Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of FrontLine Service Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.



NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the FrontLine Service Retirement Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, which began September 1, 1996, was last restated April 12, 2017. The Plan is a defined contribution plan and covers all employees of Mental Health Services, Inc., dba FrontLine Service ("Plan Sponsor") (the "Company"). All employees who normally work over 20 hours per week are eligible for the employee deferral portion of the Plan. An employee is eligible for the employer contribution upon completing four months of employment. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA").

Contributions

Subject to Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") limitations, the Plan allows covered employees to contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation to the Plan through payroll deductions. Participant contributions may be made as pre-tax or Roth 401(k) contributions. During any calendar year in which a participant attains age 50 or older, he or she may elect to make additional pre-tax contributions and/or Roth 401(k) contributions, called "catch-up" contributions.

In addition, the Plan Sponsor can elect to make matching contributions to the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor matching contributions were equal to 200% of the participants' elective deferral, up to a maximum contribution by the Plan Sponsor of 2.5% of the individual participant's eligible wages.

Rollover contributions from other Plans are also accepted, providing certain specified conditions are met.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's elective contributions, employer matching contributions, and earnings and losses thereon.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of service. A participant is vested in employer matching contributions as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested %</u>
0-1	0%
2	20%
3	40%
4	60%
5 or more	100%

Participants automatically become fully vested when they reach the early retirement age of 55 as established by the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service by reason of separation of service, retirement, death, or total and permanent disability, a participant receives a lump sum equal to the value of his or her account. Participants also have the option to receive distributions in the form of an annuity or installment payments. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship and in-service distributions if certain criteria are met.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan allows for loans to participants from their individual account balances that are limited to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates established by the Plan Administrator. The participant loans have repayment terms not to exceed five years with exceptions for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Allocation of Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses for the Plan or to reduce employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$2,306 and \$31,359 respectively. Employer contributions were reduced by forfeitures of \$65,884 and \$41,599 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Administrative Fees

The Plan pays all administrative fees and investment related expenses, unless paid by the Company.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their accounts and will receive full distribution of the balances in their respective accounts.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accounting records of the Plan are maintained on the accrual basis.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and the accompanying notes. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment in the fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract is reported at contract value.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans and are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan's investments include investments in mutual funds and a guaranteed investment contract with varying degrees of risk such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

The Plan Sponsor has obtained certifications from the Trustee as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, that such information is complete and accurate.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is a market-based measurement that is determined based on assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability. As a basis for considering such assumptions, the Plan uses a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value as follows:

- Level 1 - Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets;
- Level 2 - Inputs, other than the quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3 - Unobservable inputs in which there is little or no market data, which require the reporting entity to develop its own assumptions.

The classification of fair value measurements within the hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the measurement. The fair value amounts presented in the below tables are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to total investments at fair value. Valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities measured at fair value are as follows:

Mutual funds: Valued at fair value as determined by quoted market prices on active markets.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of the net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan has a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Standard Insurance Company ("The Standard"). The Standard maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than one percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by The Standard, represents contributions made under the contract, transfers to and from other investment accounts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a volume submitter plan document sponsored by Standard Retirement Services, Inc. which has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dated March 31, 2017, stating that the volume submitter plan document was designed in accordance with applicable provisions of the IRC. The volume submitter plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and being operated in accordance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan Sponsor has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Reliance Trust Company, the Trustee, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Usual and customary fees were paid by the Plan for the investment-related expenses.
