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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of fiduciary net position as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in fiduciary net position for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

## **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

**NOTE 1 PLAN DESCRIPTION**

The following description of Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for the benefit of the employees of Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan (the Sponsor) who have completed six months of service, as defined by the Plan. The Tribal Council has the responsibility for making certain discretionary determinations under the Plan. The Tribal Council has delegated certain other responsibilities to the Investment Committee, including determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance. The Investment Committee can make recommendations to the Tribal Council related to those responsibilities, but all final decisions are made by the Tribal Council. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

**Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. The Plan also allows for participants to make after-tax (Roth) contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover). For all participants meeting the eligibility requirement listed in the preceding paragraph, the Sponsor contributes 100% of the first 4% of compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Sponsor may also make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan. There was no discretionary profit sharing contribution for 2024 or 2023. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Participants direct the investments of all contributions into the Plan into various options offered by the Plan.

The Plan includes an automatic enrollment feature whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled into the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants will have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The default withholding rate under the automatic enrollment provision will increase 1% annually up to a maximum of 10%.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, rollover contributions, the Sponsor's matching contributions, discretionary profit sharing contributions, if any, and an allocation of Plan investment results. Participants are charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses that are paid from the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

The value of each participant's account is determined daily.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in all contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

**Payment of Benefits**

Upon termination of service due to death, permanent disability, retirement, or for any other reason, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution in cash, or a direct rollover to an individual retirement account (IRA) equal to the value of the participant's interest in his or her account. Upon termination, participants may elect to hold their investments in the Plan, unless the investment is less than \$7,000, in which case the investment is automatically distributed. A participant may elect to receive an in-service distribution upon attainment of age 59½ or meeting certain financial need qualifications. Generally, certain minimum distributions are required for participants who have separated from service and have reached required minimum distribution age.

**NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Basis of Presentation**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting standards promulgated by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB). These financial statements present only Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and are not intended to present the financial statements of the Sponsor.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, trustee, and other third parties. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation/depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

**Contributions**

Contributions from Plan participants and contributions from the Sponsor are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Investment Policy and Risks**

**Investment Policy:** The Plan offers a broad range of diversified investments, as more fully described in the Plan's literature, that enable the participant to construct a portfolio with aggregate risk and return characteristics at any point within the participant's desired range. Adherence to the specific investment objectives and criteria contained herein will be evaluated over a full-market cycle, which historically has been three to five years.

**Interest Rate Risk:** This is the risk that changes in market interest rates will adversely affect the fair value of an investment. Investments with longer maturities have greater sensitivity to fair value changes based on market interest rates. Mutual funds classified as bond funds and the collective trust fund is exposed to this risk.

**Credit Risk:** Credit risk exists when there is a possibility that the issuer or other counterparty to an investment may be unable to fulfill its payments on a security under the original term. Mutual funds classified as bond funds and the collective trust fund is exposed to this risk.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to administration of specific participant transactions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are offset against net appreciation in fair value of investments. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Sponsor. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan.

**NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Plan's investments are recorded at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. GASB statement No. 72 *Fair Value Measurements and Application*, defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. This statement establishes hierarchy of valuation inputs based on the extent to the inputs are observable in the marketplace. Inputs are used in applying the various valuation techniques and take into account the assumptions that market participants use to make valuation decisions. Inputs may include price information, credit data, interest and yield curve data, and other factors specific to the financial instrument. Observable inputs reflect market data obtained from independent sources. In contrast, unobservable inputs reflect the entity's assumption about how market participants would value the financial instrument. Valuation techniques should maximize the use of observable inputs to the extent available.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following describes the hierarchy of inputs used to measure fair value and the primary valuation methodologies used for financial instruments measured at fair value on a recurring basis:

- Level 1 Investments have values based on quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets in active markets that a government can access at the measurement date.
- Level 2 Investment have inputs—other than quoted prices included within Level 1—that are observable for an asset. Either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 Investments have unobservable inputs for an asset and may require a degree of professional judgement.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Mutual Funds:** Shares of registered investment company funds (mutual funds) are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

**Collective Trust Fund:** The collective trust fund is valued at the NAV of the units in the collective trust held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 5 RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND EXEMPT TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTY-IN-INTEREST**

Transactions with Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the trustee, qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The majority of fees and administrative expenses are paid by the Plan. Administrative expenses and fees are paid to the trustee. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included as an offset to net appreciation in value of investments.

**NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION OF PLAN**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

**NOTE 7 TAX STATUS**

The Plan adopted a preapproved profit sharing plan, sponsored by Schwab Retirement Plan Services, Inc. The preapproved plan provider has received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated September 21, 2020, as to the preapproved plan's qualified status. The Plan has been amended from the version that received the opinion letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and therefore, the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken a significant uncertain tax position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the 2024 and 2023 statements of fiduciary net position.

**NOTE 9 SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

No significant events occurred subsequent to the Plan's year end. Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 26, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.
