and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with U.S. GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with U.S. GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Notes to Financial Statements

(1) Description of the Plan

The following description of the RH2 Engineering, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, established July 1, 1980. The Plan has been amended and restated throughout the years to comply with tax legislation and was most recently amended April 1, 2024. The Plan covers substantially all employees of RH2 Engineering, Inc. and Control Systems NW, LLC (CSNW) (collectively, the Company or Plan Sponsor). The Plan excludes employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees, reclassified employees, and seasonal employees as defined in the Plan provisions.

The Plan is administered by the Plan Administrator who receives assistance from a retirement plan administration organization, which processes and maintains records of participant account activity.

All contributions made to the Plan are held in a trust fund. The Plan Administrator is responsible for the safekeeping of the trust fund. The trust fund established by the Plan Administrator is the funding medium used for the accumulation of assets from which benefits are distributed.

Eligibility

To be eligible to participate in the salary deferral portion of the Plan, an employee must be age twenty-one or over. Employees enter the Plan immediately upon hire, if they are an eligible employee.

An employee is eligible for employer discretionary match if they are not an excluded employee, age twenty-one or over, and have completed at least 500 hours of service in the first 6 months from hire date. If the employee does not complete 500 hours of service within the first 6 months from hire date, they must have 500 hours of service in the first 12 months from hire date.

An employee is eligible for employer discretionary non-elective profit-sharing contributions if they are not an excluded employee, age twenty-one or over, have worked at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year, and are an active employee on the last day of the Plan year.

Employees are eligible for the employer contribution part of the Plan on the first day of the month following the date on which the eligibility requirements are satisfied.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to the maximum annual federal dollar limit to pre-tax or Roth salary deferrals, as provided by the Plan. Participants who have attained age fifty before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Plan has an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation, and their contributions invested in the designated default fund until changed by the participant.

The Company may elect to make a discretionary match contribution of participant contributions. The percentage of participant contributions matched is determined annually by the Company. The Company elected to make a discretionary match contribution of 100% of the first 5% of the participants eligible compensation for the year ended December 31, 2024, and 67% of the first 5% of the participant's eligible compensation for the year ended December 31, 2023. The Company contributed \$1,007,022 and \$560,164 in discretionary match contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Company may also elect to make a discretionary non-elective profit sharing contribution, of which \$500,000 and \$400,000 were made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, employer contributions, and allocation of Plan earnings, as well as charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings and account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined in the Plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferrals, rollover contributions, plus actual earnings on those contributions. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's match and non-elective profit-sharing contribution portions of their accounts is based on years of service and occurs at a rate of 20% annually, beginning with the first year of credited service. A participant is 100% vested in the Plan Sponsor's match and non-elective profit-sharing contributions after five years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and accrue interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Participants are eligible to receive 100% of their vested account balance upon attaining normal retirement age of sixty years, death, disability, or break in service. Benefits are either rolled over to a qualified account or paid out upon request by lump sum or installments. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age fifty-nine and a half, hardship distributions, and distributions resulting from rollover contributions, subject to Plan provisions. If a participant terminated employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$5,000, the Plan Administrator will distribute the funds in a single lump-sum.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and Plan Sponsor contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures, which are non-vested portions of participants' accounts at the point of termination from the Plan, will be placed in a suspense account and will be restored to the participant if rehired before five consecutive one-year breaks in vesting service have occurred. If the participant takes a distribution of their entire vested portion, the non-vested portion will be forfeited at that time. The non-vested amounts are used to reduce employer contributions to the Plan or pay administrative expenses. Any remaining forfeitures are allocated in the same proportion that each participant's compensation for the year bears to the compensation of all participants for such year. There were \$12,911 and \$27,788 of new forfeitures and \$41,931 and \$2,607 of forfeitures used for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The majority of the forfeitures were used in funding the December 31, 2023 employer match contributions receivable. Forfeitures unused as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, were \$4,320 and \$32,913, respectively.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan pays all asset management and distribution fees. All other administrative expenses are paid by the Plan Sponsor. The Plan expenses are allocated based on participant account balances and those participants who elect to withdraw amounts from the Plan.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Concentrations of Credit Risk

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit risk consist of investments in the guaranteed interest fund and mutual funds. Concentrations of credit risk are limited as the Plan maintains an investment portfolio that is diversified between various publicly traded investments. The Plan Administrator believes there is no significant risk with respect to these accounts.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The fair value of the investments is based on quoted market prices, if available. Otherwise, the fair values are determined by the issuers based on other investments with similar terms.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participant loans are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest, and classified as notes receivable from participants.

Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as investment fees and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan Administrator treats a participant loan as a distribution if the participant fails to make up the missed scheduled loan payment by the end of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the default occurred.

Fair Value

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Assets and liabilities are classified based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs based upon quoted prices in active markets for identical assets.
- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 Inputs that are unobserved for the asset.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used during 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds - valued at the daily closing prices reported on the exchange or listed market. The funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds are deemed to be actively traded and are considered Level 1 investments.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits paid to participants are recorded when paid. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no distributions that had been requested but not yet paid.

(3) Investments

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's *Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure* under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's auditors to not perform any auditing procedures with respect to investments and notes receivable from participants, that are certified by Principal Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirement of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

(4) Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for a fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a Guaranteed Interest Fund (GIF) and is a general account product. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The interest crediting rate is reset quarterly.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. For Plan initiated transactions, the GIF will not be paid out at contract value until one year after the Plan initiated the transaction, or the Plan may receive the balance of the investment immediately but will be charged a payout fee as specified in the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer.

(5) Party-in-Interest Transactions

Principal Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan. Trutina Financial (merged into CAPTRUST November 2023) offers investment advisory services to the Plan. Principal Financial is the record keeper. Orenda Retirement (Side-by-Side Financial, Inc.) was the third-party administrator (TPA), until May 2024. Hunnex and Shoemaker took over as TPA in June 2024. Therefore, transactions with these service providers qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Total fees paid by the Plan for administration and investment advisory services amounted to \$144,147 and \$79,074 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan Sponsor also paid certain administrative expenses of the Plan. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

(6) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions and all assets would be held, administered, and distributed pursuant to the Plan's terms and conditions.

(7) Tax Status

The Plan document is based on the adoption of a prototype plan, which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC by a letter dated June 30, 2020. The Plan itself has not requested a determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

The Plan's income tax returns are subject to review and examination by federal and state authorities. The Plan is not aware of any activities that would jeopardize its tax-exempt status, nor is it aware of any activities that are subject to tax on unrelated business income or excise or other taxes. The Plan amendments have had no impact on the Plan's tax status.

(8) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(9) Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
