### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the JSH Properties, Inc. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (2023 Financial Statements).



**NOTE 1 – ORGANIZATION AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The provisions of the JSH Properties, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) were effective January 1, 1995. The Plan has been amended and restated to comply with current legislation. The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a qualified defined contribution plan covering all employees of JSH Properties, Inc., Superior HVAC and Electrical, LLC and Yarrow Bay Marine Services, LLC (collectively, the Company), excluding nonresident aliens, part-time employees, and residents of Puerto Rico. Employees are eligible to participate after three months of service and may enter the Plan on the first day of the calendar quarter following eligibility. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA). The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

**Contributions**

Participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of their pre-tax or Roth after-tax compensation to the Plan, as defined in the Plan document and within statutory limits. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Contributions are paid to the Plan after each pay period.

The Company makes safe harbor nonelective employer contributions of 3% of eligible compensation. Nonelective contributions are paid to the Plan after each pay period.

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to remove discretionary employer contributions for all employees.

**Participant Accounts**

Individual participant accounts are maintained by the Plan's third-party administrator. Each account is credited or charged with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, allocations of investment income and losses on the individual account balances, and administrative expenses. Distribution and loan administration fees are deducted from the respective participant's accounts. Allocations are based on participant compensation, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Investment Options**

Participants direct employee and employer contributions among various mutual funds and one guaranteed investment contract.

## **NOTE 1 – ORGANIZATION AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)**

### **Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their own contributions and employer safe harbor nonelective contributions plus their actual earnings thereon. Vesting in discretionary employer matching and profit-sharing contributions, if any, is based on years of credited service, as defined in the Plan document, with 20% vesting after the first two years of service, and full vesting after six years of service. Upon normal retirement (65), death, or disability, participants become fully vested.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Terms of the notes receivable may not exceed five years, except for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes receivable are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 1% over the prime interest rate at the time of issuance. Interest rates range from 3.25% to 9.5% for notes receivable from participants outstanding at December 31, 2024. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits may be distributed upon retirement, death, disability, or other termination of employment. Benefits equal to the value of the participant's vested account may be paid in lump-sum or installments, as described in the Plan document. Under certain hardship circumstances, participants may request a distribution of their pre-tax or Roth elective account balance prior to retirement. Upon attainment of age 59 ½, participants may request a distribution of their vested account balance prior to retirement.

### **Forfeited Accounts**

Upon termination, participants' non-vested account balances are forfeited. Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses. Forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$46 and \$1,000 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, forfeitures of \$46 were used to pay Plan expenses.

### **Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no material subsequent events.

## **NOTE 2 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The following are significant accounting policies used by the Plan:

### **Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

## **NOTE 2 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)**

### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value (Note 4). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus accrued but unpaid interest, if any. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### **Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees for individual transactions such as distributions and loans are deducted from the respective participant's account. Investment related expenses, and revenue sharing fees or credits, are included in net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments.

## **NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

GAAP establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

### **NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)**

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Mutual funds** – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The Plan's investments reported at fair value consist solely of mutual funds which are valued as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 using level 1 measurement.

### **NOTE 4 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS**

Certain information related to investments that is disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule on page 13, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Mid Atlantic Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan.

### **NOTE 5 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain plan investments are units of participation in a group annuity managed by Standard Insurance or are mutual funds managed by Mid Atlantic Trust Company and its affiliates. Therefore, transactions with Standard Insurance, Mid Atlantic Trust Company, and their affiliates qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees are paid by the Plan to these parties for administrative services. Additionally, these parties collect revenue sharing from the Plan's investments to pay for administrative services.

### **NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their accounts.

### **NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS**

The Plan operates under provisions of a Pre-Approved Plan, which received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated August 31, 2020, which stated that the Pre-Approved Plan, as then designed, was acceptable under the applicable sections of the internal Revenue Code (IRC) for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

**NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS (continued)**

GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to evaluate the tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan allows participants to invest in investment securities that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

**NOTE 9 – PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS**

During 2016 through 2020, the Company failed to remit to the Plan's custodians' certain participant contributions totaling approximately \$201,000 within the period prescribed by the Department of Labor (DOL) regulations. For 2016 through 2020, the Company has remitted the participant contributions; however, the related lost earnings have not yet been remitted.



**NOTE 1 – ORGANIZATION AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The provisions of the JSH Properties, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) were effective January 1, 1995. The Plan has been amended and restated to comply with current legislation. The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a qualified defined contribution plan covering all employees of JSH Properties, Inc., Superior HVAC and Electrical, LLC and Yarrow Bay Marine Services, LLC (collectively, the Company), excluding nonresident aliens, part-time employees, and residents of Puerto Rico. Employees are eligible to participate after three months of service and may enter the Plan on the first day of the calendar quarter following eligibility. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA). The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

**Contributions**

Participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of their pre-tax or Roth after-tax compensation to the Plan, as defined in the Plan document and within statutory limits. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Contributions are paid to the Plan after each pay period.

The Company makes safe harbor nonelective employer contributions of 3% of eligible compensation. Nonelective contributions are paid to the Plan after each pay period.

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to remove discretionary employer contributions for all employees.

**Participant Accounts**

Individual participant accounts are maintained by the Plan's third-party administrator. Each account is credited or charged with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, allocations of investment income and losses on the individual account balances, and administrative expenses. Distribution and loan administration fees are deducted from the respective participant's accounts. Allocations are based on participant compensation, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Investment Options**

Participants direct employee and employer contributions among various mutual funds and one guaranteed investment contract.

## **NOTE 1 – ORGANIZATION AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)**

### **Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their own contributions and employer safe harbor nonelective contributions plus their actual earnings thereon. Vesting in discretionary employer matching and profit-sharing contributions, if any, is based on years of credited service, as defined in the Plan document, with 20% vesting after the first two years of service, and full vesting after six years of service. Upon normal retirement (65), death, or disability, participants become fully vested.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Terms of the notes receivable may not exceed five years, except for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes receivable are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 1% over the prime interest rate at the time of issuance. Interest rates range from 3.25% to 9.5% for notes receivable from participants outstanding at December 31, 2024. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits may be distributed upon retirement, death, disability, or other termination of employment. Benefits equal to the value of the participant's vested account may be paid in lump-sum or installments, as described in the Plan document. Under certain hardship circumstances, participants may request a distribution of their pre-tax or Roth elective account balance prior to retirement. Upon attainment of age 59 ½, participants may request a distribution of their vested account balance prior to retirement.

### **Forfeited Accounts**

Upon termination, participants' non-vested account balances are forfeited. Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses. Forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$46 and \$1,000 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, forfeitures of \$46 were used to pay Plan expenses.

### **Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no material subsequent events.

## **NOTE 2 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The following are significant accounting policies used by the Plan:

### **Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

## **NOTE 2 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)**

### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value (Note 4). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus accrued but unpaid interest, if any. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### **Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees for individual transactions such as distributions and loans are deducted from the respective participant's account. Investment related expenses, and revenue sharing fees or credits, are included in net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments.

## **NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

GAAP establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The Plan operates under provisions of a Pre-Approved Plan, which received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated August 31, 2020, which stated that the Pre-Approved Plan, as then designed, was acceptable under the applicable sections of the internal Revenue Code (IRC) for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

**NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS (continued)**

GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to evaluate the tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan allows participants to invest in investment securities that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

**NOTE 9 – PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS**

During 2016 through 2020, the Company failed to remit to the Plan's custodians' certain participant contributions totaling approximately \$201,000 within the period prescribed by the Department of Labor (DOL) regulations. For 2016 through 2020, the Company has remitted the participant contributions; however, the related lost earnings have not yet been remitted.
